

Facilities: The Unifor Family Education Centre is a beautiful lodge-style complex. It is a year-round facility sitting on a 47-acre site combining the best of a natural woodland setting and state-of-the-art technology. The Centre offers everything we could need for an exciting self-contained music camp. The facilities include spacious, clean, bright classrooms, rehearsal spaces large enough to accommodate even the biggest band or orchestra, a fully operational dining hall that can accommodate any diet, comfortable rooms, with the beach only a short 5-minute walk away.



Accommodation: Each spacious suite has its own bathroom, one or two queen-sized beds with all linens and even a beach towel provided. Rooms include a sitting area, small fridge, microwave, large modern bathroom, and a view of the grounds.





Dining Hall and Pub: The Unifor Centre boosts a full menu which can accommodate any dietary requests. The chef strives to "shop locally" making for fresh wholesome meals. The Unifor Centre also has a pub on site where you can relax with your favourite beverage, share the excitement of the day and get in a game of pool.



Accessibility: The Unifor Centre is totally wheelchair accessible and air-conditioned. Most rooms, including all classrooms, rehearsal and performance spaces, the dining hall, and the pub, are on the same level. You don't have to leave the building if you don't want to. Plus, there are plenty of level, wide outdoor pathways that take you in and around the facility so you can enjoy the natural surroundings.





Parking: There is plenty of free on-site parking. There are parking spaces available to people with mobility challenges upon request.

Intermediate Band - The difficulty level of the music will be easy and intermediate. <u>Conductors:</u> Brent Rowan and Dan Kapp

Advanced Band - For players who want to be challenged with music that is more difficult; intermediate to advanced. <u>Conductors</u>: Shawn Hills and Resa Kochberg

String Ensemble - is for all string players. Conductor: Phillip Coonce

Full Orchestra - is for all string players and advanced players on flute, clarinet, oboe, bassoon, trumpet, horn, trombone, tuba and percussion. Wind instrumentation will be limited to one person per part, so you should be comfortable playing an advanced part on your own. Conductor: Phillip Coonce

Smaller Ensembles and Classes

Advanced Jazz Ensemble - Traditional big band wind instrumentation (saxes, trumpets, trombones, drum kit, bass, guitar, and piano). Ensemble playing and producing the rhythmic characteristics of the genre will be the focus of this class for those with some experience in the idiom playing at an advanced level. <u>Instructor</u>: Brent Rowan

All Instrument Jazz Ensemble - This class will provide students with an introduction to playing Big Band music, learning the rhythmic characteristics and performance techniques. All instruments are welcome, including drum kit, bass, guitar, and piano. <u>Instructor</u>: Brent Rowan

Playing the Blues - for all instruments. Learn to play the blues in easy steps. Listen to music based on the blues. The blues are probably America's greatest contribution to the world of music. <u>Instructor</u>: Roy Ernst

German Band – It's always a good time of year to "Oompah"! The sheet music used in this band/orchestra is for expanded instrumentation which includes all instruments at this camp. We'd also love to see a keyboard player...especially an accordion player! <u>Instructor</u>: Dan Kapp

Flute Ensemble - Open to all flute players. Instructor: Resa Kochberg

Line Dancing - like you've never seen before! In this fun-filled workshop you'll be moving to the toe-tapping tunes of Eastern Canada! Wear comfy shoes, pack your sense of humor and get ready to dance like nobody's watching! Everyone welcome! No experience needed and there will be modifications for those with mobility issues ... so there's no excuse! You won't regret it! <u>Instructor</u>: Lisa Kapp

Exploring Popular Music Styles – Open to all string players. In this class, we will explore how classically trained players can transition to styles like bluegrass, jazz, klezmer, or Irish. Topics include developing a repertoire, learning by ear, sounding authentic, and using computer-assisted tools. We will also practice group playing, creating accompaniments from lead sheets, and soloing. The instructor will provide tunes, but you are welcome to bring your own. <u>Instructor</u>: Phillip Coonce

