PDA & Law Enforcement

Parent Resource

If you find yourself in a situation that you need law enforcement to help with your child during a panic attack, keep these things in mind when speaking with the Dispatcher:

- Speak calmly
- Tell them you need assistance with your child who is having a panic attack
- Tell them you need help calming your child down
- Let them know your child is **autistic** with h**igh anxiety** and **extreme demand avoidance** and will be **resistant to requests**
- Ask officers to approach calmly and be very patient giving your child extra time to comply
- Alert them that you do not want your child arrested. You just need assistance with de escalation

When Officers Arrive

- · Meet officers outside with a calm demeanor if it's safe to leave your child inside
- State that you want to explain the situation
- Explain that your child has a form of autism that makes complying to demands extremely difficult
- View the situation as a panic attack expect fight/flight/freeze
- Ask for help calming your child down you DO NOT want your child arrested
- Ask officers to avoid touching your child
- Request that officers speak calmly and give plenty of time for your child to respond

Ways to Increase Positive Interaction with Law Enforcement

- Build rapport with officers in your community
- Introduce yourself and your child when out and about in your community
- Find opportunities to interact with law enforcement in everyday life so your child becomes familiar with officers don't view them as a threat but as a community helper
- Treat an officer to lunch if you see them while dining out with your family

Ways to Decrease Law Enforcement Involvement

- Utilize support of family and friends or community resources to provide respite care
- Remove items from the home that can be used as weapons (knives, bats, sharp or heavy objects, firearms)
- If unable to remove objects, secure them out of reach of the individual with PDA
