# Summary July 19, 2022 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board approved 10 new members into the Club. Some of them had full heads of dark colored hair! If you meet them on the range, be sure to greet them. The Board approved the formation of a charitable foundation to be affiliated with the Club. Once in place, members and others will be able to make tax deductible donations to the foundation. The foundation, in turn, will be able to make donations to the Club to support the Club's mission of firearms safety training and encouragement to new shooters. Look for more information toward the end of 2022.

The July archery course was very successful, with many members participating. The Board voted to approve setting a full 28 station course for the remainder of July and most of August. To help the Club continue to have targets in good, shoot able condition, a \$5.00 donation will be requested of all shooters to help purchase new targets and inserts as needed. Shootmaster Louie Tevis has committed to have a full 3-D 'Hunt the Trail' shoot on Saturday October 8, 2022.

Director Paul Dugas asked the Board to consider having

the Club obtain a California Ammo Vendor License. The Board members had many questions and the topic will be considered again in the near future.

The Board approved conversion of the trap field lights to LEDs. The 'cold range' flashers on the rifle range will be converted from red to amber/yellow to be more consistent with our flag system.

Former Range Chair Andy Kyne has volunteered to fill that position again. Be sure to thank him, and to ask what projects he needs help with – we have a lot of work to do.

# YOUTH TRAP SHOOTING PROGRAM Sue Johnson

For those of you who may not know, especially new members, the Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club has a program designed specifically to introduce youth shooters, ages 10 through 17, to the shotgun shooting sport of Trap.

Shoots are scheduled on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturdays of each month, unless preempted by another event, with registration between 11:30 am and 12:00 pm. A safety briefing runs from noon to 12:30 pm with shooting immediately following. The shoot is over by 4:00 pm.

The cost of each shoot is \$10.00 which covers the cost of the clay targets. The club furnishes ammo, provided through an NRA Foundation Grant, and 12/20-gauge shotguns if shooters do not have their own.

Sue Johnson is the shoot master for the event and has the assistance of NRA Certified Shot Gun Instructors, very capable and experienced members, and Range Safety Officers. The shoot is comprised of two rounds of straight trap and a round of doubles. Brand new shooters shoot by themselves until their instructor/mentor determines the shooter is ready to join the more experienced shooters.

The shoot is open to the public and because the shooters are minors, parents/legal guardians must attend with their youth.

# ENVIRONMENTAL TRAINING CORNER

California Proposition 65 identifies substances as potentially hazardous to human health. Compounds of lead, gun cleaning solvents, other residual items fall in this category. Members are encouraged to follow good hygiene practices when on the range. This should include washing your hands prior to eating, drinking, or getting into your vehicle. This includes not eating or drinking on or near the firing line of any of the ranges. This may also include continuing your good hygiene when you get home from an outing to the range.

# UPCOMING TRAINING AT LEMON GROVE ROD AND GUN CLUB

#### Shooters,

- I've had to back off the training for a while, but things are lining up for me to hit it hard and heavy again starting in September.
- While I have been out of the picture Stan has been plugging away with his amazing Defensive Handgun classes on Friday nights, if you haven't been to one yet what are you waiting for?
- Sue and her team have also been doing a great job with the Youth Shotgun program. If you have kids that want to get into the shooting sports this is an amazing way to get started.
- We also had another Stop the Bleed class, this time taught by the Head RN at Sharp Memorial Trauma Department. We are setting this up as a recurring class so everyone can attend.
- September will have a CCW class and an RSO course. October will have a Stop the Bleed class and we will be starting the 3 class pipelines required for each instructor certification: Basic Rifle, Basic Pistol and Basic Shotgun. We are also going to squeeze in a Image Based Decisional Drills class and an OC Spray (Pepper Spray) class.
- These classes are set up for you to get the training you want / deserve, take advantage when you can. Let us know if there is any other training you would like to have at the range. The Phil Kliner seminar is a direct result of your inputs.

# Defensive Handgun 2nd and 4th Friday every month from 5-9

- These live fire classes are excellent for getting practice using your firearm in a defensive scenario. The 2nd Friday is a beginner level class, the 4th Friday is a little more advanced. You MUST attend a beginner class before you will be allowed to attend the more advanced class.

Biomechanics of movement and the neuroscience of the decisional process and training methodologies will be explored. If you shoot competitively or carry a pistol for personal protection you will benefit from this class.

# **RSO Safety Corner**

Just a reminder for everyone about the firearms safety rules: ALWAYS KEEP THE MUZZLE POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION-IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWN RANGE IT IS NOT A SAFE DIRECTION

ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO SHOOT-YOU SHOULD NOT BE READY TO SHOOT IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWNRANGE

ALWAYS KEEP THE GUN UNLOADED UNTIL READY TO USE-YOU SHOULD NOT BE READY TO USE YOUR GUN IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWNRANGE.

Contact a board member if there are any situations that effect range operations. For example, a recent homicide investigation resulted in Sycuan Truck Trail being closed so there was no access to the range.
