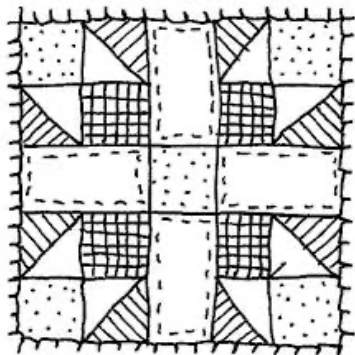

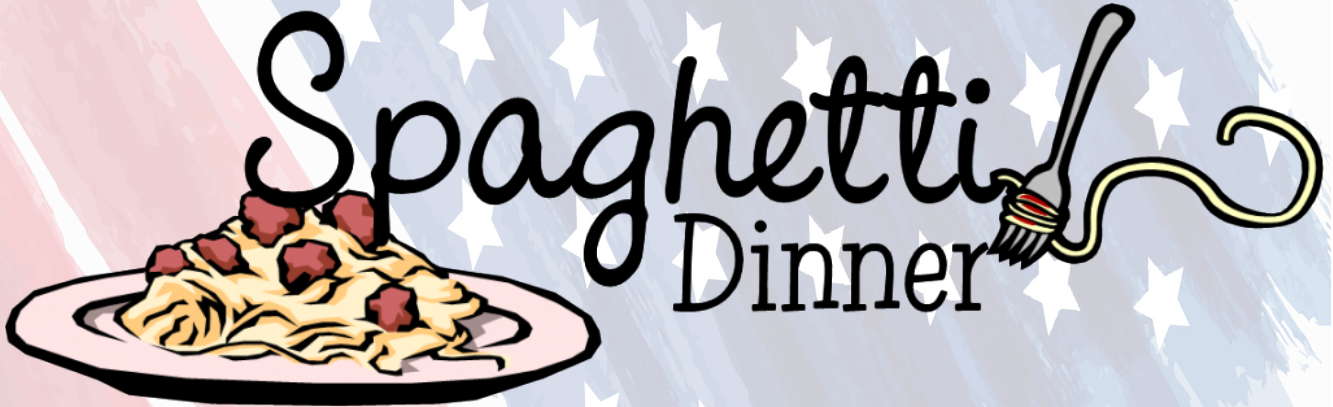

QUILT SHOW RULES:

1. Quilts are to be made by the *Amateur or Home Quilter* who has entered it.
2. Quilts can only be entered one year at the Fair's Quilt Show, and must be Clean, Finished, and in like-new Condition.
3. Exhibitor may enter up to THREE (3) quilts per Section.
4. Quilts are to be entered BY WIDTH. Non-directional items shall be entered by their shortest side as the width. Quilts will be measured on entry day.
5. No names are to be displayed on the quilt. If you have a signature tag/label on the quilt, it must be covered up when entered. Fair personnel can provide cover material if needed.
6. Official Northern District Fair Entry Form must be completed, with phone number and email address, if any. We have to have a way to contact you, should we have any questions. Use additional entry forms as needed. **ENTRY DEADLINE IS AUGUST 1. Online entry is available at: NorthernDistrictFair.FairEntry.com**
7. Judging will be done on Monday, August 12, 2024. The Civic will remain closed to the public, to accommodate judging, until Tuesday. People's Choice Awards will be tallied on Thursday evening, August 15. Ribbons will be placed Friday morning.
8. Quilts are to be brought to the Wexford Civic Center on Saturday, August 10, or Sunday August 11, from 3 pm until 7pm.
9. Quilts shall remain in the Wexford Civic Center for the duration of the Fair, and must be picked up on Sunday, August 18, 9:00 am to 1:00pm. Awards will be handed out when quilts are picked up. If you cannot pick up your quilt on Sunday, you must make arrangements with the Quilt Show Superintendent by Saturday. **QUILTS WILL NOT BE SHIPPED.**
10. Each Exhibitor is given ONE Exhibitor Pass on entry day. Do not lose your pass, or you will have to pay to enter the Fair each day. Replacement passes are not available.
11. **NOTE: Awards may not necessarily be in cash, based on sponsor support, but will have at least the value stated above.**

*First three pies in each section will be awarded a Blue, Red, or Yellow Pie Plate Award.

*The First Place winners from the two divisions will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Pie.

*Pies will be auctioned off at the Livestock Sale Wednesday evening, with the proceeds going towards Grandstand restoration!

