
On Thanksgiving, we share a special meal with family and friends. Make this holiday candle as a festive centerpiece for your table.

What you need:

- · Paper towel
- One 8-oz. clear plastic cup
- · Petroleum jelly (Vaseline)
- · Paper or plastic disposable bowl
- About 8 oz. of a variety of dried beans, peas, corn, etc.
- · Bottle of white glue
- · Plastic spoon
- An 8- to 10-inch taper or dinner candle
- · Adult to help

What you do:

- Using the paper towel, rub a generous amount of petroleum jelly on the inside of the cup (bottom and sides).
- 2. In a bowl, pour the dried-bean mixture.
- 3. Squeeze enough glue into the bean mixture to generously coat it. Stir the mixture with the spoon.
- 4. Spoon about half of the bean mixture into the greased cup. Then place the candle, with any plastic wrapping removed, into the center of the mixture. Next, fill the cup with the rest of the mixture. Smooth the top to make it flat, making sure the candle stays straight.
- Squeeze extra glue around the hole made by the candle. Let the bean mixture dry completely, which could take a day or longer
- When the bean mixture is dry, gently pull the candle. Both the candle and beans should come out as one. (If they don't, pour more glue and wait another day.)
- 7. Place your candle on a small plate for a festive Thanksgiving centerpiece.

"If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land."

2 Chronicles 7:14

A church member called whe a few weeks ago and asked who I was planning to vote for as president. Actually, he said that, in his opinion, I had a pastoral obligation to tell the people how I was voting.



He and I wound up having a really good conversation that day. But I don't think I succeeded in convincing him that it's not my place as pastor to talk about my own personal, political opinions or preferences. I did, however, make the

point that, at least for us as Christians, we do indeed have an obligation to not only participate in local and national elections, but to actually pray for them.

By the time this newsletter comes out, most if not all of you will have already voted. But I do hope your faith played a big part in your decision to vote, as well as who you wound up voting for. The verse from 2 Chronicles was probably not written with political elections in mind, but it does remind us of several important things to think about. #1 – Stay humble as you consider your decisions. #2 – Pray to God and seek his will for yourself and our country. And #3 – Do your best to change your ways so that, at least as far as our political leanings are concerned, we reflect our Christian faith in how way we think and talk and act.

Some of you can probably guess where I stand on political issues or candidates, but for a number of reasons, I will not talk about politics in church. What I will talk about is our calling to follow Jesus Christ and to reflect our faith in the way we love our neighbor, help those in need, and carry out our civic duties.

Please pray for our nation, and do your best to promote harmony and acceptance rather than division and hatred.

OAXACA 2025 - The dates for the OAXACA 2025 trip are Tuesday, February 11 through Wednesday, February 19th. During this visit our primary funding/work project will be located in Oaxaca City at Pastor Israel Paz' Gracia Abundante congregation. The 2012 work group (which included 7 youth) assisted the 'then' new Gracia Abundante congregation with the construction of their present worship space. The work included carrying and laying all the bricks for the sanctuary floor. The membership has outgrown that facility and they have asked for our assistance to build more space. In addition to increased worship space, the project will eventually include 2 classrooms and bathrooms. The group will worship with several congregations we have assisted on previous visits; we will assist at the Friday morning hospital ministry breakfast (we will provide blankets and pesos) and have been invited to attend the annual pastor's conference on February 16th.
