In 1911 a Scottish car dealer challenged his son Henry Alexander Jr. to drive a Model T to the summit of Ben Nevis. This is the highest mountain in the British Isles at 4,411 feet. Starting at Fort William (sea level), it was a five day journey over rocks, across bogs and through snow. He had to use a zig-zag driving pattern to ascend the slope. When he descended back to the base of the mountain there was a crowd of several hundred people to greet him. He made a few adjustments to the car and then drove on to his father's dealership in Edinburgh. After the publicity it is said that they took orders for over 14,000 Model T's. The descent which took only 2.5 hours was filmed. Until a discovery in 2015 they thought that the film was lost. Interested ? Look up Ben Nevis Model T on You Tube.

Some say Henry Ford was never above engineering another publicity stunt, what do you think ?




What Happened to the K Car?

You originally thought Chrysler, right, no. This club is all about Ford, so lets talk about the Model K Ford. In 1906, before the Model T, Ford produced an upscale car called the Model K. It was aimed at the high end market at around \$2,500 per. It came with an inline-6 that produced 40 hp, and could travel up to 50 mph. It came in both touring and roadster versions. It was actually quite successful. In 1907 Ford Motor Company sold more than 500 units and it accounted for 85 percent of the company's profits. Then what happened?

Let's backup a minute. Henry Ford was an innovator of many things, but in the beginning there was no money. During Ford's employment at Detroit Edison he met Alexander Malcomson. Malcomson was in the business of coal distribution, in fact he controlled most of the coal in the Detroit area. Ford approached him with the idea of bankrolling a new automotive company. After the demise of the Henry Ford Company, Ford talked Malcomson into investing in Ford's second company, Ford & Malcomson and then later got him to organize investors, bringing in \$28,000 to incorporate the new business of the Ford Motor Company. Ford, Malcomson, and four other investors were the owners along with the Dodge Brothers. The Dodge Brothers each received 10% of the shares in Ford Motor Company in lieu of money owed for their supplied parts.

Malcomson placed his clerk, James Couzens, in management of the new company working above Henry Ford. Business took off and was making huge profits and returned more than 100% dividends on their stock. The problems came when Malcomson thought the future of the company should be in luxury cars, the Model K, and Ford wanted to produce cars that everyone could afford, the Model N. Ford also wanted to produce only one chassis and not have multiple platforms being produced at the same time. Malcomson insisted the future was luxury cars and started his own company called Aerocar. This angered Ford and Ford fought back by establishing the Ford Manufacturing Company. Ford Manufacturing was responsible for making all the parts for Ford Motor Company. Ford Manufacturing charged Ford Motor Company inflated prices for all the parts that they supplied, thus ending the profit for Ford Motor Company and halting any dividends that were paid to investors. Malcomson, feeling outmaneuvered, gave in and sold his shares of Ford Motor Company to Henry Ford. Others soon followed by selling their stock to Henry Ford, except for The Dodge Brothers, who sued, although that's another story for a later date. Eventually Henry Ford became the sole owner of the Ford Motor Company.

Ford then took charge of his own company, putting all his efforts into the Model T. The Aerocar company went broke, however Malcomson sold his factory to the Hudson Motor Company. Malcomson immersed himself back into the coal business and amassed a fortune of more than \$2 million before his death in 1923 at age 59.
