

Did you know?

20 YEARS AGO! - July 23 1903 - The First FORD Automobile Was Sold.

The original Ford Model A is the first car produced by the Ford Motor Company, beginning production in 1903. Ernest Pfennig, a Chicago dentist, became the first owner of a Model A on July 23, 1903; 1,750 cars were made from 1903 through 1904 during Ford's occupancy of its first facility: the Ford Mack Avenue Plant, a modest rented wood-frame building on Detroit's East Side. The Model A was replaced by the Ford Model C during 1904 with some sales overlap.

The car came as a two-seater runabout for \$800 or the \$900 four-seater tonneau model with an option to add a top.

The company had spent almost its entire \$28,000 initial investment funds (\$911,970 in 2022 dollars) with only \$223.65 left in its bank account when the first Model A was sold. The success of this car model generated a profit for the Ford Motor Company, Henry Ford's first successful business.

Five years later Ford introduced the hugely influential Model T.

Interesting fact from History.com

On December 10, 1915, the 1 millionth Ford car rolled off the assembly line at the River Rouge plant in Detroit.



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The Accessory Corner

I came across this T accessory from a fellow "hit and miss" engine collector who has quite a collection of engines, including a couple Model T stationary engines.

This accessory does just that, turns your T motor into a stationary engine. Just bolt the pulley to the rear of your engine and you're ready to grind grain or pump water. Some of the companies that provided these pulleys also provided stands to mount your engine on or you could purchase a cart made just for the T engine so it could be moved easily around the farm.

These pulleys worked great when rpm was steady, but when the engine was under different loads a governor was needed, especially when sawing wood. Some companies offered a governor built integral with pulley, but this pulley came with a radiator cooling fan that had a built-in governor that attached to the throttle.

Just mount the fan and attach the pulley to your engine and you're ready to go to work!

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TRIVIA ANSWERS

1. In what year did the first Model T roll off the assembly line?

If you answered B. 1908 You were correct

The first production Model T was produced on August 12, 1908 and left the factory on September 27, 1908, at the Piquette Plant in Detroit, Michigan.

2. The Model T was the first automobile mass produced on the assembly line using what?

If you answered A. interchangeable parts = You were correct

3. What was the original price tag of the Model T?

If you answered B. \$850 = You were correct

The car was introduced in 1908 with a price tag of \$850. The Model T later sold for as little as \$260, without extras, because of production savings Henry Ford passed on to customers.

4. What descriptive name did Henry Ford call the Model T?

If you answered B. universal car = You were correct

A low-cost, reliable vehicle that could be maintained easily and could successfully travel the poor roads of the era.







5. The Model T had several different body styles, all fashioned on the same chassis. How many body styles did it have?

If you answered B. 9 = You were correct

6. Ford also produced a truck based on the Ford Model T, but with a heavier frame and rear axle. What was it called?

If you answered C. Model TT = You were correct

7. In 1909, Henry Ford told his management team that in the future, "any customer can have a car painted any color that he wants so long as it is what"?

If you answered C. black = You were correct

Actually, in the early days, the Model T was offered in grey, green, blue, and red. However, in 1914, black was the only color offered.

8. Who was the primary designer of the Ford Model T?

If you answered A. Henry Ford = You were correct

9. Henry Ford's initiated the mass production of vehicles on the moving assembly line and the Model T was one of the first cars to be built using this method. This led to lower car prices and the ability of Ford to pay his employees what salary?

If you answered D. \$5 per day = You were correct Unheard of in those days!
