Zephyrhills Winter Horseshoe League is back in action

New season is under way for Tuesday and Wednesday leagues with some teams competing on both days

Play is back under way for the Zephyrhills Winter Horseshoe League. Championships are at stake in two leagues, one on Tuesdays and the other on Wednesdays.

Defending champions are Forest Lake Estates in Tuesday's Oldtimers division and the combined team of Settler's Rest/Sweetwater in the unnamed division that plays on Wednesdays. Both leagues schedule their matchups in the mornings.

"We were just hitting all the time," Forest Lake Estates captain Rick Frye, who also is the Tuesday league's president, said of last year's championship

run. "We had some strong players."

The nucleus of last year's squad and returns intact. However, that did not help in Forest Lake Estates' loss to Settler's Rest/Sweetwater in the season opener.

"We just start from scratch again," Frye said, adding that "a lot of our good players weren't there. We had three players out on cruises."

"It's a lot of fun with the guys and gals," he said, noting that both teams had a few women that pitched horseshoes. "They're a good bunch of people."

Masons install new officers at local lodge

The Grand Master of the Masons of the State of Oklahoma, Allan Large, had said in Mason literature that "Few things are sadder in human affairs than unnecessary conflict, caused by misunderstanding or the unwillingness of men and women to discuss, calmly and factually, the differences they perceive to separate them. In recent years, Freemasons have felt especially victimized by this problem."

The Zephyrhills Masonic Lodge 198 had an open installation of officers. Glenn Guterman was the outgoing Worshipful Master and Fred Maixner, the incoming Worshipful Master. "A Worshipful Master is the wise one, representative of a king, master of the house, in charge," said Guterman. "Everyone moves at a different pace and takes a different path."

Installed as lodge chaplain was Past Mayor Cliff McDuffie, who chose his path as a member of the Scottish Rite of the Freemasons. McDuffie dressed in his kilt to proudly show his heritage. "I had to memorize a lot of rituals in the beginning to get where I am," said McDuffie. "At

Arbor Day, Pigz in Zhills highlight city council meeting

Monday's agenda had some purchases and ZPD accreditation business handled in the Consent Agenda

The meeting began with an Arbor Day Proclamation, denoting Jan. 19, 2024 as the City of Zephyrhills's recognition. Arbor Day began in 1972 when J. Sterling Morton proposed the day to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture as a special day set aside for the planting of trees. The inaugural event saw more than one million trees planted in Nebraska. The Arbor Day Foundation provides Tree City USA recognition to communities that: maintain a tree board and/or department, have a tree ordinance, spend at least \$2 per capita on urban forestry and celebrate Arbor Day.

Zephyrhills was established as a Tree City USA in 2002. Zephyrhills Garden Club member Beverly Jones was on hand to receive the proclamation and also mentioned that during the Jan. 19 event in the city, that a re-dedication of trees that were named after people that had been removed, would be re-dedicated with new plantings.

The Consent Agenda contained 10 items. Item 2.1 asked for approval of the Nov. 27, 2023 Regular Meeting Minutes. Item 2.2 asked for approval of three task orders for lift station rehabilitation. Lift Stations 4 and 13, as well as the lift station at the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) are in need of rehabilitation, due to age, past deferred maintenance and other reasons. RCM Utilities is tapped to continue the project to rehab most lift stations in the city. The three stations rehab project comes to \$507,116.84 and is approved in the FY 2023/2024 Budget.

Item 2.3 asked for approval of a \$51,317.50 project by RCM Utilities that would create infrastructure for mounting the tanks and pumps for a new odor control injection site. The site at Fort King Road and U.S. Highway 301 curbs odor from

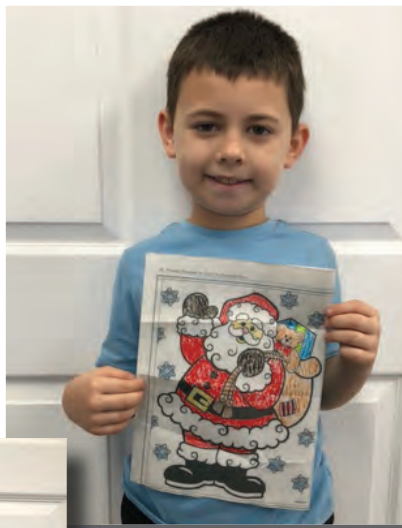

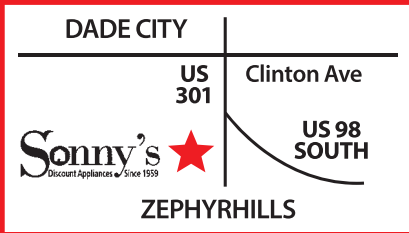

my age, this lodge is a place I can go to and not worry. I come for the camaraderie.”