*SCORING: 40 points on overall appearance, 30 points on filling/taste, and 30 points on crust.

RULES:

1. Open to the general public - AMATEUR HOME BAKERS ONLY!
2. Pie must be made entirely from scratch. No store-bought crust or fillings.
3. Each contestant must bake two (2) of the same pies as your entry, one for the contest judging and one to be auctioned off for charity at the Livestock Auction Wednesday evening.
4. You can enter only one pie in each division, but may enter both divisions.
5. NOTE: We are now allowing CREAM PIES in the Miscellaneous Division, as we have refrigeration available!!
6. All entries become the property of the Northern District Fair.
7. Entries do not include gate admission to the Fair.
8. All pies should be in a disposable pie plate, or a plate that you do not need to be returned!
9. ***All pies must include the complete recipe that includes all ingredients, including the crust***

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. ENTRY DEADLINE IS THE LAST SUNDAY OF JULY.
2. Only Official Northern District Fair Entry Forms will be accepted.
3. Entries may be mailed to: Northern District Fair - PO Box 131 - Cadillac - Michigan 49601; or they may be dropped off at the Fair Office on the last Saturday and Sunday of July, from 2:00 to 5:00pm. Online entries can be made at: NorthernDistrictFairFairEntry.com.
4. All entries must be paid in full at the time of entry or they will not be accepted.
5. All Exhibitors will be given ONE Exhibitor's Pass, which will allow free access to the fairgrounds each day. The pass will not allow entry to the Grandstand events or the Carnival. Lost or stolen passes will NOT be replaced.
6. No more than three entries will be accepted from any one Exhibitor in any one class, unless noted in the fairbook. All animal exhibits are limited to one entry per section/class.
7. Competition is open to all residents of the State of Michigan. No out-of-state entries permitted, unless approved by the Fairboard prior to entry deadline.
8. During the Fair, the Superintendents of each department will have the ultimate authority to disqualify or remove any exhibit that they deem unworthy, or for any rule violation. Superintendent's decisions are final.
9. Exhibitors who wish to protest or appeal a placement must do so in writing within 10 days from the close of Fair.
10. Exhibitors must have their Civic Center exhibits in place no later than 7:00 pm Sunday. The Civic Center will be open Saturday afternoon, and Sunday afternoon for entries. Times to be posted in the Events section of the Fairbook.
11. All exhibits, both Civic Center and Animal, shall remain in place at the Fairgrounds until the last Sunday of Fair, unless approved by the Superintendent. Early removal of any exhibit shall mean all monies earned will be forfeited by the Exhibitor. EXCEPTION: Market Animals may be released early for processing.
12. Civic Center exhibits may be shown only ONE year. Collections must be improved/added to in order to show again.
13. All animal exhibitors MUST be present to show their own animals.
14. The Northern District Fair Association will not be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to any animals exhibited, or for damage or destruction to any article of any kind that is entered in the Fair. Each exhibitor will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person by any animal owned or exhibited by that person, and they shall indemnify the Northern District Fair Association against all claims or injury occasioned by any animal owned or exhibited by him, or arising from any negligence of the person in charge of that exhibit.
15. ALL open and youth exhibitors, parents and/or chaperones of youth exhibitors are expected to be properly attired while on the Fairgrounds. Shirts, pants or shorts, and shoes shall be worn at all times. Absolutely no bare feet, swimwear, or other inappropriate clothing will be tolerated. Violators may be asked to leave the grounds.
16. The Civic Center will be closed all day Monday while judging takes place.
17. All animal exhibitors must adhere to the Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) health regulations. Visit www.Michigan.gov/MDARD for more information.
18. Premium Checks must be cashed within 30 days of the end of Fair.
19. NO PERSON UNDER EIGHTEEN (18) YEARS OF AGE WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE GROUNDS AFTER ALL DEPARTMENTS AND THE MIDWAY ARE CLOSED FOR THE NIGHT, EXCEPT THOSE IN THE COMPANY OF THEIR PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN.
20. The sale, use, or possession of alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, or drugs is forbidden by Law on Wexford County property.
21. Absolutely no weapons, either real or toy, will be brought onto or sold on the grounds of the Northern District Fair. Violators will be immediately removed and will be subject to action by the local law enforcement. A weapon shall include, but is not limited to: guns, knives, blow guns, slingshots, pellet guns, paintball guns.
22. See each individual Division for rules specific to that area.

