Summary November 21, 2023 Board of Directors Meeting

The Board approved 5 new members. The Board also approved increasing the cap on Regular and Military Members from 350 to 450. Treasurer Debby Ludwig presented a draft of accounting procedures for the Club, which was approved with minor additions. This includes the new Match Accounting Form for use by all Shootmasters. Sporting Clays range rentals were approved for March 15, April 12, May 10, and October 11 (all Fridays). The Board approved purchasing and installation of two more large LED lights for the trap ranges. The Board approved the concept of having a "law enforcement appreciation day on Sunday June 9. Board member Craig Knox will be in charge of this activity. Craig is going to be contacting members to help run each of the ranges that day.

The Board approved a detailed plan by Craig Knox for the construction of permanent restrooms on the range, near where the row of port-potties sits now. The plan includes four toilets, two each for men and women, as well as a sink on each side. This project is expected to cost approximately \$35,000. As this exceeds the Board's spending authority, the Board requests that Club members come to the January 2, 2024, General Membership Meeting for a discussion of the project, and a vote on whether to approve the expenditure. A separate invitation will be sent to all members for this meeting.

Environmental Training Corner

Access to Lemon Grove Rod & Gun Club is restricted to members and their guests whenever the front gate is closed. Limiting access to members ensures that range safety is maintained and lessens the likelihood of unauthorized dumping on Club property. Remember to check with people waiting outside the gate when you arrive to be sure they are members. If they are guests of another member, either wait at the gate until that member arrives, or ask the person (s) waiting to check if the member who invited them has already arrived. Another option would be to ask the non-member to wait until the inviting member arrives at the range

We had a short range match this month. There was an empty 20 ga shotgun shell hanging at 10 yards; a 3-inch diameter turkey head silhouette at 25 yards; and a 4-inch steel swinger set at 50 yards. High score was 12 out of 18 possible points. For the December 17 match, we will shoot black powder pistols. Single shot flintlock and percussion pistols, or cap-and-ball revolvers are all welcome. Black powder cartridge revolvers can shoot but will be scored separately. Let me know if you want to come to try any of the above so I can bring extra supplies for you. This is always a fun match!



Possible Club by Law Change Jerry Shiller

The Board of Directors is recommending the creation of two new membership classes. This will require changes to the Club By-Laws as that document is where membership classes are defined. By-Laws changes must be approved by a majority of the members of the Club present at a General Members meeting. The Board is required to give members at least 30 days' notice when scheduling such a vote. To be in compliance, the vote on the Board proposal included below will occur at the members meeting scheduled for Tuesday December 5, 2023, 6:30 pm in the Dave Reed Training Center trailer.

The proposed new membership classes are shown below with information given regarding the qualifications for each new class. Unless changed at the meeting by the members, the text presented below will become part of the Club By-Laws

<u>DAILY USE MEMBERSHIP – SCHEDULED EVENTS</u> <u>OPEN TO THE PUBLIC</u>

Includes use of one or more of the Club's ranges for one calendar day

Does not include voting privileges.

Not eligible to run for elected office.

Not eligible for 10%-er or other Club awards

Non-monetary assessment not required.

NRA membership not required.

May not sign-up for RSO shifts

Not eligible to be a Shootmaster

Not eligible to use the Club campground.

Not eligible to bring a guest onto Club property.

Payment must be made the day of range use; no prepayments allowed.

FAMILY MEMBERSHIP

Includes two related Adults (age 18 or older), plus up to 5 children under the age of 18

One Adult must be eligible to be a Regular, Senior, Gold, or Military member and satisfy all of the membership requirements current at the time of joining

For renewal of Family Membership, the eligible Adult must continue to satisfy all of the then current membership requirements to be a Regular, Senior, Gold, or Military member.

One vote per Family Membership on items brought before the general membership, including election of officers, By-Laws changes, or other matters that may require voting.

Members of a family unit are eligible individually to earn Club awards if they meet the award qualifications.

No more than one family member may concurrently hold an elected or appointed Club office.

The Board is recommending the creation of a Family Membership class as a means to encourage entire families to become Club members without the separate paperwork and fees currently required for Junior or Social members. This is in keeping with the Club's goal of having more members of the community interested and participating in the shooting sports. Social and Junior membership classes will still exist if this proposal is approved. Approval of this proposal will not preclude multiple Adults from the same household having separate Regular, Senior, Gold, or Military memberships.

The Board is recommending creation of a Daily Membership class to improve tracking of income for the Club. If this membership class is approved, the current gate fee will be replaced by the Daily Member fee. The current policy for Members bringing guests to the Club will be unchanged.

All questions will be answered at the meeting on December 5. That way all members interested in voting will have access to the same information. If you are unable to attend the December meeting, you may register a proxy vote with me prior to the start of the meeting.

I hope many members will attend the meeting to participate in the work of the Club. Whether the Board proposal is approved or not will depend on how the majority of members who are present at the meeting in December vote.

Defensive Handgun Clinic - 2nd and 4th Friday of every month

Come join us for an instructor-driven clinic to develop good defensive handgun skills and be challenged by ever-changing defensive scenarios. Members and member-accompanied guests 11 years and older are welcome to attend to learn defensive handgun fundamentals. Minors 11-15 must be always accompanied by a non-shooting adult while on the range unless approved by Shootmaster. We will have available instruction on handgun safety, defensive handgun practice, drawing from the holster, and rapid target engagement at distances from close contact to 45 feet.

