
This November edition is packed with updates to help you enjoy the upcoming holiday season and stay engaged in our community!




TRAFFIC ALERT FOR JNA NEIGHBORS: I-10 & I-35 IMPROVEMENTS UNDERWAY

If you've noticed a slowdown on I-10 or I-35 near downtown, TxDOT has started a new phase of its \$25.9 million improvement project on these major routes to enhance safety and traffic flow.

With repairs now shifting to eastbound lanes on I-10 between Fulton Avenue and Frio Street, expect alternating lane closures—though at least one lane will remain open to help keep traffic moving. This phase is scheduled through December (weather permitting), so plan extra time if these routes are part of your daily drive.

While these improvements aim to relieve traffic congestion by Fall 2025, let's stay patient and safe as our city's infrastructure gets an essential upgrade!

The City of San Antonio is gathering feedback from residents in the Near North area which includes our Jefferson Neighborhood—as part of the Near North Community Area Plan. This survey will help shape the vision, goals, and priorities for our community, covering key areas like neighborhood amenities, public spaces, housing, economic development, and more. Our very own neighbors Ted Guerra and Jason Vasquez serve on the committee, representing our voices!

How You Can Participate: <u>The survey</u>, which takes about 10 minutes to complete, is open until Friday, December 20, 2024. This is a great opportunity for us to share our thoughts on what makes our area special, what's missing, and what changes we'd like to see in the future.

You too can make a difference!

You don't need to be elected to any position or office to serve your neighborhood, community, and others. You simply need to be determined to want to make your neighborhood and our community, the best place to be for you, your family, your neighbors, and visitors to our neighborhood.

It all starts at home. Take pride in your home – clean and maintain your yard, pickup trash on the street in front of your home, put a quick layer of paint on part of your home that may need some attention, or simply sweep the clippings from your yard off the street and put them in your yard or in the organics cart (green). It's actually code to pick up clipping from the street (UDC Section 34-703).

When you're walking your dog or going for your morning or evening walk, take an empty bag with you and pick up trash you may see along your route. Every bit makes a difference when it's done by all of us! Turn on your porch light at night and make our neighborhood safer for your family and neighbors. The average cost to run a 60 watt light bulb per night for 12 hours is about \$1.50. A small price to pay for safety and security. If you don't want to use power, there are solar light posts that go with the style of our homes!

When you're driving in the neighborhood, watch your speed, make full stops at stop signs, wave at your neighbors, take a moment to chat if you have time, or visit with a neighbor on an upcoming cool evening. If you see bandit signs on light posts or on stands in the neighborhood or nearby area, swipe them up! You're protected! (UDC Chapter 28, Section 6).



When you go to a community forum or event where elected officials who represent US are present, ask questions and challenge them to help our neighborhood and what you think would help our neighborhood.

The easiest thing you can do- attend the next JNA monthly meeting and get involved and become a member! The mission of the JNA is to empower our residents through education, advocacy, and establishing a culture of community.

Join our mission today and help advocate for and make a difference for our neighborhood! Each one of us can help! We look forward to welcoming you!

Get Festive with a Thanksgiving Classic!

EASY GREEN BEAN CASSEROLE RECIPE

As we gather around the table this Thanksgiving, there's nothing like a classic green bean casserole to bring the flavors of the season to life. Here's a quick and easy recipe that's sure to be a crowd-pleaser at your holiday feast. Have a cozy and delicious Thanksgiving, JNA!

Ingredients:

- 2 (14.5 oz) cans green beans, drained
- 1 (10.5 oz) can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 1 cup shredded Cheddar cheese, divided
- 1 (6 oz) can French-fried onions

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°F (175°C).
- 2.In a large microwave-safe bowl, mix green beans and condensed soup until combined. Microwave on high for 3-5 minutes until warm.
- 3.Stir in ½ cup Cheddar cheese and microwave for another 2-3 minutes.
- 4. Transfer mixture to a casserole dish, sprinkle with remaining Cheddar and top with French-fried onions.
- 5. Bake for 10 minutes or until cheese melts and onions are golden.

Tip:

To reheat, let the casserole come to room temperature for 30 minutes. Reheat at 350°F until the onions are golden and the casserole is warm throughout.

DID YOU KNOW? KEEPING OUR NEIGHBORHOOD SAFE FOR ALL





Even if a dog is friendly, runners, walkers, and families with strollers may not know that when encountering an unleashed dog on their path. While loose dog incidents have decreased in the neighborhood, one local runner recently had to keep pepper spray ready during a run on Alexander Hamilton Drive after encountering two large, roaming dogs.

Here are some important reminders to keep in mind:

- Vaccination Requirement: All dogs and cats must have up-to-date rabies vaccinations; otherwise, owners face a \$500 fine.
- Leash Laws: Dogs must be on a leash when in a front yard or outside a fenced area. Allowing dogs to roam without restraint is a Class C misdemeanor, with a maximum \$500 fine.

- Bite Protocols: If a dog bites or scratches, it must be quarantined for ten days for rabies observation. Additionally, the animal cannot be sold or given away until cleared by the Local Rabies Control Authority (LRCA).
- **Prohibited Sales:** Roadside animal sales are not permitted.

As a community, we can do better to ensure everyone, including our own fur babies, feels safe.
