#### Parking/Shop Mobility:



• There are 151 disabled parking spaces & 145 Parent and Child parking spaces. Parking is free of charge, with no time limit. There are an additional 38 disabled & 40 Parent and Child spaces in the Tesco car park. However, this is not owned or operated by us and has a 2-hour time restriction.

#### **Facilities:**

- At Silverburn, you can find over 150 shops, restaurants and leisure facilities over one floor. There's step-free access throughout the mall and lifts to allow access from all levels of the multi-storey car park
- We have a quiet room at our bathrooms nearest the multi-story car park.
- We offer two Changing Places toilets designed for people with more complex accessibility needs. Our facilities are larger than standard accessible toilets and include equipment such as a hoist, an adult-sized changing bench, a privacy screen, a shower, and plenty of space for carers. You'll find our Changing Places toilets in two locations: at our toilets opposite JD Sports & at our Winter Garden toilets.
- We have two parent and child rooms around the mall one located near M&S and one in the Winter Garden. If you need a bit of privacy during your visit, or if you're looking for a quiet space to take a break, you'll find everything you need:
- Clean areas for nappy changing
- Quiet spaces to breastfeed
- · Sinks and facilities to warm bottles
- Comfy chairs
- A safe play space
- We have sensory toys & ear defenders available at Shop Mobility anyone can hire for free.
- The mall & retailers observe a quiet hour every

#### About Molly



Over the last few months you may have noticed that we've had an extra member in our team (and we're not talking about Ivy). Molly Shepherd has been volunteering since May, and has made a fantastic contribution to the work of I Am Me. Before she starts her new university course, we sat down to have a chat and introduce her to you all:



I am 21 and have recently finished my LLB (Batchelor of Laws) degree at Stirling University. I am about to start my Diploma in Legal Practice at Strathclyde University as I want to be a criminal prosecutor in children or family law.

I have known about I Am Me for a long time because my dad is a member of their Board, and I was also the voiceover for the UNCRC lesson, and a Keep Safe Ambassador. The charity invited me along to volunteer with the team throughout the summer, so I have been in the office every week.





I'm really interested in the work that I Am Me do, especially in relation to children's rights and their work with vulnerable people. I've always wanted to help people and do what I can to assist them. I also wanted to get a chance to work in an office environment as I have not done so before.

I've attended different kinds of meetings, created content for their online platforms, and attended quite a few events, such as one marking Disability Pride Month at ScotRail's head office and the Disability Friendly launch. I also set up their new TikTok account and created content for their socials, which you have probably seen. So lots of things – it's very different from retail work!





It's been a great experience. I've liked the independence and being trusted with tasks that I'd been delegated. I really enjoyed engaging with different people, and the materials I created, especially working on and promoting the Disability Friendly initiative, and hearing about its real life impact at Elderslie RLDS.

While there is a lot of negativity in the world, there are also lot of people wanting to engage with the work of I Am Me, to provide support and become more aware of diversity. Their work is always well received, and the team are great – so lots of thanks to them for getting me involved.





I'm still going to do as much as can from home and will be back in the office once I know my university timetable. Additionally, I will be joining the Board as a Trustee, so looking forward to continuing to support the Charity.