Why Music Theory? – Unlock the secrets of music with this engaging music theory class! Open to all campers, this class will deepen your understanding of musical forms, leading to greater appreciation and more expressive playing. Join us and discover how learning the fundamentals can transform your musical journey! Instructor: Roy Ernst

Bucket Rhythm Workshop – you will have an opportunity to develop your "rhythm chops" through the "bucket". You will use your bucket to explore different ways to count, practice and master tough rhythms, simple vs compound time, odd meters, tips for sight reading and more. Buckets and sticks provided. No percussion experience required. <u>Instructor</u>: Dan Kapp and Lisa Kapp


Woodwind Ensemble (Mixed Level) - This is an all-level group for all woodwind instruments playing a variety of music at a comfortable level . Instructor: Shawn Hills

Brass and Percussion Ensemble (Mixed Level) - This is an all-level group for all brass and percussion instruments playing a variety of music at a comfortable level. <u>Instructor:</u> Dan Kapp

How many classes should I take?

Playing your instrument too long each day can lead to muscle soreness and fatigue for most people. Think of three or four classes as a full load and consider taking some classes in which you will not play your instrument, such as "Why Music Theory?" or "Rhythm Bucket Workshop". Many participants leave one or two periods free for rest and just walking around to enjoy the beautiful grounds or maybe the beach.

Registration

On-line **registration is now open** for subscribers to The Roy Ernst Music Institute (REMI). To become a free subscriber, go to <u>royernstmusic.com</u>. Subscribers will also receive a \$40 discount. Non-subscribers can register beginning on March 20, 2025.

The first step is to register. That will reserve a place for your instrument in the large ensemble and classes you select. It is possible that there will be wait-lists for some instruments and choices. The first fifty people will be accepted regardless of instrumentation. After that, instrumentation will be a factor. Register early to avoid disappointment.

Once you have been accepted to camp, you will receive a payment request. Once your fee is paid you will receive a welcome letter and your seat will be guaranteed. Thank you.

Instructional Fee

Your instructional fee covers the cost of teachers, rental of rehearsal rooms and classrooms, rental of percussion instruments and other equipment. (Fees are in Canadian Funds)



About Your Teachers



Roy Ernst, Professor Emeritus at the Eastman School of Music of the University of Rochester, started the first New Horizons Band in 1991 at Eastman. He received grants over a period of several years from NAMM, The International Music Products Association, to start the first New Horizons Band and to assist in starting New Horizons Programs in other locations, causing some people to call him "The Johnny Appleseed of Music for Adults." He has written articles and books on music education, conducting, and performance.

Roy earned a Ph. D. from The University of Michigan and has received honors from MENC, Delta Omicron, Wayne State University, The Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, and The Eastman School of Music. He was recognized as a "Grand Master of Music Education" by the Music Teachers National Association (formerly MENC). Roy was awarded an honorary doctorate from Western University in Ontario. In addition to teaching at Eastman, he has taught at Livonia Public Schools in Michigan, Wayne State University, Georgia State University and The New South Wales Conservatorium of Music in Sydney, Australia. His hobbies include learning to play new instruments, bike riding, walking, travel, and doing lots of dishes for his wife, Pat, a chef. Classes: Playing the Blues, Why Music Theory?



Dan Kapp holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts (Performance – trumpet) from York University in Toronto, Ontario. He also holds a Bachelor of Education from Queen's University and has studied at the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education at the University of Toronto. He is bringing 30+ years of professional performance, teaching, conducting, and leadership experience to this camp. As Musical Director/Conductor, Dan has been involved in countless performances in many settings: professional and community. He has conducted and taught in

Canada, Turkey, the USA, and Latin America. Dan has also conducted at a number of Band Camps in Quebec, Ontario, Nova Scotia, New York, Maine, Michigan and South Carolina.

In 2010, Dan founded the New Horizons Band of Toronto which continues to offer band classes at 4 different levels with over 150 members.

