### **President's Message** Jerry Shiller, President

Club elections will be held during the April General Membership meeting. This is the members' chance to control who is running the Club. This year there are three Director positions up for election/re-election. Directors help the President with decisions on Club business matters. All three current Directors (Frank Valdez, Bill Barth, and Paul Lichtenstein) have expressed their willingness to continue if re-elected. Treasurer Debra Ludwig and Sergeant-At-Arms Jim Williams are also up for election/re-election. Both have indicated a willingness to stay for another term. The Treasurer keeps the financial records for the Club, including receiving incoming money and paying bills. Sounds simple enough, but it isn't really. The Sergeant-At-Arms position requires a variety of skills - keeping attendance records and sign-ins for all meetings, manage clay distribution to members, keeping an inventory of keys and locks, and a list of who can get which key, distributing Club materials to members, and other tasks.

The Club also has several appointed positions, most of whom are appointed by the sitting President. These (with the current member serving) include Range Chair (Andy Kyne), Membership Chair (Tom Bledsoe), Webmaster (Dan Stroud), Chief Range Safety Officer – CRSO (Dave Reed), Newsletter Editor (Phyllis Hansen), Work Party Cooking Coordination (Phyllis Hansen), Security Cameras (Jerry Vaughn), RSO Hours Manager (Jessica Steeple), Hospitality (Sarah Jones), Club Merchandise (Susan Vandendriesse), Parliamentarian (vacant), San Diego County Wildlife Federation (vacant). Anyone interested in either of the last two positions should contact President Jerry Shiller.

The Vice President is also up for re-election this year. Current Vice President, Lorrie Smith, has decided she needs to focus on other things, and will be stepping down as Club VP. Lorrie was elected as V.P. in 2016 after having been a Director and Club Secretary. She has been an asset to the Board both because of her knowledge of the shooting community in Southern California, and her experience running several businesses. I have valued her counsel on many occasions. Lorrie says she is not leaving the Club and will still be available to help, especially with welding. Candidates for VP should have familiarity with a variety of Club activities and be of an independent mind.

# Summary February 20, 2024

The Board approved one new member who appeared at the meeting. The Board approved ending waste pickup service with Republic Services and switching to Waste Management, who has quoted better rates for our trash and recycling services. Distribution of clay targets to members is still limited to appointments with Jim Williams. We had a problem with boxes of clays being signed out, but no money getting turned in to the Treasurer. Also, clays were being taken from storage reserved for Shootmasters to use in their events. The Board committee exploring options to the current requirement for all Club members to maintain membership in the NRA is still exploring options. They promised a report at the March Board meeting.

Annual Club elections will be held during the April General Membership meeting on Tuesday April 2. Up for election this year are Directors Frank Valdez, Paul Lichtenstein, and Bill Barth, Treasurer Debbie Ludwig, Sergeant-At-Arms Jim Williams, and Vice President Lorrie Smith. All except Lorrie Smith have expressed their willingness to continue on the Board if re-elected by the membership. Lorrie feels that it is time for her to retire from the Board and focus more on personal activities. Presidential appointees Range Chair Andy Kyne and Membership Chair Tom Bledsoe have expressed their willingness to continue as well. A REMINDER TO ALL CLUB MEMBERS - NOBODY IS ALLOWED TO SHOOT WITHOUT AN RSO PRESENT AND THE RANGE TIME SCHEDULED ON THE CLUB CALENDAR A MINIMUM OF 24 HOURS IN ADVANCE. THIS MEANS THAT RSO'S CANNOT JUST SHOW UP AND SHOOT. ANYONE CAUGHT VIOLATING THIS WILL LOSE THEIR RSO PRIVILEGES AND WILL NEED TO SPEAK TO THE BOARD TO DETERMINE ANY FOLLOW-ON ACTIONS FOR VIOLATING THE RULES LISTED IN THE SOP.

Firearms Safety Rules that must be always followed:

ALWAYS KEEP THE MUZZLE POINTED IN A SAFE DIRECTION-IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWN RANGE IT IS NOT A SAFE DIRECTION - UP IS NOT SAFE AT OUR RANGE!

