#### **Program Notes**

**Die Nachtigall** is part of *Sech Lieder*, Op. 59 that was published in 1844. The German composer, conductor, pianist and organist, Felix Mendelssohn, set music to an excerpt of the poem *Ländlich* by Johann Wolfgang von Goethe. This four-voice strophic partsong starts off with a duet between the soprano and alto voices that charms the listener to reflect on the beloved old songs that the nightingale sings. This captivating duet is sung again by the tenor and bass voice part while soprano and alto emphasize that the nightingale was far away.

#### Translation:

The nightingale was far away, But the spring has tempted her once again; She has not learned anything new, So sings old, beloved songs.

**Bogoróditse Devo** from The *All-Night Vigil*, Op. 37 by Russian composer and pianist Sergei Rachmaninoff was published in 1915. The text of this vocal work is drawn from the liturgy of the Russian Orthodox Church. The first part of thi prayer is taken from the Gospel of Luke 1:28 when the Archangel Gabriel greeted the Virgen *Theotokos*, "And having come in, the angel said to her, "Rejoice, highly favored one, the Lord is with you; blessed are you among women!" The second part of the prayer is drawn from Luke 1:42 when Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, said "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb!" The four-part opening of this Ave Maria invites the listener to engage in meditation in veneration of the mother of God through the delicate piano dynamic and very gentle harmonies.

#### Translation:

Rejoice, O Virgin Theotokos, Mary full of grace, the Lord is with You. Blessed are You among women, And blessed is the Fruit of your womb, For You have borne the Savior of our souls.

#### **Program Notes (continued)**

**In Stiller Nacht** is a rhythmic homophonic folksong composed by Johannes Brahms. Appears in the second volume of *Deutsche Volkslieder* WoO 34 for mixed a cappella choir dating 1864. The German composer of lieder, chamber music, and symphony, sets music to a poem by Jesuit poet Friedrich Spee. The text of this work appears to be secular but it is based on the poem *Trawer-Gesang von der Noth Christi am Oelberg in dem Garten (Mourning-Song of the Suffering of Chirst on the Mount of Olives in the Garden*) published on 1635.

#### Translation:

In silent night, at first watch A voice begins to lament. The night wind has sweetly and gently Carried the sound to me. With bitter pain and sorrow My heart is melted. With simple tears and flowers I have watered all of them. The lovely moon will now set, For sorrow it doesn't want to shine, The stars stop their gleaming, They want to weep with me. No birdsong nor joyous sounds Can be heard in the air. Even the wild beasts grieve with me In rocks and ravines.

**Sure On This Shining Night** was premiered in 2005 at the American Choral Association National Convention. The text used by Morten Lauridsen for this choir and piano composition is included in Agee's first collection of poetry, *Permit Me Voyage*. Sure On This Shining Night becomes the third movement of the choral cycle *Nocturnes*. Lauridsen, in this choral work explores the vocal range and vocal ability of the singers in order to paint with music the wonders of the poem. An expressive piano solo sets the mood for this piece through the flexible rubato tempo and the incorporation of a motif that will eventually be sung by all voices at multiple times. The dramatic influence from musical theater, close pitches, change in tempo, the leaps of notes and the exaggeration of the "sh" sound will convey the sparks of a summer night.

**My Soul's Been Anchored in the Lord** is a traditional spiritual arranged by Moses Hogan. New Orleans' gifted arranger, pianist, and conductor studied at New Orleans Center for Creative Arts, the Oberlin Conservatory of Music, the Juilliard School of Music, and Louisiana State University. During his life he published more than 70 works and was the editor of a collection of spirituals named the Oxford Book of Spirituals.

**If Music Be the Food of Love** was co-commissioned by the Minnesota Music Educators Association and the American Choral Directors Association of Minnesota. With music by David C. Dickau, this piece employs an expressive and romantic setting of the text by Henry Heveningahm. Towards the end, the voices engage in short canons that emphasizes phrases and creates a richer texture as preparation for an emotive ending.

**Alegres Pascuas** is an arrangement of a popular *villancico* from Puerto Rico by Ruben Colón Tarrats with music by Jaime Pericás. Colón Tarrats is a Puerto Rican composer and founder of the *Coral Municipal* and past conductor of the centenary band of the municipality of Ponce. The text of this work expresses how wonderful is to celebrate Christmas in the island and how proud we are to have been born in Borinquén.

#### Translation:

How wonderful are the holidays in my beautiful Borinquén, there's party and happiness everywhere; a tradition native to our home, fills our hearts with joy. Finally, Christmas has arrived, real festivities of our land. Festivities of all our longings, our sleeplessness, and our enthusiasm. Let's all sing with happiness, filled with joy, filled with love, Let's conserve like today, always present, our tradition. With drums, güiro and maracas, my serenade cheerful is. As a farewell, I wish you all years of health and prosperity. I'm pleased to have been born in this nest, in this Eden, because these holidays I adore so much, are the enchantment of Borinquén. My Borinquén.
