The "Board of Directors," who are they; what do they do. There are 14 members of the Club's Board of Directors: President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary (these four comprise the Executive Board), 5 At-Large Directors. These first nine are elected Board members. Parliamentarian, Membership Chair, Range Chair, Sergeant-At-Arms are appointed positions that serve at the pleasure of the President and the elected Board. There is also a Board position for the Past President. However, since we currently don't have a Past President (you keep re-electing me), there is a sixth Director At-Large. Elected Board Members serve two-year terms, with half up for re-election in even years and half in odd years. Current Board members have been Club members for 2-24 years. They represent all the shooting disciplines currently offered by the Club.

The Board manages the affairs of the Club, with the primary goal of fulfilling the Club's purpose as stated in the Articles of Incorporation – "...the encouragement of organized rifle, pistol, and shotgun shooting with a view toward better knowledge of the safe handling and proper care of firearms, as well as improved marksmanship." This includes setting policies, adapting to new challenges, maintenance, managing the Club's finances, and personnel matters. The Board takes this responsibility seriously and works to make the Club better for the members. Having worked with a number of different Board members throughout my 10 years as President, I can tell you no one person's ideas dominate the Board's actions; all decisions are made with careful discussion, and where possible input from the members.

The object of this organization shall be the encouragement of organized rifle, shotgun and pistol shooting with a view toward a better knowledge of the safe handling and proper care of firearms, as well as improved marksmanship. It shall be our further objective and purpose to forward the development of those characteristics of honesty, good fellowship, self-discipline, team play and self-reliance which are essentials of good sportsmanship and the foundation of true patriotism. To foster the maintenance, development, restoration and wise use of all wildlife and other natural resources through education of the people and support of appropriate legislation.

Summary June 20, 2023 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board approved 10 new members into the Club. Be sure to greet and welcome them when you see them. Range Chair Andy Kyne reported that the campground upgrade project is nearly complete – only a small amount more of gravel is needed. (Reminder, if you intend to camp or store an RV of any sort at the Club, you need to provide vehicle and insurance information to Board member Wendell Trent. The Board approved running the annual Ginger Bass Memorial Trap Shoot in October through the new charitable foundation (East County Community Foundation), which means all or most of your shooting fees will be a tax-deductible donation. Plan on supporting this important event. The Board approved participating in a Friends of NRA raffle to support the NRA Foundation (see separate article below). The Board approved a motion to put some of the Club's money in an interest-bearing money market account to both earn extra interest and provide a reserve account for future improvements to the Club. The Board has started discussing ways to make Club membership more attractive. The goal of this effort is more retention of existing members (each year we lose 40-65 members for various reasons), as well as encouraging new members to join. Since this may result in the Board proposing changes to the Club By-Laws, be on the lookout for a call to all members to vote on proposed changes in the fall – likely during the September or October General Membership meetings.

Environmental Training Corner

Hazardous material storage at the range is restricted to items used by the Club for necessary range activities and must be stored in the locations and quantity specified as follows:

Hazardous materials (fuels) must be stored in the Gas Shed behind the upper trap field and shall be maintained appropriately labeled containers in total less than 55 gallons.

Chlorine for bactericide water treatment shall be stored in the Well Shed in total less than 5 one-gallon containers.

No hazardous materials storage is allowed in conex boxes 1, 2, 3, or the semi-trailer.

Hazardous materials used to maintain and/or repair Club facilities are allowed in conex boxes 4 and 5.

HANDGUN SPORTS AT LEMON GROVE

THE RIM FIRE MATCH

Let's admit it: handguns are harder to shoot well than long guns.

Almost all shooters have one or more handguns but do not shoot them very often. Many of us think of our handgun as a home defense firearm.

A typical handgun outing is taking some shots at a stationary target while taking whatever time is necessary to align the sights. This manner of practice does not prepare the shooter sufficiently for a home defense scenario, in my opinion.

The only way to learn to operate a handgun in a variety of challenges is to practice those challenges. The Club offers three handgun matches a month which offer a variety of shooting challenges for those having an interest in improving their handgun skills. These Matches are free to members.

It takes a lot of courage for a new shooter to attend their first handgun match. I have heard people say they are afraid they will not be good enough, may not have the "correct" equipment or do not want to shoot with people watching them. Keep in mind that every shooter at the handgun match has had a first day at a match and realizes that the shooting sports only survive because new people are always entering the sport.

A good way to dispense with the normal fears and misgivings is to attend a match as an observer. This gives you a chance to see what is required to participate, observe and learn from the other shooters, and help with the operation of the match by things like target taping and/or score keeping.

In order to participate in one or more of these matches the shooter must be at least at the advanced beginner stage, i.e., able to load and unload their firearm without assistance, be familiar with all of the operating procedures of the firearm such as use of the safety and clearing procedures, drawing from the holster in a safe manner and always remembering to keep the firearm pointed in a safe direction (typically at the berm). Safe gun handling is the overriding requirement at these matches.

The Match that is designed as the entry level to the handgun sports is the Rim Fire Match. This Match is shot from the standing position beginning at the low-ready with a .22 rimfire pistol, revolver, or rifle. The Match description and procedures are described on the Club website at https://lgrgc.com/rimfire The Match requirements are simple as no hot reloads are required and there is no change of shooting position required. The emphasis of this match is target acquisition and engagement in a timed environment.

You will need to bring around 200 rim fire rounds as this is a high volume/ high fun match. Give it a try; you will be glad you did.


