REMINDER – PRICE INCREASE

COMING JANUARY 1, 2021

Below is a list of events for which the price is going to increase January 1, 2021.

Sporting Clays: Junior shooters: 50 birds will be \$15.00 and 100 birds will be \$25.00. Adults: 50 birds will be \$25 and 100 birds are changing to \$40.00. Nonmembers will still be charged a \$5.00 gate fee for either 50 or 100 birds. Tuesday 5-Stand Fee will increase by \$1.00 to \$8.00 per 25 birds, nonmembers will be charged a \$5.00 gate fee 3 Family Fun Shoot will change from \$5.00 to \$10.00. This is a member only shoot. There will be no limit on the number of times a member can shoot within the 8AM until noon time frame.

Board of Directors Meeting

The Board approved 8 people as new members of the Club. For those with other Prospective members, there are still 94 openings available. The Board approved a request by the local Scouts, BSA Council to hold fund raising sporting clays events at the Club on Friday May 14 and Friday December 10, 2021. Discussion was held regarding implementation of various range maintenance and upgrade projects. For the time being, upgrading the Club's environmental awareness is taking precedence. Other upgrades are tabled for up to 2 years until the loans for the new properties purchase 4 years ago are paid off. V.P. Lorrie Smith has the list of projects available. The Board agreed to no longer hold meetings at the Lemon Grove VFW Hall, and to hold all future meetings at the range. The Board voted to assume complete management of the Women on Target program from the local NRA Members Council. The new arrangement includes transferring control of the event's income and expenses to the Club. Sue and Eric Johnson will continue to manage this highly successful outreach program. Membership Chair Casey Gastrich wants all members who are considering the NMA Buyout option to remember that the option must be exercised when their renewal paperwork and dues are being submitted. The option ends on April 30, when the renewal period closes.

RSO Safety Corner

There were a few safety issues identified this month that I think need to be addressed.

RSOs are in charge of all shooting on the range. That means if you are using the trap house and there is an RSO on the rifle range you should stop by and let them know you are there and then coordinate with them prior to going downrange for any reason. You also must follow any directions you are given by them. Understand that they are not trying to micromanage your shoot, they are just ensuring your safety and the safety of everyone else on the range.

Orange markers on the bunkers - There are orange horizontal markers on each of the berms and bunkers, no targets can be placed above these markers. This is to ensure rounds do not leave the range or cause damage to the bunkers. **THESE ARE NOT TARGETS!** If you are caught shooting them, or any other club property not clearly identified as a target, you may be asked to leave the range for the day and your shooting privileges may be suspended until you present yourself to the board. If the actions were deemed serious enough, or if the damage was extensive, your membership in the club could be terminated by the board of directors in accordance with the SOP.

Lateral limit flags - Ensure all of your rounds stay within the confines of the lateral limit flags. All of your shooting should be close to straight downrange, you cannot sit on one side of the range and shoot at targets on the other.

Steel targets - Steel targets can cause ricochets. The targets are designed to deflect the rounds in a safe direction only if you are shooting straight out them. Shooting from more than 20 degrees off center may cause the ricochets to come back across the firing line causing a hazardous situation for others on the range.

When shooting paper targets make sure you remove all steel from behind them in order to prevent damage or ricochet hazards (know your target and what lies beyond), this includes the chains the targets are hanging from. This is especially important if using steel core ammo, any rifle cartridge at the 50-yard berm, or when in the pit and the plate rack stand is in the background.

You are required to sign in and out any time you are using any range, including the upper trap house. The RSO will have the sign in sheet on the range for the rifle range and pit. For users of the trap house, since RSOs are not required, you can find copies of the Range Inspection Form/Sign In Sheet located next to the file cabinet in the sign in shack. Complete the inspection and then flip the sheet over and sign in. When you are done shooting place the completed form in the box labeled "Completed Forms Here" next to the file cabinet.

Gate Closure

Do not lock the gate open during open shooting.

Please close the gate after sign-up has been completed for those events where it is possible to do so. We want to avoid folks coming in and wandering around the range especially when shooting is occurring.

Club Calendar

When reviewing the club calendar, it is important that you realize that there is a color code describing where different events take place and that each event has its own line item on the calendar. Make sure you click on the item you are interested in to see the full event description.

Recently several people thought that the work party on February 27th, which was on the calendar in orange, was cancelled because the Youth Trap event, which was on the calendar in blue had been cancelled. This could have been avoided if they had clicked on the Work Party entry to see the full description.

Membership Corner

A Few Reminders When Renewing

You will be receiving your renewal notices next week and below are some of the recurring questions I get from Members when they renew. This will help you with the process.

1. There are waivers included for every member. These must be completed and returned. If you don't return this included waiver, your gate key will not work.
2. There have been no modifications to the NMA requirements. Every regular and senior member must complete one 4-hour work party and work at one event. You may also work at another work party instead of the event.
3. You may opt out of the above requirement when renewing for next year (2021/22) only. If you have not chosen this option for this year, it is too late. The \$150 opt out is only for the year in which you are renewing. First year members may not choose the opt out and must do the work party and work at an event.
4. When you renew by mail, checks only and made out to the Club.
5. Make any changes on the renewal form (NRA number and expiration date, change of phone or address, email address etc).
6. On the bottom of the renewal letter there is a checklist of what must be sent to me. You must include those documents If I don't have each one, I cannot complete your renewal.
7. What is a SASE? Look 3 lines in the bold sentence above SASE on the renewal form. No SASE, no return of membership and NMA cards.
8. If you have a question, EMAIL me, so we both have a record of the communication.
