

What's Your Body Type?

When I first became interested in Model T's, I was at a car show where there were two T's next to each other, but they didn't look anything alike. There was a rumor, probably started in the teen's, that all of Henry Ford's Model T's were the same. While some of that rumor is true, there were many body styles, many purpose built vehicles and an incredible number of ongoing changes.

Today the electric car manufacturers are trying to design a single platform that can accommodate multiple body types. It turns out that is what Henry Ford and The Ford Motor Company did over a hundred years ago. The Model T chassis and running gear were basically the same for twenty years for at least ten different body styles that Ford made and a multitude of bodies that third party vendors built.

Open Cars: The most popular body was the touring car. The touring car made up about half of the total of Model T's ever built, about 7 million. It had a light-weight design. It could accommodate 5 people and had a soft folding top that could be put up in inclement weather.





Touring

The Runabout, also referred to as the Roadster, was the second most popular car. It was an open two-seater with a retractable soft top. Along with the Runabout was a low slung, sporty version called a Torpedo. The Torpedo was probably partially responsible for the speedster conversions. The Runabout was the preferred choice for many modifications. The rear deck could be removed and replaced with a seat for a third person. This vehicle was nick-named the mother-in-law. Some people put on a second seat that was a duplicate of the front seat thus making the Tourabout. The Runabout was also the vehicle that was converted into the first pickups. Take off the deck and order you a pickup box from Sears. It wasn't until 1925 that Ford decided to offer their own pickup, then in the last three years of production they built 137,000 of them.

Ford also built the Town Car body and the chauffer-driven Laudaulet. These weren't so much owned by the rich, but were used for public transportation in the form of taxi cabs and limousines. However, these two vehicles were short lived in their lineup.

Enclosed Cars: Enclosed cars got popular as time went on. In the beginning the public had fears of being trapped inside in case of an accident and they were also afraid of the possibility of all that glass breaking. Remember Ford was not yet using safety glass. Never-the-less the public eventually saw the benefits of an enclosed vehicle and there were huge quantities of Tudors, Fordors, Center-Doors and Coupes built.









The Coupe or Doctor's Coupe became popular for it's great reputation of the Doctor being called out in the middle of night making his emergency house calls. The enclosed Coupe sheltered the Doctor from the inclement weather and got him there "looking good" to deliver that baby. Ford also built a "Couplet." The car looked similar to a coupe but the top was retractable.

Specialized Vehicles: Ford produced a number of "Delivery" vans, usually with the famous "c-cab" design. Then, there is the old story of Henry Ford being anti-war, however he was not anti-money making. Ford produced thousands of ambulances that were exported to Europe for World War I. Keep in mind that the Deliveries and the Ambulances were not trucks, they were still a variation of the regular Model T chassis.

Ford also sold just the Model T chassis. These went to other manufacturers and home builders to be made into Speedsters, Depot Hacks, Hucksters and even tractor conversions.



Some Ford dealers were taking the Model T and strengthening the frame, adding a secondary transmission and a heavy duty rear axle making their own version of a heavy duty truck. In 1917 The Ford Company started producing their own truck, the 'TT'. In the next ten years they would produce 1,500,000 TT trucks.



So the next time that you are at an antique car show that has ten Model T's and none of them look alike, check out the different body styles. There were Model T's for the family, for the racer, for the doctor and for the farmer, but they were all Model T's. A four-cylinder motor, a two-speed transmission and "hope for the best" brakes!
