

While it can be frustrating to see these problems persist, it's essential to recognize that we all play a part in seeking solutions. Here's a look at the top concerns that are coming from our Facebook indicators and at our meetings

- 1. **Loose Dogs**: Stray & loose dogs remain a safety concern. Reporting incidents and advocating for better management are vital steps forward.
- 2. **Streets & Infrastructure**: Potholes, drainage issues, and faded street lines need continued attention to ensure safer streets for everyone.
- 3. **Homelessness**: Visibility of homelessness, especially near Deco Pizza, remains a challenge. Let's keep advocating for resources and support.
- 4. **Speeding & Reckless Behavior**: Speeding, reckless driving, and gunshots are serious safety concerns. Ongoing collaboration with local authorities is crucial.
- 5. **Unkempt Properties**: Neglected homes and unpermitted projects detract from our neighborhood's charm. Staying vigilant and involved can drive change.

History Corner

The wide expanse of Donaldson Avenue and Jefferson Drive hints at the transformation from agricultural roots to the urban hub we know today.




Congratulations to Jefferson High senior Leo Guzman for earning a spot in the San Antonio Sports All-Star Football Game through the People's Choice community vote!

Updates

TACKLING LOOSE DOGS

The San Antonio City Council has approved higher fines for dog owners whose pets repeatedly get loose or cause harm, with penalties up to \$750 for loose dogs and \$2,000 for repeated dog bites.

Animal Care Services (ACS) now has the authority to spay or neuter stray dogs before returning them to their owners. Additionally, a new policy allows residents to report dangerous dogs anonymously, protecting them from retaliation. State legislation is being proposed to ensure this anonymity can extend even to court cases.

We appreciate the continued efforts of Councilwoman Marina Alderete Gavito in working toward solutions to keep our community safe.

2024 Year in Review: Congressman Joaquin Castro

The following updates were shared by Congressman Joaquin Castro's office and highlight federal investments impacting our neighborhood and surrounding areas:

- Martinez Creek Restoration: Funding secured for environmental restoration and flood prevention, enhancing our local green spaces.
- VIA Green Line Project: A \$268 million transit improvement initiative to expand access for thousands of daily riders, including Jefferson-grea residents.
- Solar Energy Investments: A \$30 million project to increase solar-powered public facilities and job training opportunities in renewable energy.

Additionally, new funding has been allocated to expand CentroMed health services and improve access to federal resources like Social Security and passport services.

Winter Weather



STAY PREPARED- WINTER WEATHER TIPS

With cold temperatures settling in San Antonio, we want to make sure as neighbors, we are safe, take care of each other, and are ready. The City of San Antonio, CPS Energy, and SAWS have shared vital resources to help us navigate the chill- the Four Ps: People, Pets, Plants, and Pipes

People

- Dress warmly in layers and check on neighbors, especially those who may need extra assistance, like the elderly or individuals with special needs.
- Need a warm place? Local libraries, community centers, and senior centers are open during business hours. Find a location at SA.gov/ColdWeather.
- Fire safety is critical: Keep space heaters at least three feet from flammable materials, and never use ovens or generators indoors.

Pets

- Bring pets indoors! If that's not possible, ensure they have insulated, safe shelters. Shorthaired dogs, cats, and young or older pets should never be left outside.
- Always provide fresh water and extra food, as outdoor pets need more energy to stay warm.

Plants

• Cover outdoor plants or bring them inside to protect them from frost damage.

Pipes

 Prevent freezing by insulating exposed pipes, draining irrigation systems, and covering outdoor faucets. Locate your water shutoff valve now in case of emergencies. SAWS offers helpful videos at saws.org/BeReady.



Stoves & Grills

- . Do not use your gas stove to warm your house
- Always use proper ventilation to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning
- Never use an outdoor grill to heat your home or to cook indoors.
- Do not burn paper in your wood stove
- In case of a power outage, have heating equipment ready (fireplaces, wood burning stoves or space heaters) and enough fuel so you can keep at least on room of your house warm.

Space Heater

- Keep anything that can burn (blankets, clothing, curtains), at least 3 feet away
- Plug heaters directly into an outlet, do not use an extension cord or power strip
- Turn heaters off when you go to bed or leave your home.

Fireplace

- Keep a screen in front of the fireplace to prevent embers or sparks from jumping out.
- Do not burn paper in your fireplace
- Put the fire out before you go to bed or leave your home.
- Have your chimney inspected and cleaned each year by a professional.
- Keep fire extinguishers on hand and make sure your family knows how to use them.
