# Summary June 15, 2021 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board approved 8 new members at the meeting. This brings the number of openings down to 100 again. This is good for being so early in the fiscal year. Dave Reed reported that he is almost finished with RSO refreshers for the year, and that he has an RSO certification class scheduled for July 10. Plans for the annual installation of officers and members social are progressing. This year's 10%-er awards are Club logo hats with 10% embroidered on the rear. Also, the Board brought back Club patches and annual rocker strips for 10%-ers. See Sergeant-At-Arms Jim Williams to get yours. The Board has also approved purchasing extra hats in a variety of colors for members to purchase. Price will be \$12/hat. A discussion was held regarding the new play structure. The Board decided to pause construction until a firm cost estimate could be made. The SOP is being updated to include the change to policy regarding removal of brass casings and shotshell hulls. The Board approved payment of the annual liability insurance premiums. The Board approved dates in July and December for women of San Diego County Gun Owners to hold appreciation shoots. The Environmental Committee has been working to put barriers in place to slow the flow of water across the ranges to help keep any lead from leaving Club property.

Do not lock the gate open during open shooting.

Please close the gate after sign-up has been completed for those events where it is possible to do so. We want to avoid folks coming in and wandering around the range especially when shooting is occurring.

# RSO Safety Corner Dave Reed

I want to start off by saying thank you to each member, and guest, who comes to the range and enjoys the shooting activities we offer in a safe and responsible manner, that is what the gun culture is all about.

Please thank each of your RSOs and Shootmasters for helping to ensure we all have a fun, safe place to shoot every year.

The warm weather is upon us, make sure you take care of yourselves on the range. That means drink plenty of fluids before you get to the range and while you are here. It also means wear lightweight clothing and sunscreen as appropriate. Watch yourself and your fellow shooters to make sure nobody has a serious weather related injury. The hot, dry weather also increases the Fire Danger Rating, make sure you don't do anything that would create sparks that could cause a fire at the range.

It is rattlesnake season, watch out for these slithering menaces while you are moving around the club. This is especially important if you are clearing brush or moving objects they could be hiding under. Per SOP we are not allowed to kill any wildlife on the range, all you need to do is stay back a safe distance and make some noise and they will leave the area.

Due to new environmental concerns all shooters need to remove all of their casings and hulls from the range. RSOs it is your responsibility to make sure the shooters take these items off of the range with them, not just throw them in the trash cans. This includes hulls, brass, steel and aluminum casings. For the most part we have been doing a great job, but there have been a few exceptions, let's take care of those.

Take care of our club property. This means you as the shooter, and the RSO as the supervisor, need to ensure you are not shooting steel at steel targets and you are only shooting at approved targets. Remember, no targets are allowed to be placed above the horizontal orange markers on the berms or in the bunkers. If you are going to shoot paper at the 50 yard berm make sure the steel targets and target chains are moved up and out of the way so they are not struck by your rounds. Knowing your target and what lies beyond is the key here. If you take down, or knock down, any of the steel targets in the bunkers it is your responsibility to repair/replace them. RSO, if you let the shooter leave without repairing the targets you assume that responsibility. If you have any questions about this please contact me.

Trap shooters - Even though you are not required to have an RSO on duty to shoot if there is an RSO on the rifle range you need to check in with them and coordinate loading the machine with them. This is for your safety and for that of those on the rifle range. RSOs have the authority to ensure the entire range complex is safe, this includes the trap fields. That means you must follow their guidance.

We all enjoy the club and the freedoms we have here, please do your part to make sure we do not lose them!

## Just Say No to Steel

If you are shooting ammo that has a steel core (Russian AK and 5.56 military surplus are possible culprits) **DO NOT SHOOT** steel targets. You can use it on paper or clay targets only. If you don't know with certainty if your ammo is steel, check the bullet with a magnet.

Armor piercing ammo is banned so again, if you don't know, find out!

