Safety issues are occurring with increasing frequency. Fortunately, there have not yet been negative consequences. Take time to refresh your safety thinking – complacency is not our friend. Safety is no accident – think about the double meaning of this statement.

The Club issues gate cards to members so they can enter/exit Club property at their convenience. The gate is locked open only during events that are open to the public. There have been several occurrences lately of non-members piggybacking entry when members come in the gate. If you see someone waiting at the closed gate when you arrive, check to see why they want to come in. If they are a guest of a member, that member must be the person who lets their guest enter the range. This is important accountability for the Club's property and may have insurance consequences. Let's be sure we protect what we have.

Environmental Training Corner

It is the Club environmental policy that all Club members and their guests are responsible to take their spent brass and shotgun shells with them when they leave the range. Disposal of spent brass and shotgun shells in the Club's solid waste containers (range barrels or large dumpsters) is prohibited. The only exception is .22 brass casings. All .22 brass shall be picked up off the ground and put into the small blue buckets located throughout the range. The Club will recycle the .22 brass to generate income to help with buying new target materials. Defective ammo – 'duds' – must be either removed from the range by the member or placed in one of the small black buckets labelled for dud disposal.

Summary September 19, 2023 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board approved applications for 16 new Club members. Look for the new faces Tom Bledsoe, Membership Chair, said we will be approaching our current membership cap (350 Regular + Military members) by the end of the year. Alan Cole reported that his work crew completed the new playground structure and that it would be open for use after we get the sand base placed around it. Club member Jon Hale has graciously agreed to donate the concrete needed to complete the handicap ramp in front of the sign-in shed. The work will occur during the week of September 25. The Board has a subcommittee fine tuning the wording for the proposed changes in membership requirements. We expect to notify all members of the proposed changes after the October Board meeting, with members voting whether to approve the proposed changes at the December Membership meeting. Be on the lookout for an email on this important topic in mid-October.

The Board approved the purchase of a replacement for the upper trap machine which has been increasingly needing repairs. The new machine should be installed in late October – early November. The Board approved working with CRPA to host one of their RangeCon events in May 2024. RangeCon is a gathering of local range operators and other interested parties to talk about legislation and local issues that affect ranges. More information will be available as the date approaches.

Registration is 11:30-12:00, Safety briefing is 12:00-12:30, Shooting starts at 12:30 until done (before 4:00pm).

First time shooters will have 1 on 1 coaching on the lower trap field and experienced shooters will shoot on the upper trap field.

The shoot is open to the public and because the shooters are minors, parents/legal guardians must attend with their youth.
