If you are the person or persons who rewired the upper trap house around Wednesday September 12, you need to stop making unauthorized modifications to Club equipment. Unless you have been specifically authorized by the Board of Directors and Wayne Langevin or Bill Sergent to work on the trap houses, you are violating Club policy, and run the risk of damaging Club equipment. The changes made interrupted the proper operation of the trap machine and created extra work for those who are authorized. Fortunately, no serious damage resulted.

If this type of violation continues, whether done out of ignorance or spite, the situation will be reviewed by the Board. If there is no resolution, the Board may consider one of several actions which might include requiring an RSO whenever the trap fields are in use, or limits on when the trap machines may be used by the general membership.

It is this number that will give you instructor training credit when Sue inputs it into the clinic summary she sends to the NRA after the clinic.

UPDATES: Volunteers will no longer need to sign in. Upon arrival, please report to your venue to assist with clean up and set up as needed. The area in and around the sign in shack will be reserved for the women from 7:00am to 9:00am who will sign in and attend a one-hour mandatory pre-clinic safety training class. This training will start at 8:00am sharp. They will need quiet to hear the training so please stay away. The shooting will start at 9:30am.

Instructors will need to let me know ahead of the clinic of your intent to attend. I will formulate a list of all instructor names and Sue will come to each venue during the women's safety training and have you sign to confirm your attendance. This is for your training credit. If you attend the clinic and have not let me know prior, please be sure to let Sue know so she can include you on the list. If you don't, she will not know of your attendance and you will not get the credit.

CalFire has issued the restrictions of no fires or shooting on public lands because of the current drought. Legal hunting is the only exception.

Range Repairs

Any range repair costing more than \$400 need board approval. This can be done via email if time is a factor.

Removing Club Property from the Range

Club property may not be removed from the range without Board approval. This includes, but is not limited to replaced archery targets, broken trap machines, metallic targets, target stands, etc.

Sporting Clays Tickets

Sporting clays tickets may be used for all other events up to the face value and only for one day. For example, if the face value is \$15, you could shoot three rounds of say 5-stand valued at \$5 per round. If you choose to only shoot two rounds, your ticket may not be used to shoot another day.

All items offered for sale must be sold in accordance with federal, state and local laws.

Youth Trap:

Cheryl Robertson reported: In August we had 20 shooters. We had two events. The last time we shot two weeks ago we had 5 first time shooters, so we had an entire squad of first-time shooters. I was short a coach, so thank goodness two of my youth trap kids who have aged out who are good shooters showed up hoping to jump onto a squad and they couldn't do that, so we put them to coaching. They did a great job mentoring. Four of these new shooters are from a Boy Scout Troop in La Mesa. And one of the new shooters is a grandson of one of our members. They all had a really great time. Our high scores for our shooters, Aiden Barden was the best singles game for the month shooting 24 out of 25 and for doubles Jared Dustkill shot 43 out of 50, So there are some competitive scores from these kids. We are going to be expecting a lot more brand-new shooters. This boy scout troop wants to bring four new kids every first Saturday that we are meeting. That they can get parents to bring them. And then as often as possible the explorers from Border Patrol want to bring me four new kids the second Saturday. So, I need help. How many here have attended the Shot Gun Instructor class? How many people here have worked a shot gun event in the last 12 months? If you have attended the class, this is a great way to get practice mentoring. My new kids have never fired a shotgun. We must start from absolute ground zero. With the NRA safety rules about how to hold the thing and how to get a sight picture, and dominant eye and it's a lot of stuff. And we still must have the other squad going while somebody works with all the new guys. So, I have a signup sheet with my dates from now until the end of the year on it. If you could find it in your heart to come out one Saturday to help us with these new kids I would appreciate it. I will hang out after the meeting.

2nd Amendment Shoot:

Stan Luhr reported: September 15th is the 2nd Amendment shoot sponsored by Randy Voepel. It's a good event to have people come out to our range and have some good connections with our political folks. Last year we had a 142 people attend and we only had 18 volunteers. We need more volunteers. to monitor people coming from the parking lot to make sure they are not carrying their guns around before they check in. So, they'll be herded into the sign in area. This year we are going to have the sign in area up higher in the parking lot so that we don't have people walking down onto the ranges before they sign in. We are going to initiate a two-hand band system so one colored hand band will designate for all of our RSO's that these are beginner shooters. And that will allow us to funnel these people right in to a beginner lane. Where we can have some mentor coaches right there one on one. For those that volunteer my wife has offered to come in and bring lunch in. So, if you show up around 11:30 we'll get set up. We will also have some sponsors that will have some booths up there. San

For those of you who don't know who Ginger Bass is, she was a dedicated member to this club she was (Kevin's) sponsor and she was a sponsor of several other current shooters that belong to our club. She was brutally murdered by her husband. She was taken from us tragically.
