The hours for RSO volunteer hours for the past club year are now in, with over volunteer hours to ensure you have a place to shoot. While all RSOs and Shootmasters deserve a hand for what they do for the club, the following RSOs went above and beyond this year with more than 200 hours each: Chuck Davis - 322 Hours

These RSOs had more than 150 hours each - Mike Steinmetz, Lee Phipps, Gary Kovacevich, Mike Delozier, Bill Palmer, Brion Thomas, Kathleen and Voyko Banjac.

Please thank each one of these volunteers, and all of the RSOs, for helping ensure we all have a fun, safe place to shoot every year.

Shootmasters - If you have not submitted your exemption from SOP letters for the 2021-2022 club year you are late and are in danger of your event being required to comply fully with all the rules in the SOP. Get those in as soon as possible. You are doing a great job getting shooters on the range, we just need to make sure we are all on the same page with what is happening at your events and everything safe.

The warm weather is getting closer, make sure you take care of yourselves on the range. That means drink plenty of fluids before you get to the range and while you are here. It also means wear lightweight clothing and sunscreen as appropriate. Watch yourself and your fellow shooters to make sure nobody has a serious weather-related injury. The hot, dry weather also increases the Fire Danger Rating, make sure you don't do anything that would create sparks that could cause a fire at the range.

Due to new environmental concerns all shooters need to remove all their casings and hulls from the range. RSOs it is your responsibility to make sure the shooters take these items off of the range with them, not just throw them in the trash cans. This includes hulls, brass, steel, and aluminum casings. For the most part we have been doing a great job, but there have been a few exceptions, let's take care of those.

Take care of our club property. This means you as the shooter, and the RSO as the supervisor, need to ensure you are not shooting steel at steel targets and you are only shooting at approved targets. Remember, no targets are allowed to be placed above the horizontal orange markers on the berms or in the bunkers. If you are going to shoot paper at the 50-yard berm make sure the steel targets and target chains are moved up and out of the way so they are not struck by your rounds. Knowing your target and what lies beyond is the key here. If you take down, or knock down, any of the steel targets in the bunkers it is your responsibility to repair/replace them. RSO, if you let the shooter leave without repairing the targets you assume that responsibility. If you have any questions about this, please contact me.

Trap shooters - Even though you are not required to have an RSO on duty to shoot if there is an RSO on the rifle range you need to check in with them and coordinate loading the

machine with them. This is for your safety and for that of those on the rifle range. RSOs have the authority to ensure the entire range complex is safe, this includes the trap fields. That means you must follow their guidance.

We all enjoy the club and the freedoms we have here, please do your part to make sure we do not lose them!

Mantis X Group

How are you keeping up your skills in between trips to the range? Are you dry firing on a regular basis? Do you need some motivation to keep you active? If you have a Mantis X system, we created a group for the club so you can track how you are doing compared to other club members. If you have a Mantis X you know that it works for dry fire, live fire or even airsoft, it even works with archery. The group will have set goals every week for either number of shots fired or the average score of your shots. If you are interested request to join the Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club group on your Mantis device. I will approve you for the group as soon as I see your request.

#### **UPCOMING CLASSES:**

NRA Instructor Courses- We have completed the basic classes for Pistol, Rifle and Shotgun and are moving on to the instructor level courses now.

NRA RSO Course- This is the full-length NRA class required for anyone wishing to become an RSO.

Saturday July 10th from 8 AM to 6 PM - Cost \$80 (Plus an additional \$35 to the NRA for certification)

San Diego County CCW Courses - These are run when requested by club members as soon as I can fit it in the schedule. Initial classes are 8 hours long and cost \$100 for club members, renewal classes are 4 hours long and cost \$50 for club members. When contacting me make sure you mention you are Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club members or I will tell you no.

RSO Refresher Courses - Required for all club RSOs once a year - No charge. No registration required, just show up.

Prospective RSOs are encouraged to attend just to hear some of the issues they will face when becoming an RSO.

# **Trap Machines**

# YOUTH TRAP SHOOTING PROGRAM

For those of you who may not know, especially new members, the Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club has a program designed specifically to introduce youth shooters, ages 10 through 17, to the shotgun shooting sport of Trap.

Shoots are scheduled on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturdays of each month, unless preempted by another event, with registration between 11:30 am and 12:00 pm. A safety briefing runs from noon to 12:30 pm with shooting immediately following. The shoot is over by 4:00 pm.

The cost of each shoot is \$10.00 which covers the cost of the clay targets. The club furnishes ammo, provided through an NRA Foundation Grant, and 12/20-gauge shotguns if shooters do not have their own.

Sue Johnson is the shoot master for the event and has the assistance of NRA Certified Shot Gun Instructors, very capable and experienced members and Range Safety Officers. The shoot is comprised of two rounds of straight trap and a round of doubles. Brand new shooters shoot by themselves until their instructor/mentor determines the shooter is ready to join the more experienced shooters.

The shoot is open to the public and because the shooters are minors, parents/legal guardians must attend with their youth.

The biggest thing I must gripe about tonight about safety –if everyone looks out at the 175 there's a great big steel target that is laying down in the dirt. If you shoot at a target and knock it down it is your responsibility to pick it up. The bad thing about that target is it is so razor sharp on the front they couldn't pick it up yesterday. They finally shot the bolts out. We are going to have to pick it up with the tractor. It just rips your gloves trying to pick up that thing. We started the RSO refresher courses. If you are an RSO we started them on Saturday or Sunday, the next one we are going to do one on next Wednesday. If you look on the club calendar, they are put on the club calendar.
