Help protect Lolo Peak and the Carlton Lake Basin

The Lolo National Forest released their proposed action for how they may manage the public lands. The Forest Service is now accepting public comment until **April 1st.**

Friends of Lolo Peak recommendation for your Forest Plan Revision comment:

- ***Thank the LNF for extending the Carlton Ridge Research Natural Area and for retaining Recommended Wilderness for the South Fork of Lolo Creek.***
- ***Lolo Peak and the Carlton Lake Basin area should be Recommended Wilderness:***
 - This area is an important wildlife corridor between the South Fork Lolo Creek Recommended Wilderness to the west and the Selway-Bitterroot Wilderness to the south. This area needs a management designation that matches the adjacent areas.
 - The basin is critical to the survival of important plant and animal species that are threatened by our changing climate, such as sphagnum moss meadows, Alpine Larch, pikas, and marmots. Wolverine have also been seen passing through and the Grizzly Bear reintroduction efforts in the northern Bitterroot Mountains ecosystem will rely on wild landscapes like the Carlton Lake.
