The Accessory Corner

Hard to believe that another month has gone into the history books. It seems that the older I get the faster these months fly by!

Well, if you've driven a Model T for any length of time, you'll notice it has a few shakes and rattles. Most of these rattles are caused over time due to lack of lubrication at key points. But one rattle was there right out the factory door, it being the brake rod supports. The supports were made in such a way that they had to be loose enough for the brake rod to move back and forth freely but not too loose as to cause rattling. But due to some rods being loose from the factory, they rattled as soon as the car hit the road, and with the roads being what they were, and the normal vibrations, they were prone to excessive wear. Over time the wear would get worse, and the rod would eventually cut through the support leaving the rod to hang and bang all over the place causing even more rattling noise.

One solution was to have a pair of pliers handy and bend the support arm around the rod as it wore but eventually the brake rod would wear through the support arm leaving the rod hanging. The solution to this problem was a New Anti-Rattle Brake Rod Support made by a couple different accessory companies.


These supports slipped over the existing radius arms and had a slot to facilitate the brake rod. The rod was held in place with a cotter pin and a spring-loaded ball bearing kept slight pressure on the rod allowing the brake rod to move back and forth with ease and with no more vibration.

I got this set from fellow T'er a few years ago. These are kinda hard to find but I did see a set on a 1924 Coupe a couple years ago and the guy said they work really well with no rattling or vibration.

Pretty clever I gotta say! Yet another nifty accessory!


