JANUARY MEETING

The regular meeting of the CDCWRT will be held at the Watervliet Senior Center on Friday, January 12, 2018. This is the annual members' meeting where round table members will do short presentations on a Civil War topic. The slate for officers and board members of the round table will be voted upon at this meeting.

Dave Hubbard and Melissa Swanson are members of the Friends of Grant Cottage at Mount McGregor near Saratoga. They will talk about the events at the cottage during this upcoming year. This is where President Grant did the final editing of his book on the Civil War, and where he died with throat cancer. Rosemary Nichols will speak unapologetically about her relative who fought as a member of the 60th Georgia infantry in the "Late Unpleasantness." This regiment was part of Gordon's Brigade that attacked the Union 11th Corps at Barlow's Knoll at Gettysburg on July 1st.

Finally Paul Spofford will display and talk about some artifacts that belong to his ancestor who was Lt.-Col. of the 97th New York Infantry. The 97th also fought at Gettysburg on July 1st. Col. Spofford was captured, but the regiment took the flag of the 20th North Carolina regiment. Could this be the artifact to be displayed??
