# Council Corner - Jennifer Strand

October 2025

The Council meeting started with a devotion emphasizing that God is with us through good and bad times. Financially we continue to do well. In fact, the offerings during the summer did not drop off. Thank you for your continued generosity.

We discussed several property matters. We replaced two HVAC units for the Annex Building and received a report for all HVAC units (age, cost, condition) so we can plan. The freezer in the Activity Building has been fixed! Later in the year we will have the continuation of the watershed work, with a Congregation Work Day on Saturday, December 6. Look for more information in the future.

To complete the Council, Joanna Keyl was unanimously elected to be a Member At Large. We look forward to working with her. Joanna is filling Melanie Bowman's Council position until the Annual Meeting in February 2026 when elections will be held.

In 2024, the Council voted to pause reinvesting quarterly payments from a non-endowment bequest account and instead invest in our community and congregation.

The amount is about \$8,000 a year. So far this year, the Council has designated the following use of these funds: \$1,000 to Blenman Elementary for classroom supplies; \$1,000 for the Lot on 22nd Thanksgiving Meal (and weekly meals); \$500 for the Affirming Lutherans of Tucson booth at Tucson Pride; and \$1,000 towards costs for the 80th Anniversary Celebration.

Work continues on the 80th Anniversary celebration on October 25, 2025. There is still a need for people to participate in the history walk in any capacity. The skits are not Shakespeare, but light fun. Memorization is not required. Please RSVP (online or in the office.) This is just to give an idea of the number of people coming. Come and enjoy learning more about our church history and celebrating with our church family.

## **Youth On Their Own**

At Youth On Their Own, there is a place, known as the MiniMall, where your in-kind donations are shelved in a store format. Students have access to the MiniMall once a week, either online or by visiting in person. As of 9/10/2025, the wish list from the YOTO website contains the list shown below. At the moment, the item in particular need is underwear for teenage boys and girls. School supplies are also in demand, as the school year is now underway. Thank you so much for your generosity. The YOTO personnel are always so happy to see me with the donations from Our Saviour's Lutheran Church. **Food:** Individually packaged snacks (chips, granola bars, trail mix, fruit snacks, jerky, etc.), Mac & cheese cups, Raman cups & pouches, Dry pasta, Pasta sauce (no glass please), Canned fruit, Shelf-stable milk (dairy & non-dairy) **Hygiene:** Toilet paper, Body wash, Shampoo (full-sized), Conditioner (full-sized), Face wash, Shaving cream, Chapstick, Toothbrushes **Linens/Household:** Full size bath towels (new only), Pillows (new only), Paper towels, Multipurpose cleaner, Toilet cleaner.

## The Lot on 22<sup>nd</sup> Street

On a vacant lot near 22<sup>nd</sup> St & Columbus Blvd in Tucson, is a storage unit. It looks humble, and if you didn't know it was there, you probably wouldn't notice it. But every Sunday and Thursday evening for a couple of hours, a small miracle occurs there. This is the site where The Lot on 22<sup>nd</sup> Street does its thing. A core group f volunteers and some people from a local organization (business, school, church, etc.) get together to serve dinner to a group of homeless people. Tables and chairs from the storage unit are set up for dining, some tables are set up for a serving line, the local organization who has signed up to help that day shows up with food and volunteers to help serve. The number of people served could be anywhere from about 50 to several hundred on a given evening.

In the past, we (Mary and Asher) have been involved in coordinating a Thanksgiving Dinner, served on Thanksgiving Day at The Lot. Last year, we used the kitchen at Our Saviour's to prepare the food we had collected over a period of several months. Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church was also involved and provided donations they had collected. Later in the afternoon, some volunteers from The Lot took the food we had prepared to be served. Something like 350 people were served that day, and there were some leftovers. The leftovers were either taken to homeless individuals at nearby parks or used for the meal the following Sunday at The Lot.

This year, we will be collecting donations from anyone in the Our Saviour's congregation (and beyond) who would like to help. This is a wonderful ministry, so please consider making a donation and/or helping in the kitchen on Thanksgiving Day. More details will follow. Stay tuned for more information.
