Ambassadors

The Ambassador programme was launched in Renfrewshire in 2016. Since then the programme has gained wide support and is now delivered across Scotland. Ambassadors are trained on how to recognise, and report hate crimes safely within the community and in a school environment. In the past 8 years there has been a total of 1689 Ambassadors trained with;

- 889 Ambassador trained High School Pupils.
- 203 Ambassador trained PSYV (Police Scotland Youth Volunteers)
- 284 Accessible Ambassadors trained.
- 6 Other Ambassadors trained
- 240 Police Officers trained as Ambassador trainers.
- 67 others trained as Ambassador trainers.


Black History Month








Fearless Event


This guidebook will give you an overview of the resources available on the platform.

You Are Not Alone














The team have been working with young males and adult females from Polmont and young people from St. Mary's Kenmure, Good Shepherd and Renfrewshire since March to develop new exploitation resources to include in the 'You Are Not Alone' suite of lessons.

In total, the team have worked with 28 young people, 9 adult females and 17 partners to develop the resources.

The resources have been funded by Foundation Scotland, with additional videos funded by Renfrewshire Council and Reo Stakis Foundation. Due for release in January, the resources cover three main areas:



- Gangs
- Sexual Exploitation
- Radicalisation





STV recently filmed a piece with Polmont about the new resources and interviewed the team as well as some of the young people and adult females who have been involved in the development of the resources. This will air on STV in January. Keep your eyes peeled for this!

Hello everyone I have a brief update I would love to share with you all on my Autism Awareness Resource. A couple of weeks ago, Mhairi and I got a chance to meet with some fantastic P7 pupils at Dargavel Primary School in Bishopton. They had kindly invited us to come along to test out the newly developing Primary 4 to 7 Autism Awareness lesson.



They had amazing fun and were really interested in the work and progress we had put into it and asked lots of great questions. I had spoken to the P7's before the lesson explaining to them the purpose behind this project and how my experiences in life with Autism fits into the whole aim to raise awareness of it.



The feedback we had received from them has been positive especially in regard to showing interest in what I have experienced. One of the teachers we were with has been reading a book with her pupils about a person with autism before we had came, this meant that her class has already caught up with some of the things we are trying to get across with our lesson. What an amazing class!

And lastly, we have received a request from another school to visit them to test the lesson with some of their pupils. I am very excited to know what they would think of it. Watch out soon for the launch of this resource!





My Police





The team have been working in partnership with Police Scotland a set of interactive resources to support engagement with young people in our communities.

The 'My Police' series includes three children's books, written by Inspector Stewart Fleming from Policing Together, and a new animation which can be viewed here

The books cover topics including how the police help to keep children safe, how Police Scotland work with partner agencies and the different roles and

specialisms officers can have.



MY POLICE ...

Aimed at children aged between three and eight, the resources are available on the I Am Me Scotland platform which includes video versions of all books and the associated learning materials.

Policing Together has also supported the delivery of

resource packs to every local policing division, containing 50 copies of each book, A3 versions for group delivery, and branded stickers.

Officers can now gift copies of the books, as well as using the interactive resources on the platform, to support engagement with children at local schools and nurseries.



Inspector Stewart Fleming said: "These books were created as a way of fostering positive relationships with our young people at an early age through storytelling. We want to build trust between the police and children to ensure that they feel safe and able to come to us if they need help. The books have been a great engagement tool and are now available for officers to use when visiting schools and nurseries in their local area."

You, Me, Together



New Domestic Abuse resource aimed at Students launches on I Am Me Platform

In collaboration with Police Scotland and Education Scotland, we are delighted to launch YOU, ME, TOGETHER, a resource for secondary school pupils to make them aware of domestic abuse and the wider issue of violence against

women and girls.

The resource is available on the platform now and provides officers and teachers with a number of a resources to work with to help facilitate open and safe discussions about what can be an emotive subject for young men and women. The package includes an impactive film which follows a story line of coercive control between young people in a school setting, and shows the warning signs to look out for. YOU, ME, TOGETHER demonstrates that if we all work together, we can tackle domestic abuse. The emphasis being on victims, friends, family, supporters, partner agencies, professionals and police all working together.

The resource includes video features of a domestic abuse case study, gaslighting scenario and an interactive exploration of a coercive controlling relationship.

Classrooms for Malawi

Classrooms for Malawi is a charitable organisation dedicated to improving educational facility in Malawi. The organisation believes that education is a powerful tool to alleviate poverty and aims to provide young people in Malawi with safe, clean, and friendly learning environments. The classroom for Malawi's team in Renfrewshire joined I Am Me at the Christmas stall and managed to raise a whopping £846!

During their recent visit to Malawi the Renfrewshire Council Malawi Team was welcomed at Ngumbe Secondary School. The team and the builders worked tirelessly together to build four internal brick walls within the long open dormitory. This will ensure that the boys have more privacy and infections spread less. There will be provision for five rooms with 12 boys in each room. The teams next task is to raise enough funds to buy 30 bunk beds and 60 mattresses to replace their current sleeping arrangement which is sleeping on the floor. They are also working to renovate the kitchen which will provide 1000 meals per day for 300 pupils and staff. To find out more and how to donate click here.



An Overview of I Am Me Scotland

I Am Me Scotland is a community charity based within Renfrewshire.

The Charity has been working in 2024 to further develop the education suite, which has lessons on disability, hate crime, alcohol & substances, anti social behaviour, mental health and exploitation.

I Am Me

I Am Me works with communities to raise awareness of what disability hate crime is and how incidents can affect individuals and the wider community. The project has worked with partners to produce a hard hitting film based on a young adult with autism and a learning disability, and the issues he faces within society. A teaching pack to accompany the film is available at www.iammescotland.co.uk and the film is available to view for free here or by visiting our YouTube.

I Am Me started in 2012, having worked with a number of partners to develop a Primary School Resource which is available to download for free at www.iammescotland.co.uk. The resource aims to: introduce disability; increase understanding of the range of disabilities; highlight the effects of bullying and exclusion; highlight the consequences of hate crime.