Resa Kochberg - It is one of Resa's greatest joys to share her love of music with others. After studying piano and playing flute in high school, Resa graduated from The University of Toronto with her Bachelor of Music Degree. She then became an Itinerant Music Instructor (IMI) for the Scarborough Board of Education. When she and her husband started a family, she put both teaching and playing her flute on hold to be a full-time mom.

During those years Resa taught private piano lessons and had a cottage industry clothing business, but her flute remained in its case. After twenty years she finally picked up her flute and joined a community band. She then returned to the Toronto District School Board (TDSB) as an IMI, led workshops as a flute specialist, and conducted ensembles for

the TDSB and Toronto Music Camp.

Returning to music, Resa realized how much she and others who had abandoned their instruments missed it. She saw an opportunity to create a fun, social atmosphere for adults to rediscover making music, aligning with the Resa's Pieces motto. Now in its 26th season, Resa's Pieces consists of five ensembles: Concert Band, String Ensemble, Symphony Orchestra, and Resa's Pieces Singers, which includes a small chamber choir called The Treblemakers.

In addition to her official role as Concert Band Conductor and Music Director for Resa's Pieces, Resa conducts a unique flute ensemble, The Enchanted Flutes, and plays her flute with The Encore Symphonic Band.

In 2014, Resa received the Urban Hero Award for her tireless, dedicated efforts that have made a significant positive impact on others. **Classes:** Advanced Band, Flute Ensemble



Brent Rowan is a professional community musician. As a Guelph, Ontario, Canada based saxophonist, Brent performs in a wide variety of musical collaborations; including 2009 and 2015 Juno Nominated Eccodek, Big Bands, smaller jazz combos, and creative music ensembles. Brent has performed and recorded all across Canada, the UK and Germany, at music festivals in Vancouver, Calgary, Toronto and London England to name a few. He has released three recordings of his own compositions; "It's About Time" in 2006, "IZ" in 2012 and "Where is Local" in 2016. Brent composes and arranges music for many of the groups he directs. He is the founding

director of both the Guelph Youth Jazz Ensemble and the New Horizons Band for Guelph. Brent has taught in the Community Music Program at Wilfrid Laurier University and jazz saxophone at the University of Guelph. He is also a clinician and adjudicator at music camps and festivals throughout southern Ontario, specializing in saxophone and improvisation concepts.

Brent holds a Master of Arts in Critical Studies in Improvisation, from the University of Guelph 2021, a Master of Arts in Community Music, from Wilfrid Laurier University 2015, a Bachelor of Music in Jazz Performance from Humber College 2005 and a Bachelor of Mathematics from the University of Waterloo 1996. Lisa Kapp, a retired high school English/Dramatic Arts teacher, had a rich teaching career spanning 30 years in public and private schools in Ontario and Turkey. Lisa's retirement is filled with diverse interests including golf, DIY reno projects, reading, gardening, and hooking (yep - ask her about it!).

Lisa's creative passion extends to community theater where she actively participates in several roles including actor, singer, choreographer, and director. In a band setting, despite her

He also held positions with the Northeastern Pennsylvania Philharmonic and the New Mexico Symphony Orchestra.

Phil has been a Concertmaster for esteemed ensembles like The New York Grand Opera, Brooklyn Philharmonic Outreach Concerts, Opera Ebony, Hoboken Chamber Orchestra, and The Spoleto Festival. His freelance engagements include performances with the New Jersey Symphony, Jupiter Symphony, Martha Graham Dance Company to name a few. Phil has also played in New York Broadway Productions such as La Cage aux Folles and Gypsy.

As an accomplished chamber musician, Phil has performed with groups like Asphodel (Baroque Ensemble), Right as Rain (Bluegrass Trio), La Camerata de México, Hudson Chamber Players, Cantabile Piano Trio, Brooklyn Bach Festival, The Hand Me Downs (Bluegrass Band), Toronto Drushva String Quartet, and numerous freelance engagements.

Phil's dedication to teaching is evident through his roles as Faculty and Music Director at Playweek West, Faculty at Princeton Playweek and Playweek Mid-Atlantic, and Faculty at Summertrios.