ALWAYS KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER UNTIL YOU ARE READY TO SHOOT YOU SHOULD NOT BE READY TO SHOOT IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWNRANGE

ALWAYS KEEP THE GUN UNLOADED UNTIL READY TO USE - YOU SHOULD NOT BE READY TO USE YOUR GUN IF THERE ARE PEOPLE DOWNRANGE.

Club members have priority for a limited time, after that they are open to the public, so don't delay or you risk not getting in.

Here is our current training schedule:

# Defensive Handgun Clinic - 2nd and 4th Friday of every month

Come join us for an instructor-driven clinic to develop good defensive handgun skills and be challenged by everchanging defensive scenarios. Members and memberaccompanied guests 11 years and older are welcome to attend to learn defensive handgun fundamentals. Minors 11-15 must be always accompanied by a non-shooting adult while on the range unless approved by Shootmaster. We will have available instruction on handgun safety, defensive handgun practice, drawing from the holster, and rapid target engagement at distances from close contact to 45 feet.

If you feel intimidated, please join us on the 2nd Friday of the month session where in one night you will become a confident shooter! For first-time shooters or those who have never had formal handgun training, this class teaches you the basics of grip, stance, sight alignment and trigger control.

The second clinic of the month is held on the 4th Friday of the month. For those who have taken the Beginner Handgun class and have been approved by the Shootmaster, this clinic is designed to hone your skills to become a proficient, confident shooter. The class is limited only by the skills of who shows up, and can involve shooting while moving, multiple target acquisition, one-handed malfunction clearances and low-light shooting. No beginners allowed.

The Frontsight training methods will be used to guide you comfortably and safely through your training. If you have ever heard of Frontsight training in Nevada but could not afford to go, this clinic will help you get prepared for this great training.

Stan Luhr, an NRA RSO, pistol instructor, and 3-time Frontsight Distinguished graduate is your Shootmaster. The course is free for members and \$10 for guests. Advanced registration is required as there will be a limited number of openings for each clinic. If you are a Frontsight graduate and want to help, please join us. # CCW SKILLS CHECK CLINIC - 3rd Sunday of every month

This clinic will use practical "real-life" scenario-based stages, and drill-oriented EDC skill building modules, thematically built upon the **AVOID EVADE DEFEN** concepts of smart EDC.

**Pre-registration with the clinic Shoot Master is required.** A current CA, valid CCW license, must be presented to attend **CCW SCC**. The firearm used must be on the license. Firearm and license check are mandatory, prestart to participate. An appropriate sturdy gun belt with IWB holster, preferably Kydex and two magazines will be needed. All draw work is from concealed Appendix Inside Waist Band. No other carry positions are allowed. Round count variable. Estimate one hundred plus per event.

Cost per event per member \$15. Non-member guests, including prospects, not allowed. Not open to the public.

New participant orientation, firearm and license check begins at 12:30 pm SHARP to align safety protocols and assess dry fire draw skill and safe gun handling skill from concealed, culminating in an abbreviated basic marksmanship live fire from concealed. You must pass the Basic Standard timed draw to first shot at 3 yards, USPCA A Zone hit, in less than 2.25 seconds to qualify for the Clinic. The remaining time of the first hour will be to set the range for that specific clinics course(s) of fire, for the Module. Prior club member participants begin the clinic thereafter, with a Safety Brief at 1:45 pm.If you are late for the New Participant Orientation or to the 1:45 Safety Brief or arrive without being pre-registered for the Clinic you will be unable to participate.

Each monthly **CCW SCC Module** will be preprogrammed similarly, yet differently in advance, with varying practical real life CCW scenarios and drills. Pre-registration is REQUIRED due to the scenario and drill staging set-ups and associated materials required for participants in the clinics. Add a gun to permit - 4 PM to 4:30 PM - \$10 for LGRGC Members, \$20 for non-members

Class starts in the training trailer, for adding gun to permit you can meet us in the pistol pit.

You will need:

Note taking material - Can be digital

Pen / Pencil for written test

Lunch/snacks - we will not have time to leave the range for lunch

Non-alcoholic beverages - stay hydrated

Range gear: Eye and ear protection, brimmed hat, closed toed shoes.

Money for class (cash or check)

For primary gun (the one you want to shoot during training portion of class) you will need:

Holster (no shoulder holsters, behind the back holsters or SERPA type holster that require you to use your trigger finger to release the locking mechanism so you can draw your firearm: all of these are dangerous to the shooter and / or others on the firing line) We will discuss at length in class if you have any questions.