Exhibitor Code of Conduct:

The Northern District Fair expects orderly and courteous conduct by exhibitors and attendants. All exhibitors and their parties are to maintain decorum and respect for all other exhibitors, judges, fair representatives, families and volunteers. Harrassment, profanity, unsportsmanlike conduct, disrespect, or inappropriate behavior of any party, either directly, through digital communication, or on social media is inexcusable.

Inappropriate behavior may result in early release of exhibits, and ejection from the grounds of all involved individuals.

Rulings of the Northern District Fair board are final.

All animal exhibitors are required to sign a Code of Conduct Form on entry day of the Fair to be eligible to show.



Northern District Fair Glossary of Terms

OPEN - Open to all ages, youth and adult.

MARKET - Animal raised and sold at auction

RATE OF GAIN - Weight gain over a specific time

HOME GROWN - Raised from birth on your premises

NOVICE - First year exhibitor

TYKES & TODDLERS - children under 4-H age that show but cannot sell

SHINING STAR - Exhibitor that faces daily challenges and has a love of horses

SHOWMANSHIP - How well you and your animal work together

CAVY - Guinea Pig

CAVY BOAR - Male Guinea Pig

CAVY SOW - Female Guinea Pig

PULLET - Young hen under one year

COCKEREL - Young rooster under one year

WEANLING - Newly taken from its mother

YEARLING - One year old

HEN - Female chicken

ROOSTER - Male chicken

CORNISH - Chicken under 5 pounds

BROILER - Chicken over 5 pounds

DAM - Mother of an animal

SIRE - Father of an animal

BUCK - Male rabbit or intact male goat

DOE - Female rabbit or goat

EWE - Female lamb

WETHER - Altered male goat or sheep

GILT - Female pig /swine that has not given birth

BARROW - Neutered male pig/swine

CALF - Baby cow

COW - Female that has given birth to a calf

HEIFER - Female cow that has not given birth to a calf

DAIRY COW - Female cow that gives milk

DAIRY BEEF FEEDER STEER - Less than one year old

MARE - Female horse

GELDING - Altered male horse

FOAL - Horse under one year

HALTER - Horse is judged on conformation

BAREBACK EQUITATION - Judged on rider without a saddle

EQUITATION - Judged on the rider more so than the horse

PLEASURE - Judged on the horse more so than the rider

2. All exhibitors are required to feed, water and clean under their cages at least twice per day. Failure to take care of your animals and exhibit area in a satisfactory manner may result in loss of premiums due, if any. On show days, cages must be cleaned prior to the start of showing. On Auction day, cages must be cleaned before 5:00pm.
3. ALL poultry entered MUST be Pullorum tested ON ENTRY DAY prior to entry into the barn. Testing is provided by the Northern District Fair, and is available from 8:00 am until 1:00pm on entry day. No bird will be allowed in the barn before they are tested! Only those birds entered will be tested at no charge. Exhibitors wishing to have extra birds tested will be required to pay \$2 per bird. Pigeons, waterfowl, and doves are exempt from testing.
4. Birds showing symptoms of disease or illness will not be permitted to remain on the grounds. This includes, but is not limited to: fowl mites, severe leg mites, respiratory/nasal discharge, swollen eyes
5. Exhibitors may advertise their birds for sale only AFTER the judging has been completed.
6. Judging will be in accordance with the current edition of the Standard of Perfection. The judge's decisions are final.
7. Exhibitors may only enter one bird per class.
8. Birds shown in Open may not also be shown in Youth.
9. All waterfowl MUST be legbanded by the Exhibitor prior to entry. This is for identification purposes only.
10. Exhibitors provide their own feed and water dishes, as well as their own feed. Sawdust for under cages is provided by the Northern District Fair. Please make sure that the water dishes are attached firmly to the cages so they are not dumped.
11. For the safety of your animals, the Small Animal Barn will be locked overnight. Barn hours will be posted on entry day.
12. Per MDARD Regulations, absolutely no transport cages, boxes or cartons shall be left inside barns during Fair.
13. ALL POULTRY MUST BE CLEAN ON ENTRY DAY. Birds that are excessively dirty will be sent home. Birds must also be clean on show day, or they will not be judged.

