# 24th Annual Young Astronaut Day Inspires Next Generation of Scientists and Engineers

The Young Astronaut Day (YAD) outreach event continued its 24 year legacy at NASA Glenn Research Center (GRC) on November 5, 2016. For the first time, the event was held in the Mission Integration Center (MIC) building where nearly 200 students (grades 1st through 12th) competed in a variety of hands-on engineering challenges. YAD is a grass-roots effort comprising over 50 volunteers across NASA GRC, AIAA, and local universities.

This year's activities, which were all developed by volunteers from NASA GRC, were: Air Rockets, Parachute Drop Challenge, Spudnaut, Lego Space Elevator, Virtual Rocket Challenge, and Gaining Traction on Mars. In partnership with Herschman Architects, the students also participated in a community service activity called Canstruction<sup>®</sup> during which \$1200 worth of canned food was used to construct a model of the Centaur Upper Stage rocket. Marla Perez-Davis (Deputy Director, NASA GRC) and Peggy Cornell (AIAA NOS Vice-Chair) kicked off the event by welcoming the students who were then treated to key note speaker Astronaut Mike Good. The 30 student teams included a team from Mike's elementary school as well as a team from Pittsburgh, PA. Due to the popularity of the event, the teams are selected by lottery. This year, 20 teams (140 students) had to be turned away due to event capacity restrictions.

#### AIAA Northern Ohio Section Mentoring Activities

Northern Ohio Section (NOS) members Joseph Connolly and Kevin Melcher are once again leading a Mentoring Program for the student members of the section. The 2016-2017 program follows a successful pilot program in 2015-2016. The goals of the NOS Mentoring Program are twofold. First, to support AIAA's goal of maintaining a high-performing global aerospace workforce by providing a formal mechanism for more senior AIAA members to share their wealth of experience and knowledge with future aerospace professionals. Second, to increase the benefit of AIAA to undergraduate and graduate students by helping them develop the skills needed for success after completing their degrees, and by providing an opportunity to see how industry and government operate in the real world.

To kick off the current program, Mr. Melcher hosted a Meet & Greet event at the Grayton Road Tavern on October 11. The event provided an informal setting for mentors and mentees to get to know each other prior to pairing. The pairing process was completed, and an orientation teleconference was held on November 3. During the orientation, Mr. Connolly and Mr. Melcher gave an overview of the mentoring program including program goals, schedule, and mentor/mentee responsibilities. The seven (7) mentor-mentee pairs have developed mentoring plans that they are currently pursuing.

Additionally, Mr. Melcher participated as a panel member in a mentoring discussion entitled, "Getting the Most from Mentoring." The hour-long discussion was part of the career workshop, "Tools to Ensure Your Career Success," which was held during the AIAA Science and Technology Forum, January 9-13, 2017, Grapevine, Texas. In response to electronically solicited questions from audience members, Mr. Melcher and other panel members shared their experience and insights as both mentors and mentees. Other panel members included: Brett Anderson, Senior Management Leader, Boeing Defense and Space; Angela Trego, Professor, Utah Assistant Valley University; and Abigail Sevier, Cleveland State University student and mentee during the NOS 2015-2016 mentoring program. The various perspectives provided by the panel were well received by the approximately 40 attendees.
