Easter Crosses

Make this craft to remember what Jesus did for us. Hang it in your room to look at all year long.

What you need:

- Two 8" paper plates (white)
- Scissors
- Pencil
- Crayons, paints or felt markers
- Stapler, glue stick or glue
- Paper punch
- Yarn, string or ribbon (about 10" or 12")

What you do:

1. With your pencil draw a slight curved line all the way across the center of one plate. This will be a hill.
2. Draw three crosses on the hill. Make the center one a little bigger than the others.
3. Color the hill green and the crosses brown. Or color the hill and crosses black to look like a silhouette.
4. Cut out the hill and crosses as one piece.
5. Color the top half of the other plate with red, orange and yellow to look like an evening sky.
6. Staple or glue the hill-and-crosses plate onto the sky plate. Make sure you line up the bottom edges of the plates, and staple or glue just along the curved edges where the plates meet.
7. Punch a hole near the top of the sky plate.
8. Tie a loop of yarn, string or ribbon through the hole.
9. Hang your scene on your doorknob or on something else in your room.

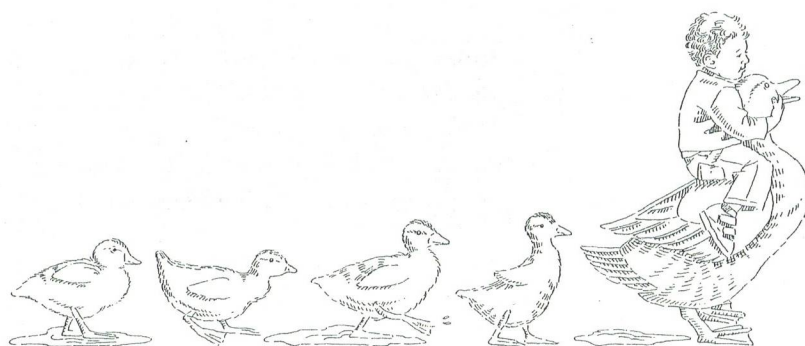

The IA-MN Oaxaca Mission Group--Myron and Monica Hemann, Wanda Hanson, Judy Devorak, Jackie Veri and Janice Helgeson-- spent February 11--19, 2025 in Oaxaca, Mexico assisting Pastor Samuel Sanchez with his growing ministry. This was the 28th visit from our area to Oaxaca, Mexico. We had a busy, indescribable week with words in our minds such as inspiring, eye-opening and inspirational. Some of our activities were:

Wednesday, February 12--Breakfast; reviewed the weeks activities; business meeting when the submitted written requests sent to PR Samuel from Oaxaca congregations were discussed and reviewed; went to the bank to exchange dollars into pesos. (19-20% exchange rate)

Thursday, February 13--visited the Mayan ruins, tule tree, and the Teotitlan rug village; prepared gift envelopes

Friday, February 14--Left hotel at 6AM to assist PR Eber's congregation serve breakfast at the government hospital. Almost 150 individuals were served tortillas with a scrambled egg-tomato filling, coffee and atole (a hot cornmeal drink). Families were given a warm blanket (a total of 100 blankets were purchased), and 100 pesos (\$5). PR Eber presented individual messages of encouragement. Children's gift bags were compiled. The group met and determined the distribution of gifts to requesting congregations.

Friday, February 14, evening--we were guests of Pastor Samuel and Angelina's family for their weekly blessing service. PR Sam presented blessings to each of us and spoke to us on the need for 'joy' in our hearts and in our lives.

Saturday, February 15--we traveled 2 hours north to Cuicatlan and were guests for a meal at Bishop PR Antonio's home for supper and later attended a powerful worship service at his worship space, Divino Savior, with over 300 other worshippers--2 hours of singing and a 1 hour message. PR Samuel's message at the service was based on John 5:39. After worship 60 children's gift bags containing dental and school supplies and 20 pesos (\$.10) were presented to the attending children. Also in the gift bags were drawings done by students at Sacred Heart School in Adams, MN. Their drawings were exchanged with students of PR Antonio's Divino Savior congregation--this may be the beginning of a youth mission exchange experience. A delicious meal followed the service.

Sunday, February 16--We were honored guests at the Iglesia Evangelica Nacional Nueva Generacion pastor's annual meeting held at PR Eliezer Ponce' Chicozapote congregation--Agua Vivas. There were 19 pastors and their associates in attendance--15 of the pastors attending were from areas YOU have helped. At the conference we presented 144 Bibles, 20 soccer balls and 20 basketballs, 14 girl's 'pillowcase' dresses. and your contributions to:

The pastors offered blessings to YOU and expressed their thanks for YOUR gifts and continued support.

March 2025

Sunday, February 16, continued--PR Jaime Trejo of the EL Chilar congregation asked us to visit the completed project at his El Chilar congregation on our way back to Oaxaca City. For the past several years part of YOUR funds were used to complete the kitchen, bathrooms and water system at their worship space. This facility is used for many youth camps during the year and recently hosted almost 1200 New Generation members for a two day revival meeting.

Monday, February 17--We left the hotel at 6AM to assist PR Eber and his congregation serve coffee and bread at the Worker's Market Ministry located at a large vender marketplace. The workers came into the city to find supplemental, temporary work. Contractors come to this area to hire workers qualified for the specific jobs they have current openings to fill.

After all of the potential workers were served, the group relocated to another area and served homeless and despondent individuals. A total of 250 portions of bread were served. PR Eber's message to them was based on Matthew 20

Tuesday, February 18--We were invited for breakfast at PR Eber's congregation. PR Eber is a graduate of Pastor Samuel's Bible School. He serves as pastor at Mas que Vencedores on Saturday and his congregation, Iglesia of Faith in Jesus Christ, on Sunday. Your funds assisted in building this worship space several years ago. He thanked each of you--through us--offering each of us individual blessings, prayer and anointing (very impressive and emotional). We visited the cathedral of Santo Domingo and shopped from the vendors in downtown Oaxaca.

Wednesday, February 19--430 AM, we left the hotel for our 730 AM flight home. We had a scheduled long layover and then a long flight delay. We arrived home at 4AM.

HUMANITARIAN PROJECTS: Pastor Samuel reported on some of the many humanitarian projects he and his wife, Angelina have supported in 2024.

Maria Francesca is an ongoing recipient and is responding to the prescribed medication. She is given 50 pesos (\$25) a month for food, supplies and medication. Some of the other needs you have helped meet are education assistance for Wilber and Sergio; medical assistance for 4 adults; financial assistance for a widow with a hospitalized child; and provided funds for the food at a large event for homeless at Tuxtepec.

OTHER INFORMATION:

We met with Bishop Pastor Antonio Procopio, president of the New Generacion Church's council. He thanked us for the many years of support given to the Oaxaca congregations. He told us many of the congregations are in small mountain villages and do not have financial resources, but have the ability to do the work to build or improve their worship space. We asked his thoughts regarding the long range future of our partnership--such as someone to learn Pastor Sam's bilingual, advisory role for our IA-MN group. Pastor Oscar Barroso from the Agua Viva Congregation from Chalco, near Mexico City, said he would be willing to study English. At this time he will use Google translation for written communications.

The people we meet do not have the monetary things we have, but the faith they share with us is beyond measure. It was a great trip. We look forward to the 2026 trip! What will God have in store for us? Join us!

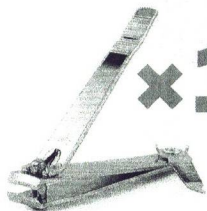
