
# Our Saviour's Lutheran Church Sunday Worship December 14, 2025 Third Sunday of Advent



# **WELCOME**

I appointed you a prophet to the nations."



The virgin's name was Mary. <sup>28</sup> And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! 