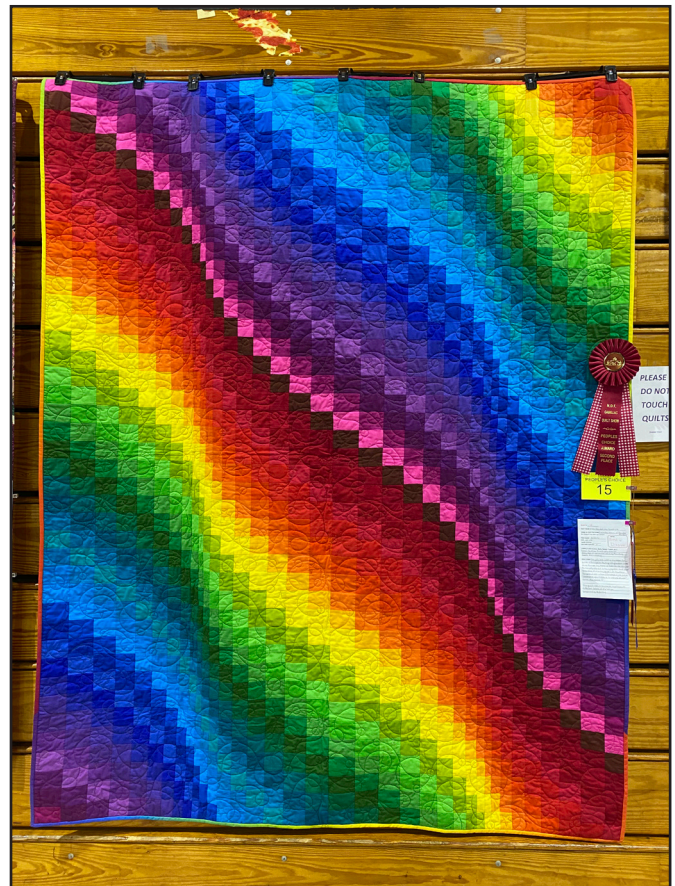

- No more than one entry will be accepted from any one exhibitor in any one section, unless specific class rules state otherwise.
- Stall and cage reservation forms must be filled out and sent to the Northern District Fair Livestock Department, with appropriate fees, by the last Sunday in July. Reservation forms are in this Fairbook.
- ALL ANIMALS MUST BE IN PLACE BY 6:00PM ON THE FIRST SUNDAY OF FAIR!
- ALL EXHIBITORS MUST ATTEND THE MANDATORY MEETING AFTER WEIGH-IN ON SUNDAY!
- All exhibits shall remain in place until 6:00 am Sunday morning after Fair, at which time they will be picked up by processors, or surrendered by Superintendents. Early removal without prior written approval of the Fairboard, may result in the forfeiture of all premium monies and market proceeds. Exhibitor may also be banned from participation at future Fairs.
- The Youth Department is open to all youth members in the State of Michigan, who are members of a 4H club, FFA club, or other organized livestock/youth organization. Leader/Advisor names must be furnished on request.
- YOUTH MEMBER AGE IS 5 YEARS TO 19 YEARS, AS OF JANUARY 1 OF CURRENT FAIR YEAR.**
Exceptions:
 **Departments with "Tykes & Toddlers" divisions are open to youth age 2-5 (as of January 1). There is no entry since the youth will be showing someone else's animals.
 **Youth members must be 9 years of age (as of January 1) to exhibit in any cattle classes.
- **Youth members must be 9 years of age (as of January 1) to exhibit in any MARKET cattle classes. Youth may be 7 or 8 years old to show in BREEDING STOCK cattle, and MUST have an adult with them in the ring for safety reasons.**
- SHOWMANSHIP age classifications for small animals and livestock shall be:
 Beginner showmanship -- age 5
 Junior showmanship -- age 6-9
 Intermediate showmanship -- age 10-14
 Senior showmanship -- age 15-19
- BEGINNER SHOWMAN (for 5-yr-old exhibitors who are showing for their very first year)
 *Beginner exhibitors may show all species EXCEPT BEEF CATTLE.
 *Beginner exhibitors must enter Beginner Showmanship.
*An adult MUST be present in the ring with the Beginner exhibitor to assist and for safety of the youth.
- Exhibitors are to keep their areas clean at all times during the entire Fair week. Sawdust is furnished and available all week. Pens and cages are REQUIRED to be completely and thoroughly cleaned TWICE PER DAY, before 10:00 am and again before 6:00 p.m. On show days, pens must be cleaned PRIOR to the start of the show. Each barn superintendent will check pen cleanliness throughout the day. Those members not cleaning their areas will be given two written warnings only. After the second warning, if cleanliness has not improved, as determined by the Barn Superintendent and two members of the NDF Livestock Committee, a minimum of 10% will be deducted from the Market check, or premiums may be withheld. Decisions of the Superintendent and the Livestock Committee are

final. ALL animal exhibitors are required to sign a Cleanliness Policy agreement on Sunday/Entry day.

