Did You Know?

The City seal is the official emblem of the City of San Antonio. It was designed in 1925 by **Johannes C. Scholze**, a resident of San Antonio.

Scholze created a wood carving that includes an Alamo at the top, the Lone Star of Texas, and the words "Libertatis Cunabula" which is Latin for "Cradle of Liberty."

The emblem was not designated as the City's Official Seal until 1981. At that time, City Council approved it to be used to identify the City on all official documents and papers and it is still used for that purpose today.

SAWS Rate To Remain Same in 2021

The coronavirus pandemic has taken a toll on many families' finances. But human health and safety, as well as access to affordable water, will remain top priorities for San Antonio Water System in the coming year, as the COVID-19 crisis lingers on .

For the first time in more than a decade, there will be no customer rate increase for water or sewer service in 2021. The SAWS Board of Trustees approved the utility's \$909 million budget during its November meeting.

"Obviously with the impacts of COVID-19, we know there are more people we may be able to help, "said **Doug Evanson**, senior vice president & chief financial officer.

Residential water and sewer customers who are having trouble paying their SAWS bill can apply for assistance online at

saws.org/uplift.

Earlier this month, we gathered to hear the performance yearly report from the County's Military & Veterans Center. Service FY21 approved the for budget the Health University System, and to discuss programs and efforts of the Coronavirus Relief Fund spending.

The recent surge shows that there is no sign that this virus intends on slowing down, even as vaccines began to come on the market.

I encourage everyone to wear face coverings, socially distance, and limit in-person gatherings as much as possible to help prevent the spread of this virus.

Bars that serve food or have an agreement with a food vendor will continue to operate under the Governor's orders.

TABC will work with those bar owners who are interested in securing food permits or agreements with food vendors to allow them to stay open.

The Jefferson Community Garden is a space for the residents of the Jefferson and Monticello Park neighborhoods in San Antonio, Texas. Through a generous donation from SAISD, Jefferson High School, the land and water supply are provided.

The Jefferson Community Garden mission is to educate and encourage the community to become more ecologically aware of the importance of land and water conservation. Through sharing experiences, we are building a strong foundation. Sharing is the most gratifying and important aspect of the garden.

Within the last 6 months, we've been able to produce over 60 pounds of organic fresh vegetables for our community. The two orange trees on the property produced over 8 pounds of oranges that were donated to local food pantries.

While growing and sharing continue to be our main goals, we also encourage neighbors to learn from our local gardeners, to understand soil health and to share knowledge with the community.

Our goal for 2021, with the help of our volunteers, is to harvest up to 500 pounds of produce for our community and local food banks.

To achieve this goal, we want to raise \$2,000 to fund the following projects:

- Drip and overhead irrigation for 3 new garden beds
- Toolshed for used tools and organic fertilizers
- Bulk organic seeds
- Compost and Mulch for the whole year
- DIY Solar Panel (Stretch Goal) for electrical

In addition to contributions, to help meet these funding needs, we also plan to have some fundraisers such as a garden tour and BBQ lunch.
