City of San Antonio creates text alert notification for COVID-19 vaccine availability

The City of San Antonio has partnered with some of the Bexar County vaccine distribution sites to create a vaccine availability text alert system to keep the community informed about the release of more COVID-19 vaccines.

Individuals who decide to opt-in, can text VACCINE to 55000 or in Spanish VACUNA to 55000 starting today. By signing up you will

receive a text notifying you which locations have available appointments.

Opting in to this text alert system will **not** sign you up for a vaccine or add you on to a wait

News from County Commissioner Pct. 2 Justin Rodriguez



Dear Friends:

Here's an update on projects in Pct 2.

The San Pedro Creek Culture Park restoration project consists of four phases and spans 2.2 miles beginning at IH-35 at the flood tunnel inlet at Santa Rosa Street and ending at the confluence of the Alazan and Apache Creeks at IH-35 to the south

Commissioners Court approved \$72.3 million for Phase 1.3 and Phase 2 of the project to improve infrastructure, remove part of the creek banks from the floodplain, and improve safety.

The revised plan prioritizes natural greenery and trees while limiting concrete hardscaping.

Once fully complete, San Pedro Creek Culture Park is expected to spur a \$1.5 billion economic impact by creating

• 2,100 new housing units

- 1,428 new downtown employees
- A 150 percent increase in new property value
- 7,300 new downtown residents

5,227 million in ad valorem tax revenues

My office continues to support ongoing response and recovery needs in our community as a result of the severe winter weather event.

Our community continues to come together to support those in need.

If you or your family experienced property damage and/or personal property loss because of the 2021 Texas Severe Winter Storm you may be eligible for assistance.

Residents can call 311 and select option 5 or 210-207-6000 to connect with a call taker. For assistance online, residents can visit strongertogeth-

er.sanantonio.gov.

Call takers will help residents navigate the disaster assistance programs available through the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), Small Business Administration (SBA), and the newly created Community Pipe Repair Fund (CPR) administered by SAWS.

Did your property sustain damage from

the winter storm? If so, you may qualify for a temporary property tax exemption if your property experienced at least 15% damage due to the storm.

Applications for this Temporary Disaster Exemption for Qualified Properties must be submitted by May 28, 2021.

Trey Martinez-Fischer Reports



I've been working on a slate of bills since January that I am hoping to see moved swiftly through the House.

Chief among the bills I have authored this session is legislation that will protect consumers and provide better access to health care.

One of those bills is <u>HB 2725</u>, would protect consumers from predatory vaccine scams. That bill will be heard in committee today. As I do every session,

I filed a bill <u>HB 1529</u>, that would strengthen health care protections for those with pre-existing conditions.

After our winter storm, I knew the Legislature would have to act quickly to make sure Texans received meaningful relief, so I filed the Texas Rescue Plan, <u>HB 4393</u>.

If passed, HB 4393 will put working families at the forefront of our recovery from the winter storm.

House Bill 2728, which will declare January 27 as International Holocaust Remembrance Day in the State of Texas.

House Bill 1826,

which will add disinfectant cleaning supplies and personal protective equipment (PPE) to the list of items subject to price gouging protections during a declared disaster like the COVID-19 pandemic.

Businesses that raise prices on essential equipment during a disaster need to be held accountable.

It shouldn't be cost-prohibitive to keep you and your loved ones safe from a deadly virus.

HB 1826 is a common-sense bill and

If the bill makes it out of committee, it will then be sent to the Calendars Committee to determine when and if it will be voted on by the full House.

I will keep you updated as it makes its way through the process.

Lastly, I launched Politex to bring the conversations we are having in Austin directly to your kitchen table or morning commute.
