San Antonio among "Fastest Risers" for 10-minute Walk to Park Score

The Trust for Public Land listed San Antonio among the top three "Fastest Risers" this year-- cities with the greatest increase of residents within a 10-minute walk to a park.

San Antonio's percentage of residents within a walk to a park increased 5% within the last year and 11% within the last 3 years.

The total percent-

age of residents within a 10-minute walk to a park is 48%.

The Trust for Public Land (TPL) annually publishes the ParkScore index that measures park systems across 100 of the largest cities in the U.S. The index measures five categories: acreage, investment, amenities, access— and new for 2021—equity.

Commissioners Court approves \$150,000 to continue

AlamoPROMISE.

The program makes college more accessible to graduating seniors by providing the support necessary to earn a certificate or associate's degree at one of the five Alamo Colleges:

Northeast Lakeview College, Northwest Vista College, Palo Alto College, San Antonio College, and St. Philip's College.

It ensures that tuition and fees at the Alamo Colleges are covered for students who graduate from participating high schools.

The Save Your Seat pledge period is now closed for the graduating senior class of 2021 from participating Promise high schools.

Students who 'saved their seat' to lock in the promise of tuition-free college starting in Fall 2021 are still eligible for **AlamoPROMISE** and

can submit admissions and financial aid applications to be part of the next class of **AlamoPROMISE** Scholars.

Although Bexar County offices remain open to the public, we do encourage you to use our online services whenever possible, in order to practice responsible social distancing.

The City Council committee on Community Health & Equity completed recommendations on how to improve the work of the San Antonio Police Department.

The recommendations now go to the Public Safety Committee for their consideration.

Part of the recommendations includes expanding the department's SAFFE Officer program, giving officers more alternatives to guns, and creating a forum

for the community to give feedback to the department.

These are only a starting point. I expect that they will go through a lot of reviews before any are implemented and look forward to discussing them with my colleagues when we craft next year's City budget.

Animal Care Services is always in need of fundamentals like formula and food, but the shelter can also use covers and other supplies to help care for litters that are coming into the shelter.

Donations can be dropped off anytime seven days a week during regular business hours. ACS is open 1 p.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday and 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. on weekends.
