

LEGISLATION

The MOAA Legislative Action Center at moaa.quorum.us allows us to learn about MOAA-supported legislation and contact our lawmakers directly. For example:

Contact your legislators and urge them to support the Major Richard Star Act, which would authorize combat-injured veterans to receive their earned DoD retirement pay for years of service and their VA disability compensation for lifelong injury. Currently, these combat-injured (and often seriously disabled) veterans are subject to a cost-saving offset whereby their retirement pay is reduced for every dollar of VA disability received. To reduce earned retirement pay because of a combat disability is an injustice; the compensation for these injured veterans is not the place to achieve savings.

Also, military spouses face a persistent 21% unemployment rate—the highest among any population tracked by DoD. Frequent relocations, unpredictable schedules, and limited job markets near military bases all contribute to this ongoing crisis. Despite their having higher levels of education and valuable skills, employers are often reluctant to hire military spouses, knowing they may move within two to three years. Adding military spouses as a target group under the Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) would help offset hiring costs and incentivize businesses to recognize the value these talented workers bring. Congress took similar action to combat veteran unemployment; now it's time to apply that same proven strategy to support military spouses.

You can't read the local news these days without seeing something about the Vero Beach Regional Airport's activities, whether it be enhancements to its terminal and parking, a new airline starting service, or the opening of a new customs facility. Many area natives or longtime residents know that it was once a Naval Air Station that encompassed much of the real estate surrounding the physical airport. The airport served as a training base for Naval Aviators who received their flight training and wings prior to serving in World War II.

Brandon Dambeck, Operations Manager at the airport, will share highlights of the airport's Naval history and its transition from a Naval Air Station into a Vero Beach City asset that is financially self-sufficient and projected to log 300,000 aircraft operations this year. He will speak about the airport's 20-year plan and offer some insights into the vision for the its future growth. Brandon holds a Master's of Public Administration degree as well as a bachelor's degree in Aviation Management from Florida Institute of Technology. He is a commercial pilot with multi-engine and instrument ratings.