3-5 magazines - All but one should be fully loaded when arriving at range. One UNLOADED magazine will be used in the classroom. NO LIVE AMMUNITION IN THE CLASSROOM.

130 rounds of ammunition (on the range - NOT in the classroom

For any other guns you want added to your permit you will need (no additional cost for those attending class):

15 rounds of ammunition loaded into magazines, 15 additional rounds of ammunition

For any firearm class you ever attend you should bring:

Eyes/Ears/Brimmed Hat

Lubrication for your gun

Batteries for optics

Tools for quick repairs - Small screwdrivers/punches/pliers/etc.

A positive attitude and an inquisitive mind.

The shooting is not the focus of a CCW class, it should just be a demonstration of your ability to safely use a firearm on a perfect day in perfect weather while under little to no stress - your self defense situation will not resemble that in the least - I strongly urge you to train with your firearm much more than the class requires.

The focus of the course is the laws and your mind-set while carrying. You should come in with an open mind and a ton of questions. We will do our best to answer every single question you have, but many are subjective and/or gray areas. Carrying a gun requires a LOT of thinking on your part, be prepared for that. If you just want a class where you come in, listen to a lecture, take a test and leave find someone else to take it with. We are going to have a group conversation about what you can, should, must do in various situations. If you don't actively participate you are wasting your time, my time, and your classmates time.

Before you ever place a gun in your self-defense plan you need to honestly and deeply think about it. Are you capable and willing to take a human life? Under what conditions? For what reasons? Do you understand the ramifications, legal, financial, societal and personal? We will talk about these topics during the class. Those decisions are extremely personal and we don't need you to tell us your answers, but you better be able to answer them to yourself, if you aren't willing to accept all the consequences of carrying a gun - DON'T.

The Inner Game of Shooting is not an instructor certification course, but we do require your level of shooting to be intermediate - advanced. It is a 2-day program covering physiological, psychological, and technical aspects of YOUR development. Selfcoaching requires a multi-discipline approach applying diagnostic skills, cognitive interviewing, understanding the decisional process, predictive analysis, and adapting to YOUR unique needs. Identifying and understanding YOUR learning style and more importantly, YOUR blind spots.

Performing at our highest level should be the goal of all shooters. Unfortunately, the modern methods of coaching have not been applied to shooting in a cohesive and unified manner which leads to lots of wasted time and effort.

In this class we will explore the three modes of training, technical (accuracy and precision), speed (speed and efficiency), and performance (neuroscience triggers), allowing the athlete to understand the requirements of each aspect of training.

Shooting is more than a technical methodology, it requires quick processing, predictive decisions, and recognition primed decision making. You can make great progress and perform at your highest level by training appropriately. This is the missing piece, and the most important.

This course primarily focuses on the Push/Pull method of recoil control. ### BLACK POWDER Jerry Shiller

Two targets were set at 25 yards for the first one, the shooter had to land the shot within the perimeter of a horseshoe; for the second, a bowling pin was hung upside down. The third match target was a group of small duck silhouettes with some of them being "no-shoots." The match was very competitive with only 2 points separating first and second place. I hear more people saying they would like to try shooting black powder sometime. To you, I say come on out on the third Sunday afternoon of the month to try it. Upcoming matches will include splitting a playing card shooting edge-on, silhouettes at 100 and 175 yards, and a shotgun match. For next year (sounds far away, but I'm only talking about May), I want to do a 'Woods Walk' with several targets set along a trail. Shooters will have to carry all shooting supplies with them on the walk (no toolboxes allowed).

### Bylaws of Lemon Grove Rod And Gun Club A California Nonprofit Mutual Benefit Corporation

Amended 19 December, 2024

#### Article I. Names and Offices

#### Section 1.1. Corporation Title

The name of this corporation shall be "The Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club".

#### Section 1.2. Principal Office

The principal office of the Corporation for its transaction of business is located in the City of Lemon Grove and County of San Diego, California, with a current mailing address of Post Office Box 1585, Lemon Grove, California 91946-1585.