Another member of the lodge, Paul Weil, a member for 50 years, retired as secretary after 13 years. All new officers were also installed on this day.

Everyone enjoyed coffee, donuts, and fellowship. “This was the best decision of my life,” said Guterman. “It saddens me there is a negative view. We have a light on the bible and believe in the word of God.”

Brian and Sonia Butler attended the installation for the first time. Brian Butler, pastor at St. John’s Missionary Baptist Church is a petitioner. “I wanted to join for the fraternity,” said Butler. A man chooses a path to create the best version of himself guided by other men before him.

“There is always a display of brotherhood, you are always welcome in every lodge and have friends everywhere,” said Shane Hughes, a member from a Maine lodge and resident of Zephyrhills who will be transferring his membership.

The ceremony ended with Master Maixner thanking his fiancé Vive Peteler, his family members, and guests coming despite the weather. “He is excited about this,” said Peteler. “And I am very happy for him.”

“I joined at 50 years old,” said Master Maixner. “I was looking for something where I could meet people that I would not normally have known and help the community. It has been more than that.”

MOMENTS IN TIME: The History Channel

- * On Jan. 22, 2006, Evo Morales became Bolivia's first indigenous president, with a primary focus on fighting poverty and reducing the influence of transnational corporations. As more than half of the country's population identified as indigenous at the time, political analysts drew comparisons with the election of Nelson Mandela to the South African presidency in 1994.
- * On Jan. 23, 1986, the first musical artists were inducted into the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame, including Elvis Presley, James Brown and Ray Charles. Generally, the number of inductees each year ranges from about a half-dozen to a dozen.
- * On Jan. 24, 1908, the first Boy Scout troop was organized by cavalry officer Lieutenant General Robert Baden-Powell in England, who had also written a book called "Scouting for Boys." Two years later, Baden-Powell went on to organize the Girl Guides as a separate entity.
- * On Jan. 25, 2005, more than 300 people died in a stampede at the Mandher Devi Temple in India during the annual Kalubai Jatra pilgrimage, which takes place during the first full moon of January and is marked by animal sacrifices to the goddess Kalubai. The pilgrimage attracts over 350,000 Hindus every year.
- * On Jan. 26, 2014, two white "Peace" doves released by Pope Francis were attacked by a seagull and crow shortly after they were set free. Thousands of people witnessed the attacks, as they had been observing the Pope's Angelus prayer.
- * On Jan. 27, 1944, following the loss of hundreds of thousands of Russian lives, the siege of Leningrad was finally broken after 872 days, during which German forces had allowed no food or medical supplies to enter the country.
- * On Jan. 28, 1917, U.S. forces gave up searching for Mexican revolutionary Pancho Villa after nearly a year, following his massacre of 16 American citizens at Santa Isabel in northern Mexico and another 17 U.S. citizens in Columbus, New Mexico. President Woodrow Wilson had sent U.S. forces into Mexico with orders to capture Villa dead or alive.

a perennial contender for the Wednesday league title, lost its season opener to Forest Lakes RV Park. Before 2021 Hunter's Run dominated on Wednesdays with an impressive streak of six league titles in a span of seven seasons.

"We have all new guys and not too many experienced horseshoe pitchers," said Hunter's Run captain Bryan Jorgensen, who also is president of the Wednesday league.

In 2022, Morningside and Settler's Rest/Sweetwater were co-champions of the Wednesday league. Settler's Rest/Sweetwater was the outright champion the year before that. The previous title for Morningside, based in Dade City, came in 2016.

While Forest Lake Estates won the Tuesday league last season, the team placed fourth in Wednesday's division.

"The league on Wednesday has a lot tougher teams," Frye said.

Tuesday's league includes six teams, down from 10 before the coronavirus pandemic in 2020. There are seven teams that play on Wednesdays.

