Summary February 15, 2022 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board approved 8 new members. VP Lorrie Smith reported that she and Board Member Wendell Trent had completed installation of the wheelchair lift adjacent to the new trailer. That venue is now wheelchair accessible so all members can come to meetings and attend training classes there. The Board is convening a new committee to investigate greater use of the wild apricot software platform in the future. The goal is to bring Club operations more into the 21st Century. This includes the possibility of accepting credit card payments for membership and match fees, better and more consistent event signups, and better reporting of match scores. Membership Chair Tom Bledsoe will chair this committee. The Board approved restarting the .22 Rimfire match after a 2-year hiatus. Matches will be held on the 2nd Saturday of each month, start at 9:00 am, and will be free to members. Non-members will pay a \$5.00 gate fee. Club member R.J. Aguirre invites members to dust off those .22s and come to the first match on March 12.

YOUTH TRAP SHOOTING PROGRAM

For those of you who may not know, especially new members, the Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club has a program designed specifically to introduce youth shooters, ages 10 through 17, to the shotgun shooting sport of Trap.

Shoots are scheduled on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of each month, unless preempted by another event, with registration between 11:30 am and 12:00 pm. A safety briefing runs from noon to 12:30 pm with shooting immediately following. The shoot is over by 4:00 pm.

The cost of each shoot is \$10.00 which covers the cost of the clay targets. The club furnishes ammo, provided through an NRA Foundation Grant, and 12/20-gauge shotguns if shooters do not have their own.

Sue Johnson is the shoot master for the event and has the assistance of NRA Certified Shot Gun Instructors, very capable and experienced members, and Range Safety Officers. The shoot is comprised of two rounds of straight trap and a round of doubles. Brand new shooters shoot by themselves until their instructor/mentor determines the shooter is ready to join the more experienced shooters.

The shoot is open to the public and because the shooters are minors, parents/legal guardians must attend with their youth.

Unfortunately, there have a few incidents where tempers flared out one of our events. The situations were handled correctly at the time by people at the events, and the club board of directors has taken the appropriate action where necessary, but I think we should all take a look at ourselves and what we are doing. I believe competitions are great, and it's good to be passionate about what you are doing, but you cannot let that passion go too far.

Our sport involves the use of firearms that can easily cause death or serious bodily harm. Because of that we all need to make sure we keep our emotions in check and treat each other with dignity and respect. A little jovial razzing is a good thing and makes the competitions more fun for a lot of people. Don't let your passion or excitement get to the point where you are making personal attacks against others at the range, either physically or verbally. If you feel yourself getting that upset it is time to unload your firearm, pack it up and take a seat or leave the range. If you are not emotionally mature enough to do that you seriously need to re-evaluate your participation in the shooting sports. If you cannot handle yourself in accordance with acceptable standards you will be asked to leave the range that day and, depending on the circumstances, you could lose your club membership.

I think all of that could be boiled down to the Golden Rule: Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

As always all of our RSOs and Shootmasters deserve to be recognized for the work they do to keep us safe and to provide a wide

variety of times and events for us to shoot. Please make sure you thank them the next time you come to the range. As you know they are all volunteering their time to allow you the opportunity to have fun. Just a reminder for everyone about the firearms safety rules:

ALWAYS KEEP THE MUZZLE POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION-IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWN RANGE IT IS NOT A SAFE DIRECTION

ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO SH-YOU SHOULD NOT BE READY TO SHOOT IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWNRANGE

ALWAYS KEEP THE GUN UNLOADED UNTIL READY TO USE-YOU SHOULD NOT BE READY TO USE YOUR GUN IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWNRANGE.

Situation at the Range?

ATV Usage on the Range

ATV's must be used in a responsible manner on the range. The intent of allowing them on the range is to enable access for those with physical limitations.

The range IS NOT for!

Range Phone

The range phone is for business or emergencies only! Because of the type of service, the club has to pay a toll for some calls that would normally be free on your home phone.

If you need to make a personal call, use your cell or borrow one.
