Girls basketball coach Chris Smith is mourned by the **Bulldogs**

Girls basketball coach Chris Smith is mourned by the Bulldogs The coach who revived the program in recent years passes unexpectedly at the age of 50

In what was shaping up to be yet another playoff run for the Zephyrhills girls basketball team suddenly was transformed into a season of mourning. Coach Chris Smith passed away unexpectedly last week at the age of 50.

Smith was in the midst of his seventh season as the girls head coach, posting a 75-58 record and overseeing the team's five playoff appearances during that stretch. Before that, Zephyrhills endured more than 10 losing seasons in that sport.

In 2021, Smith was the Sunshine Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. That team was led by SAC Player of the Year Maya Llanes.

"He was very serious about girls basketball. He loved the game," said former boys basketball head coach Alan Reed, who in 2016 retired again after four stints with Zephyrhills but has served as an assistant since then. "He got a flood of good athletes. He not only got them, he handled them and he won.'

As is the case with many coaches at the same school, Smith supported other coaches and teams at Zephyrhills.

He rode to the football games with Bruce and I. He was a good young man," Reed said. "I'll miss him. I'll tell you that."

Added Cimorelli, "Chris was a great guy. He had a great temperament. "As long as he coached the girls I never had a complaint." Reed added that the boys and girls basketball

coaches had a mutual respect for one another.

"If his team wasn't playing you could find him at our games," Reed said. Mike Novak, the Zephyrhills boys basketball

Bulldogs finish sixth in winter holiday series Zephyrhills dropped two of three games

in prestigious Nature Coast Christmas **Tournaments**

boys basketball team had some tough sledding, so to speak, in last week's Nature Coast tournament. The Bulldogs lost two of three games in the three-day series hosted by that school in Brooksville. Following a loss to Lakota East from Ohio, Zephyrhills

took on Brooksville Central, which was coming off a loss against Tallahassee Rickards. The Bulldogs defeated the Bears 63-58 then lost to Largo by just two points, 57-55, in the waning seconds to finish the series with a 1-2 record for sixth place.

Zephyrhills' best efforts in that tourney came in 2019 when it won the championship and 2022 with an appearance in the final. The Bulldogs have played in the tourney for all of head coach Mike Novak's eight seasons.

Mentioning that the losses came against high-caliber teams, assistant Alan Reed, the Bulldogs' former head coach, noted the team played well at times but needs to clean up some of the little things.







MOMENTS IN TIME: The History Channel

* On Jan. 15, 1759, French philosopher Voltaire's satire "Candide" was published anonymously in five editions and five countries. In 2023, we lost many of my favorite stars who I did shootings with or knew. In 1985, while shooting Brian Bloom (Dusty in "As the World Turns") in Gramercy Park, New York, Italian superstar Gina Lollobrigida had a meltdown over him and said in her sexy Italian accent, "I love watching you on your tele-novela." She kissed both his cheeks and sauntered away. Brian asked, "Who was that?!" I told him that she was an Italian sex symbol who starred with Burt Lancaster and Tony Curtis in "Trapeze" (1955), as well as Rock Hudson in "Strange Bedfellows" (1965), among other films. She left us on Jan. 16, 2023,

I remember in 1982 when "Laverne & Shirley's" Cindy Williams and Penny Marshall crashed a party for David Hasselhoff and hysterically pretended to be huge gushing fans of his. Cindy passed Jan. 25, 2023, at 75.

I pinched myself following Tina Turner around post-premiere party for "Tommy" (1975), as she interacted with The Who and Elton John. She was so down to earth! She left us on May 24, 2023, at 83.


In 1967, at the closing night of Marlene Dietrich's Broadway show, I mingled with her conductor Burt Bacharach and his wife, "Police Woman" star Angie Dickinson, just before Dietrich was hoisted atop her limo with them inside. She threw little photos to thousands of fans in the street. Burt left us on Feb. 8, 2023, at 94.

In 1985, I ran into Stella Stevens in Hawaii. She starred with Elvis Presley in "Girls! Girls! Girls!" (1962) and with Jerry Lewis in "The Nutty Professor" (1963). She wanted to learn how to surf, so I asked my friend Sam J. Jones (star of "Flash Gordon" in 1980) to teach her. As I shot pictures of them, the outrigger I rented took on water and almost sank. How we laughed! She died on Feb. 17, 2023, at 84.

I was devastated when Raquel Welch died on Feb. 15, 2023, at 82. She was the epitome of glamour. She once told me at a party, "I want to thank you for all the encouraging things you've written about me in your columns." I nearly fainted when she kissed me.

I got to know Matthew Perry when he was filming "Studio 60 on the Sunset Strip." Every time I covered a shooting of his, he was friendly and nice, and liked it when I called him (what else?) "friend!" It was tragic when he suddenly died on Oct. 28, 2023, at 54. I disagree with the song "Auld Lang Syne" that old acquaintances should not be forgotten. Happy New Year!