How are you keeping up your skills in between trips to the range? Are you dry firing on a regular basis? Do you need some motivation to keep you active? If you have a Mantis X system, we created a group for the club so you can track how you are doing compared to other club members. If you have a Mantis X you know that it works for dry fire, live fire or even airsoft, it even works with archery. The group will have set goals every week for either number of shots fired or the average score of your shots. #### **UPCOMING CLASSES:**

NRA Instructor Courses We have completed the instructor classes and now have 4 new pistol instructors, 3 shotgun instructors and 2 rifle instructors at the club. Congratulations to all of them. The next round of instructor classes will start late fall or wintertime frame.

NRA RSO Course - This is the full-length NRA class required for anyone wishing to become an RSO.

Saturday July 10th from 8 AM to 6 PM - Cost \$80 for club members (Plus an additional \$35 to the NRA for certification)

San Diego County CCW Courses - These are run when requested by club members as soon as I can fit it in the schedule. Initial classes are 8 hours long and cost \$100 for club members, renewal classes are 4 hours long and cost \$50 for club members. When contacting me make sure you mention you are Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club members, or I will tell you no.

## **Trap Machines**

## YOUTH TRAP SHOOTING PROGRAM

For those of you who may not know, especially new members, the Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club has a program designed specifically to introduce youth shooters, ages 10 through 17, to the shotgun shooting sport of Trap.

Shoots are scheduled on the  $2^{nd}$  and  $4^{th}$  Saturdays of each month, unless preempted by another event, with registration between 11:30 am and 12:00 pm. A safety briefing runs from noon to 12:30 pm with shooting immediately following. The shoot is over by 4:00 pm.

The cost of each shoot is \$10.00 which covers the cost of the clay targets. The club furnishes ammo, provided through an NRA Foundation Grant, and 12/20-gauge shotguns if shooters do not have their own.

Sue Johnson is the shoot master for the event and has the assistance of NRA Certified Shot Gun Instructors, very capable and experienced members and Range Safety Officers. The shoot is comprised of two rounds of straight trap and a round of doubles. Brand new shooters shoot by themselves until their instructor/mentor determines the shooter is ready to join the more experienced shooters.

The shoot is open to the public and because the shooters are minors, parents/legal guardians must attend with their youth.

#### San Diego County Wildlife Federation:

Paul Dugas reported. He is the club's liaison for the Federation. We didn't have a meeting last night so I don't have anything to report other than everybody should have received an email from the club regarding the new gun ammo tax legislation. I would encourage everybody to call your elected representatives.

#### **Environmental:**

Frank Valdez reported. We are moving along slowly. For the last three weeks I have been working at March Air Force Base getting those people ready for inspection. We went through it and what I learned from the people in Riverside I didn't care for the way they did it. What they want us to do, what they are pushing for are bullet traps. They are very expensive something like \$350.00 dollars a foot. So that's Riverside County and that's a military base whether that translates to the same thing in San Diego County is yet to be determined. So there's a move a foot among the major outdoor ranges in San Diego County for us to get together and meet and talk about our respective ranges and then from there decide whether we want to go to the County proactively or wait for them to come to one of us for an inspection.

#### Long Range Planning

Lorrie reported. We need to get some stencils and paint and start working on the signs that are on the fence going around the club. The signs are all faded out and you can't see them. At some point we could have an issue with that, so we need to work on that. We need two wash stations one at the battery shack and one outside the signup shack. So, if you blow yourself up in the battery shack you are going to want to have some water to get the acid out of your eyes. We have a quote for the electrical part of the campground. We've been talking about rewiring the campground because it's an electrical nightmare. Bob from Chula Vista Electric is going to give us the parts and equipment wholesale and we must supply the labor. The parts for the parts for the master panel, the parts to

run an outlet down by the new office trailer so we can run the air conditioning for the rest of that. But we will be responsible for the labor, for the trenching. I'm sure we'll dig up some water pipes that we don't want. We have several electricians in the group we know Mike McCullough is one of them. There are a number of other electricians in the group we will need to call on to do the assembly. The Board decided to put it off until January when our Loan payments are up in March of next year. We had a quote for rocks for 268.00 for a pallet of bags and if you buy two pallets you get free freight.