#### Section 1.3. Change of Address

The Board of Directors is hereby granted full power and authority to change the principal office of the Corporation from one location to another in the County of San Diego, California. Any such change shall be noted by the Secretary in these Bylaws, but shall not be considered an amendment of these Bylaws.

#### Article II. Members

#### Section 2.1. Classes of Membership/Qualifications.

The Corporation shall have eleven (11) classes of members as follows: Regular, Senior, Gold, Life, Honorary, Junior, Social, Military Inactive, Family and Daily. The privilege of membership in any of the classes, except daily, shall be granted, providing the applicants meet the respective requirements set forth and are accepted by a majority vote of the Executive Committee. To be approved by the Executive Committee, in addition to other requirements set forth herein, each prospective member shall appear in person before the Executive Committee, they shall subscribe to the Club Pledge, and if approved by the Executive Committee, pay the usual initiation fee and dues. Each membership, with the exception of life members, shall expire annually.

To renew membership, prior to expiration, each member shall pay the annual dues, be current upon any assessments, and, upon approval for new membership by the Executive Committee, be granted membership for the following year. Membership in this Club is not vested, is a privilege, and may be terminated, with cause, by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Executive Committee. If the Executive Committee declines renewed membership to any former member, the dues paid for the year declined will be returned to the former member.

Daily membership is granted by event shootmasters and expires at the end of day in which membership was issued.

#### Section 2.2. Club Pledge

Each prospective member and member shall subscribe to the following:

I certify that I am a citizen of the United States of America or a foreign national legally present in the United States, that I am not a member of an organization or group having as its purpose or one of its purposes the overthrow by force and violence of the Government of the United States or any of its political subdivisions; that I am legally permitted to possess and use firearms in the State of California.

#### Changes to the club's Bylaws denoted by bar in right margin

#### Section 2.14. Family Membership

- 1. Includes two related Adults (age 18 or older), plus up to 5 children under the age of 18.
- 2. One Adult must be eligible to be a Regular, Senior, Gold, or Military member and satisfy all of the membership requirements current at the time of joining.
- 3. For renewal of Family Membership, the eligible Adult must continue to satisfy all of the then current membership requirements to be a Regular, Senior, Gold, or Military member.
- 4. One vote per Family Membership on items brought before the general membership,
- 5. Members of a family unit are eligible individually to earn Club awards if they meet the award qualifications.
- 6. No more than one family member may concurrently hold an elected or appointed Club office.

#### Section 2.15 Daily Use Membership - Scheduled Events Open to the Public

- 1. Includes use of one or more of the Club's ranges for one calendar day.
- 2. Does not include voting privileges,
- 3. Not eligible to run for elected office,
- 4. Not eligible for 10%-er or other Club awards.
- 5. Non-monetary assessment not required.
- 6. NRA membership not required.
- 7. May not sign-up for RSO shifts.
- 8. Not eligible to be a Shootmaster.
- 9. Not eligible to use the Club campground.
- 10. Not eligible to bring a guest onto Club property.
- 11. Payment must be made the day of range use; no prepayments allowed.
- 12. Daily Members do not count against the Regular plus Military Membership cap.

#### Section 2.16. Guests.

No guest shall be allowed on the property unless accompanied, at all times, by a Regular, Senior, Gold or Military member. Events open to the public or Inter-Club events shall not be governed by the above guest rule.

#### Section 2.17 Membership/Application fees.


- 1. Annual dues, fees and/or assessments of any kind, payable to the Corporation by members, shall be in such amounts as shall be determined by resolution of the Executive Committee. Dues shall be payable for the first year on admission to membership and annually thereafter at such time or times as may be fixed by said Committee. A member, on learning of the amount of dues determined by the Committee, and the time or times of payment fixed by said Committee, may avoid liability for the dues by promptly resigning from membership, except where the member is, by contract or otherwise, liable for the dues.
- 2. Dues and fees, chargeable for annual membership, shall be received by the Corporation or post marked, for first class mail delivery, commencing on February 1 and before April 30 of each applicable year. Any member failing to pay the fees and dues charged for membership, by April 30, shall be dropped from the membership rolls of the Corporation. Any member who has paid their dues between February 1 and April 20 but dies during that same period will have their fees refunded to the estate.
- 3. Dues and fees, chargeable for life membership, shall be received by the Corporation or post marked, for first class mail delivery, commencing on February 1 and before April 30