- ALL animals entered and exhibited must be the bonafide property of the exhibitor at the time of entry.
- Anyone participating in a Fair-sponsored activity, who is caught in the act of theft or vandalism, or who is caught with illegal drugs or alcohol, shall have their parents summoned immediately, and appropriate actions taken.
- Trophies and ribbons may be presented as they are won, and must remain in the barn. Other awards earned throughout the week will be presented at the awards banquet on Saturday afternoon.
- Exhibitors are to provide their own feed and hay.
- The decisions of the Judges and the barn superintendents shall be final.

- All market animal exhibits must register with the NDF Livestock Committee using the Livestock Registration Form available on the Northern District Fair website. Dairy/Beef Cattle by November 1, Turkeys by February 15, all other species by May 1. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure the proper registration forms are on file.
- Weight requirements for all Market Livestock projects are listed below. Steers are required to weigh-in in December prior to Fair, at a location to be determined. Goats and Lambs are required to weigh-in at the Wexford County Fairgrounds in Cadillac, the first Saturday of May of the Fair year. Times for weigh-in to be determined. For biosecurity reasons Swine will only be weighed on entry day. Market animal weights may be shared from other fairs' weigh-in days, with permission of the NDF Livestock Committee prior to weighing in. All overweight and underweight animals will be sent home immediately off of the scales.

not show Cornish and Broiler (same species, just different age), and you may not show Dairy Beef and Regular Beef (same species, just different breeds). Large animals are Dairy Beef, Beef, Sheep, Swine. Small animals are Cornish, Broiler, Turkey, all Rabbits, Goats. NOTE: A Pen of 2 Hogs will count as TWO large animals.

7. All Market Exhibitors must be present at FINAL weigh-in with their animals, in order to be allowed to show and sell at the Auction.
8. Swine will be weighed in starting at 3:00 pm on entry day of Fair, with all other large animals following swine. All ear tags must be cleaned off and readable at the time of weighing. The NDF Livestock Committee representatives will weigh all of the animals, and these recorded weights shall be the official sale weights.
9. The Small Animal barn will open at 8:00 am on entry day. Poultry will be weighed immediately after they are Pullorum tested, and rabbits will be weighed at check-in. **ALL BIRDS MUST BE CLEAN UPON ARRIVAL. EXCESSIVELY DIRTY BIRDS WILL BE SENT HOME.**
10. All Market projects that make weight must show and then sell at the Livestock Auction, unless they were disqualified.
11. Sale order will be the order of judging, with Grand being first to sell, Reserve being second, and the remaining animals selling in placement order.
12. All projects must adhere to USDA / MDARD rules available at michigan.gov/mdard/animals/exhibitions.
13. Exhibitors are to keep their areas clean at all times during the entire Fair week. Sawdust is furnished and available all week. Pens and cages are **REQUIRED** to be completely and thoroughly cleaned **TWICE PER DAY**, before 10:00 am and again before 6:00 p.m. On show days, pens must be cleaned **PRIOR** to the start of the show. Each barn superintendent will check pen cleanliness throughout the day. Those members not cleaning their areas will be given two warnings only. After the second warning, if cleanliness has not improved, a minimum of 10% will be deducted from the Market Checks, or premiums may be withheld. **ALL animal exhibitors are required to sign a Cleanliness Policy agreement on Sunday/Entry day.**
14. Market checks will be mailed by October 15. Any exhibitor whose Buyer has not yet paid for their market livestock purchase by that time, will receive their check upon receipt of Buyer payment. Buyer photos will be included with your market checks. Each exhibitor is required to deliver a Buyer photo and a Thank-you note to each of their Buyers.
15. All market animals need to be washed and back in their assigned pens by 5:00 on Auction day. All pens are to be completely cleaned by 4:00 pm on Auction day.
16. Wash rack use is prohibited on entry day until 7:00 pm, after the mandatory exhibitor meeting.
17. All exhibitors must be able to control their animals during a mandatory practice run, which will be held after the exhibitor meeting. Any uncontrollable animal will be sent home by the Barn Superintendent and the NDF Livestock Committee. This decision will be final.
18. Buyer "Thank-You" signs **MUST** be placed on all Market animal pens immediately after the sale.
19. All of the above rules/policies may be changed, revised, or reinterpreted at the discretion of the NDF Livestock Committee and the NDF Fairboard.

