So why do Catholics and others pray to St. Michael the Archangel? As Catholics prayers go, this prayer is new, less than 150 years old. It recognizes the role of St Michael as an angel who guards the people of God and dates to the Old Testament. He is first mentioned, in the book of Daniel, where he was called a prince and is sent by God to defend Israel. Then, in the New Testament’s book of Revelation, he is portrayed as a warrior engaged in spiritual battle against Satan.

Praying to St. Michael the Archangel can evoke a range of feelings, often centered around protection, strength, and courage. Many people turn to St. Michael in times of spiritual warfare or when they feel threatened by negative forces. Here are some common feelings associated with praying to him:

- 1. **Protection:** St. Michael is known as a powerful protector against evil. Praying to him can provide a sense of safety and security, knowing that you are asking for divine reinforcement.
- 2. **Strength and Courage:** As a warrior angel, St. Michael embodies strength and bravery. Praying to him can inspire these qualities in yourself, helping you face challenges with greater confidence.
- 3. **Peace and Reassurance:** Many find comfort in the belief that St. Michael is watching over them. This can bring a sense of peace and reassurance, especially during challenging times.
- 4. **Spiritual Awareness:** Praying to St. Michael can heighten your awareness of the spiritual battles around you, reminding you of the importance of staying vigilant and faithful.

*"St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly Host, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan and all evil spirits who wander through the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen."*

You can say this prayer whenever you feel the need for protection or strength. It is a way to invite St. Michael's presence and support into your life.

## Dear Padre,

### Why is a US secular holiday like Thanksgiving on the Church's liturgical calendar?

Since November 1969, the Proper Calendar offers a Thanksgiving Day Mass for US dioceses. While it also includes Independence Day, no suggestion is made for other civic holidays (Memorial Day, Labor Day, etc.). Instead, the *Roman Missal* provides “Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions” that are suited to these observances (*Ordo* #5, *GIRM* 368–378).

In the United States, November is associated with giving thanks to God. In 1623—three years after the Pilgrims sailed to this land on the *Mayflower*—a severe drought threatened their crops. Consequently, a day of prayer was observed, an abundant rain saved the harvest, and a Day of Thanksgiving was established. In 1863, President Lincoln issued a proclamation for “Thanksgiving and Praise to Our Beneficent Father” on the last Thursday of November (later moved to the fourth Thursday).

However, thanking God isn’t just a one-day event; it’s meant to be a perennial practice. Recall the lesson of the ten lepers healed by Jesus, only one of whom returned to thank him. (See Luke 17:11–19.) People who don’t take their blessings for granted return thanks to God in prayer. Therefore, offer brief prayers of gratitude to God throughout the day, every day, for such gifts as your health and faith, the freedoms allowed in this country, “thy daily bread,” and the Eucharist—a word that means “thanksgiving.”

“Become what you pray”—a grateful disciple of our Lord! ●
