
Your Halloween & Voting Edition



- Stick to Well-Lit Streets: Only approach homes with porch lights on, and bring flashlights or glow sticks for visibility.
- Plan Ahead on Donaldson: This street can get very busy! Be cautious of increased traffic, and plan accordingly for a smoother trick-or-treating experience.
- Brush Pickup Alert: Scheduled for November 4th, so be sure not to block the streets with extra debris. Let's keep pathways open for all the little goblins and ghouls!

MY VOTING EXPERIENCE AT WOODLAWN POINTE- MADELINE CHANDLER SECRETARY

I had a great experience voting this week at Woodlawn Pointe Church, right here in our neighborhood. The energy was contagious—everyone was in good spirits, with the poll workers sharing that we're setting records this year. Each day, they've seen an impressive average of 500+ voters coming through, and with early voting hours from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. daily (and 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on November 5), there's plenty of time to stop by.

The setup was smooth, with plenty of seating available for elderly or disabled neighbors who need to rest and even skip the line if necessary. It really feels like the community is supporting each other, making sure everyone can vote comfortably.

Just a reminder—phones are a no-go within 100 feet of the polling location, so keep them tucked away to stay within guidelines.


My best tip? Preview your ballot before arriving and while you're in line if you're able; it really helps keep things moving! SAN ANTONIO'S 2024 PROPOSITIONS: BE INFORMED BEFORE YOU VOTE

Remember to take time to look over San Antonio's propositions on the ballot this year. These decisions affect everything from local laws to how we fund community projects, so it's worth knowing what each one means.

Here are a few easy ways to get up to speed:

- San Antonio Public Library Drop by your local branch; some have print copies of the guides, and the staff can help you find what you need to know.







FRIENDLY GUIDELINES FOR POLITICAL YARD SIGNS IN JEFFERSON

You've probably noticed lots of yard signs popping up around the neighborhood. Did you know San Antonio has some friendly guidelines for displaying them? Here are a few key points to keep in mind.

- Size Limits According to San Antonio's guidelines, yard signs in residential areas should be no larger than 36 x 24 inches. Keeping signs to this size ensures clear visibility for pedestrians and drivers.
- Where to Place Them Signs need to stay on your own property and not in public spaces like sidewalks or medians, so they don't block pathways or create hazards.
- Timing The City of San Antonio allows political signs to be displayed up to 90 days before the election and requests that they're removed within 10 days afterward to keep neighborhoods looking tidy.
- Be Respectful Our community is known for its friendliness and diverse views, so let's honor each other's perspectives and keep things positive.