MARKET RECORD BOOKS

All Market project exhibitors are required to submit a record book for their individual projects. Each project must have their own record book. Do not combine multiple projects in one book. **ONLY**

approved Northern District Fair record books will be accepted. These are available online at northerndistrictfair.org, or can be obtained from any Livestock Committee member. Record books are to be turned in to the Small Animal barn (box provided) no later than NOON on THURSDAY, AND must have the Project Summary Sheet attached at that time. Failure to turn in your record book or project summary sheet will result in a deduction of 10% of your market check. Record books **MUST** be completed by the exhibitor!

SHOWMANSHIP SWEEPSTAKES RULES

12. No horses may be ridden on the south end of the barns, toward the Midway! This is for safety reasons.
13. Two (2) persons from a group must be in the horse barns at all times from 1:00 pm to 10:00 pm, EXCEPT Tuesday and Thursday (5:00 pm - 10:00 pm)
14. Each horse exhibitor is required to participate in Barn Duty.

16. There will be no trailering in or trailering out during Fair, unless exhibitor gets Fairboard approval. Failure to obtain superintendent approval will jeopardize premiums and the ability to participate in future Fairs.
17. Two (2) members of the same family may show the same horse or pony in different classes, provided it is a joint project animal.

19. All ponies must be under 56" and all horses must be over 56" in height. Any horse under 56" and registered in a horse registry such as Arabian, Morgan, Quarter Horse, etc., must be shown in the Horse Division.
20. There must be 3 entries to hold a class. If there are not enough entries, the class may be combined with another class, at the judge's discretion.
21. All participants in the Youth Horse Show, and members who ride in the hunter classes and/or gymkhana classes in the Thursday and Saturday shows, are required to wear protective riding helmets. Helmets must meet the specifications of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM), and must be manufactured and distributed by a participant in the certification program of the Safety Equipment Institute (SEI). Each helmet must bear the SEI certification. There will be no discrimination against protective headgear, even if it does not match the style of riding. A well-fitted helmet should stay on the rider's head when the rider bends over at the waist and shakes his/her head. The rider and parents are solely responsible for obtaining and complying with the headgear rule. It is NOT the responsibility of the Northern District Fair. Show officials reserve the right to spot check helmets at any time, in order to verify compliance and fit.

1. Camping is available for Sunday prior to Fair through the last Sunday of Fair (earlier arrival must be approved prior to arrival!).
2. DEQ requires a minimum of 4 feet between camper units.
3. Nobody under the age of 18 is permitted to stay in a camper without a parent or legal guardian present.
4. Only Fair exhibitors get the Fair Week Rate. Others pay the \$25/day rate.
5. Horse/livestock trailers should be parked in your camping spot, or in the designated area to the South of the New horse barn.
6. Only Barn Superintendents will be permitted to camp and park between the barns.
7. Quiet at 11:00 pm. NO generators after 11:00 pm.
8. Campfire pits are allowed. They must be NO CLOSER than 15' to any camper, and MUST have a mesh cover, per local fire regulations. Absolutely no open burning will be permitted. Fires are to be attended at all times while burning.
9. There is NO WATER HOOKUP available! Potable water is available at designated hydrants.
10. There is NO SEWER HOOKUP available! There is a dump station on the grounds. \$25 dump fee/dump. Check in at the Fair Office for info.
11. Dogs are allowed at campers ONLY. All dogs MUST be on a leash at all times, per Wexford County leash law. Campers are required to clean up after their dogs. Absolutely no dogs will be permitted in the barns!
12. All trash must be picked up and put in trash cans upon departure.
13. Campers must be in their spaces straight in, front to back ONLY. State camping regulations do not allow campers to be placed along the fence line.
14. Any violation of these rules may be cause for removal from the grounds, with no refund.

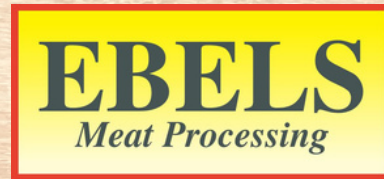