If you feel intimidated, please join us on the 2nd Friday of the month session where in one night you will become a confident shooter! For first-time shooters or those who have never had formal handgun training, this class teaches you the basics of grip, stance, sight alignment and trigger control.

The second clinic of the month is held on the 4th Friday of the month. For those who have taken the Beginner Handgun class and have been approved by the Shootmaster, this clinic is designed to hone your skills to become a proficient, confident shooter. The class is limited only by the skills of who shows up, and can involve shooting while moving, multiple target acquisition, one-handed malfunction clearances and low-light shooting. No beginners allowed.

The Frontsight training methods will be used to guide you comfortably and safely through your training. If you have ever heard of Frontsight training in Nevada but could not afford to go, this clinic will help you get prepared for this great training.

Stan Luhr, an NRA RSO, pistol instructor, and 3-time Frontsight Distinguished graduate is your Shootmaster. The course is free for members and \$10 for guests. Advanced registration is required as there will be a limited number of openings for each clinic. If you are a Frontsight graduate and want to help, please join us. CCW SKILLS CHECK CLINIC - 3rd Sunday of every month

This clinic uses practical "real-life" scenario-based stages, and drill-oriented EDC skill building, in escalating degree difficulty "Modules", thematically built upon the AVOID EVADE DEFEND concepts of smart EDC.

Pre-registration is REQUIRED due to the scenario and drill staging set-ups and associated materials required for participants in the clinics. THESE CLINICS ARE LIMITED TO THE FIRST 17 REGISTRANTS. The Shoot Master for CCW Skills Check Clinic; Blake Beckcom, is reachable via email a blknatr@yahoo.

com and by phone at 619 806 1827 to register. Be sure to look for this clinic and future clinics on the Team Up Calendar.

Requirements: Pre-registration with the clinic Shoot Master is required. A current CA, valid CCW license, must be presented to attend CCW SCC. The firearm used must be on the license. Firearm and license check are mandatory, prestart to participate. An appropriate sturdy gun belt with IWB holster, preferably Kydex and two magazines will be needed. All draw work is from "on body" concealed.

Cost per event per member \$5 to cover paper, or USPSA targets; paint when steel targets are utilized, tape, and participant clipboards with pencils/pens for your record keeping. Non-member guests, including prospects, not allowed. Not open to the public. CCW SCC is once a month on Sunday afternoon, 2pm to 6pm, such that we are done/clean/stored and off range before 6pm.

ALL PARTICIPANTS MUST BE IN THE PIT AT 1:45. SAFETY BRIEF IS AT 2PM. IF YOU ARE LATE, YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PARTICIPATE.

New participant orientation, firearm and license check begins at 1:45pm SHARP to align safety protocols and assess dry fire draw skill and safe gun handling skill from concealed, culminating in an abbreviated basic marksmanship live fire from conceal. If a club member is new to CCW SCC and shows up late missing or cutting the orientation/safety check initial time, that club member will not be able to participate. The course of fire for all participants, both new and returning, will generally be from 2:15 pm to 6pm, such that we are done/clean/stored, and off range before 6pm. Round count variable. Estimate one hundred plus per event.

Methodology: Use of standards will be employed, with records and scores that are participant kept, enabling recognizable, provable data-based improvement over time. Repeatable standards such as the Wizard Drill; Wilson 5x5, Active Self Protection 10 Round Skill Check, Baseline Skill Assessment, El Presidente, The Dicken Deck, and the FBI Pistol Qualification Course and others, will be employed throughout a given year.

Each monthly CCW SCC Module will be preprogrammed similarly, yet differently in advance, with varying practical real life CCW scenarios, employing active use of "verbal commands" aimed at would be threats, maximizing heart rate response. A "standards" drill component, within each clinic module will be executed.

Movement and shot timers will be employed. Paper alone, steel alone or combinations thereof will be used at varying distances, utilizing the Pistol Pit to its fullest.

The Inner Game of Shooting is not an instructor certification course, but we do require your level of shooting to be intermediate

- advanced. It is a 2-day program covering physiological, psychological, and technical aspects of YOUR development. Self-coaching requires a multi-discipline approach applying diagnostic skills, cognitive interviewing, understanding the decisional process, predictive analysis, and adapting to YOUR unique needs. Identifying and understanding YOUR learning style and more importantly, YOUR blind spots.

Performing at our highest level should be the goal of all shooters. Unfortunately, the modern methods of coaching have not been applied to shooting in a cohesive and unified manner which leads to lots of wasted time and effort.

In this class we will explore the three modes of training, technical (accuracy and precision), speed (speed and efficiency), and performance (neuroscience triggers), allowing the athlete to understand the requirements of each aspect of training.

Development of a plan for practice, understanding how to measure and refine for continued improvement, and how to approach qualifiers, classifiers, test, matches, or personal protection.

The mental game is the most important part of high-level performance, consisting of the technical/physical, psychological, and physiological. Understanding how to modulate and capitalize on these states is what will allow the shooter to perform in a accurate, consistent, efficient, and disciplined manner.

Neuroscience has made great strides in recognizing the precursor to high level performance, and these can be performed in the moments allowing the athlete to use all their available skill while making timely decisions which ultimately lead to success.

Shooting is more than a technical methodology, it requires quick processing, predictive decisions, and recognition primed decision making. You can make great progress and perform at your highest level by training appropriately. This is the missing piece, and the most important.
