Summary of October 2018

Board of Directors' Meeting

The Board approved 5 dates in 2019 for Boy Scout Merit Badge shoots – the 1st Sunday of even months, except December. Two dates were approved for the Club hosting the Sporting Clays competition with Maywood Club – May 12 and August 11, 2019. The competition will supercede the Fun Shoot on those two dates. Four Prospective members were approved as new members of the Club. The Website Investigation Sub-Committee presented a preliminary concept for a new Club Website, including a single, consolidated calendar. The Board liked what was presented and authorized continued efforts with the goal of having the website updated. Purchase and installation of two additional security cameras was approved. The Board approved Saturday May 4, 2019, for the 2019-20 Installation of Officers. Paul Coffey presented an estimate for having a self-catered event with pit roasted meat, salads, etc. This was also approved, so save the date. In honor of recently deceased member Jim Kasten, the Board approved naming the main award for the Sporting Clays Interclub competition with Maywood Club, The Kasten Cup. The Board also approved installation of another permanent sporting clays station with a plaque recognizing the contribution of Jim Kasten to the Club.

Members Passing

Jim Kasten, a long time (45 years) member, passed away on October 7th at the age of 84. Jim was a stalwart member of the Club who served on the Board for many years. Him and his wife Gina were also fixtures at Sporting Clays for many years.

The club recently learned that Telford Quan, a member of the club for 47 years, passed away in December 2017 at the age of 75.

The club learned that Frank Shaw, a member of the club for 51 years, passed away in August at the age of 80.

Santiago (Jim) Hernandez passed away the week of 10 October. No other details were available. Jim was a member of the club for 10 years and was 73 years old.

Just Say No to Steel

If you are shooting ammo that has a steel core (Russian AK and 5.56 military surplus are possible culprits) **DO NOT SHOOT** steel targets. You can use it on paper or clay targets only. If you don't know with certainty if your ammo is steel, check the bullet with a magnet.

Armor piercing ammo is banned so again, if you don't know, find out!

ATV Usage on the Range

ATV's must be used in a responsible manner on the range. The intent of allowing them on the range is to enable access for those with physical limitations.

The range **IS NOT** for off-roading!

Range Reminder

A Scheduled RSO is required to be present for any Rifle or Handgun shooting at the range. Shotguns may be used at any of the ranges including the Pit and Rifle Range.

RSO Reminder

Leave the range in good condition when securing the range - trash dumped, old targets removed from down range, brass policed, etc.

Reporting on Events

All reports, documents, and proceeds concerning club events will be turned in to the Secretary within two (2) meetings, but in no case shall exceed forty-five (45) days from the date of the event. The documents pertaining to the event includes sign up sheets, comp tickets, etc. as required for reconciliation of funds.

Target Damage

Another rifle range target has been damaged by use of inappropriate (wrong projectile, over-powered) ammo. See picture attached.

If you were shooting on the rifle range between noon Monday Sept 24 and morning Saturday September 29 (excluding the Precision Long Rang Rifle match), please check your ammo.

Until further notice, ALL who would shoot any center fire ammo (rifle, handgun, shotgun) on the rifle range will be required to present their ammo to the RSO on duty for inspection, BEFORE firing any rounds. If you bring more than one box of ammo to shoot, each box must be inspected.

RSOs, if you have any question regarding any ammo presented for inspection, please ask the shooter to use a paper target or refrain from using the ammo in question on steel targets until that ammo can be deemed safe for our targets. If any shooter refuses to present all their ammo for inspection, ask them to leave the range immediately. Then call or text me.

The continued damage to Club property will not be tolerated. Additional incidents of damage will be reviewed by the Board and may result in restrictions on shooting or closure of the range.