"Good exercise, good camaraderie," added Forest Lake Estates' Ron Rousseau, who had pitched horseshoes since 2007 and two years ago was his team's most valuable player.

That social aspect is not lost on Seubert, who despite his team finishing at the bottom of the standings last season, had nothing but positive things to say about his teammates.

"All these guys are like my brothers," he said. "We have a good time."

Games usually are over by noon with teams taking a break halfway through for coffee and doughnuts.

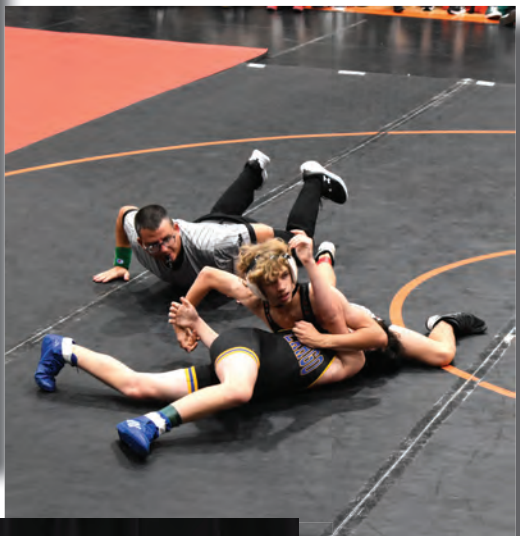

Host Bulldogs, whose previous best finish in the tournament was third, finally win the title

The Fourth Annual Zephyrhills Duals last Saturday featured 12 high school wrestling teams aiming for a win to create some momentum for the stretch run before the start of the postseason.

For their part, the host Bulldogs sought a stronger finish than in the second year when they finished third.

"I feel like it's a good indicator to see where the kids are at before they get to the end of the regular season," Zephyrhills coach Mike Martinez said. "It's to see where the kids are at coming off the (winter) break and see how much they retain. It's a good test."

Consider that test passed with flying colors as Zephyrhills emerged as the champion of its own tournament for the first time. The Bulldogs went 5-0, defeating Citrus 45-34 in the final round. Citrus was the runner-up and Boca Ciega took third.

"Finally," Martinez said of his team's winning effort. "Our guys wrestling with attitude. We're young, but these guys are scrappy."

The Bulldogs have fared well in dual meets this season and improved to 13-1 in that format. Earlier this season, Zephyrhills won the Pasco Hillsborough Duals at Wiregrass Ranch. Leading the way in that event was senior Juliem Toribio, who posted a 4-1 record in the 165-pound weight class.

Other strong efforts were turned in by Jared Apple and Lucas Gillespie, who split time at heavyweight and push one another in practices, along with Nader Saka, a sophomore at 138.

"He just shows up to practice every day,"

the coach said of Saka. "He's a hard worker."

As for the Zephyrhills Duals, Gavin Alexander was the top wrestler for the home team. At 150, he pinned all four of his opponents. Apple, at 215, and Toribio, who competed at 175, each went 3-0. Wrestling in the 285 class, Gillespie won three of his four matches.

Martinez also had strong praise for Caleb Castorena, who sent 3-2 at 157. One of those losses came against Pasco's Vincent Contreras, a state qualifier last year.

Freshman Hunter Wade started strong by winning his first two matches in the 113 class. He rallied to defeat a Largo opponent and won by a pin, noting that his goal this year is to qualify for the state tourney.

Aside from the top three teams, Wesley Chapel came in sixth, Cypress Creek placed seventh and Pasco wound up in the eighth spot. Wesley Chapel has competed in all four Zephyrhills Duals with rival Pasco entering the competition for the second time.

Although their teams did not fare as well as the hosts, Wesley Chapel coach Dan Fleshood and Cypress Creek coach Alan Walsh addressed the importance of gaining valuable experience for the stretch run.

"It's just more matches; just trying to work things out and set up for the postseason, and getting as much mat time as we can," said Fleshood, a former Zephyrhills assistant.

Added Walsh, "Hopefully this will get everybody back" in action after the winter break. "We need to add some matches in here. We need to get back in the swing of things."

Neighboring Wiregrass Ranch did not compete in the Zephyrhills Duals, opting to send six girls to the Wildcat Scramble at Mckee Academy in Polk County. Zephyrhills' Naomi Brady, a senior at 140; Kendall Bray, a 135-pound sophomore; and Bailey Cross, a junior in the 126 class; also went to that tourney with assistant coach Dan Light.

The next big battle for local teams is King of the Chapel on Jan. 29. Wiregrass Ranch hosts that tourney, which will include Wesley Chapel, Cypress Creek and Zephyrhills.

Schools were closed on Tuesday

Potential for severe weather led to Pasco County School District closing schools but city government remained open

While the National Weather Service issued warnings for coastal flooding on Tuesday, that did not adversely affect east and central Pasco communities. What did, however, were strong winds that led to some closures in Zephyrhills, Dade City and the county.

By late Monday, the Pasco County School District consulted with Pasco County Emergency Management officials in response to weather forecasts for high winds and rain. As a result, the county's public schools and all extracurricular activities were closed for that day.

On a related note, Wednesday had been scheduled to be an early release day but due to Tuesday's closures Wednesday was changed to a full day of instructions and activities.

Severe thunderstorms with the potential for flooding and tornadoes for parts of northern Florida led to the warning by the National

Weather Service. Winds were expected to reach 70 miles per hour with hail and flooding posing serious threats to many communities throughout the state.

Earlier on Tuesday, reports came in about tornadoes touching down in the Florida panhandle and parts of southern Georgia.

Additionally, Governor Ron DeSantis issued a state of emergency for 49 counties to get ahead of severe weather impacts. Pasco, along with neighboring Hernando, Hillsborough, Pinellas and Polk were among the counties on that list.

DeSantis' executive order also called for the National Guard to be activated as needed to deal with emergencies. As of Tuesday afternoon, that had not been implanted, although winds picked up a bit in Zephyrhills with rain coming later that afternoon.

For city officials, it was "business as usual," according to public information officer Kevin Weiss. "It's been a regular workday."

Zephyrhills City manager Billy Poe went home for lunch on Tuesday and drove around parts of the city to check on conditions.

"We're really just monitoring," he said, noting that winds were expected to increase and rain was in the forecast for later that afternoon. "I'm hoping it's just a quick event and not very eventful."

a force main moving wastewater from a large portion of the west side of the city. An odor control treatment process has been used for the last seven years and staff has been looking for a location to place the product so that it functions more effectively.

Item 2.4 asked for approval to purchase two AMI R900 Gateways, meter reading collectors. Staff identified areas where missed meter readings occur and these gateways or collectors will help signals find the meter reading antenna. The cost for the collectors is \$75,998.00 from Ferguson Waterworks and is under the \$76,000 FY23-24 Budget.

Item 2.5 asked council to sign a Hazard Mitigation Grant that would waive the City's Sub-Recipient Management Costs. The grant, submitted by the utilities department, is for 10 permanent emergency generators specific to lift stations to prevent sewer overflow during emergencies. The project request is for \$1.3 million. While the grant covers most of it, the local share portion is \$325,000.

Item 2.6 asked for approval of the purchase of a flatbed truck from Alan Jay Fleet Sales for the sanitation division. The purchase price is not-to-exceed \$74,345.

Item 2.7 asked for approval to purchase an emergency generator. Stormwater Pumping Station No. 5 at 1st Street and 14th Avenue does not have backup emergency power. The purchase would create backup power for the pumping station at a cost of \$146,171.11.

Item 2.8 asked for approval of the ranking selection in response to a recent Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for professional services relating to re-accreditation services. While seven firms downloaded the RFQ, only one responded, Frank Ruggiero Consultants, LLC. The evaluation committee ranked the firm 285 out of a possible 300 points. With only one respondent, the item asked that the city move ahead with the \$60,000 budgeted project.

Item 2.9 asked for approval of a consultation agreement for management of ZPD accreditation. ZPD became accredited in October of last year. In order to maintain certification, ZPD must seek recertification every three years. ZPD would like to hire a full-time on-site accreditation manager. The amount of the contract is \$60,000 annually for a term of three years.

Item 2.10 asked for approval of a mutual aid agreement with the Tampa Police Department, the purpose is to provide a method to quickly obtain assistance during or after an incident. For instance, ZPD would utilize the City of Tampa's Bomb Squad for disposal of an incendiary device. There is no fiscal impact on this item.

All 10 of these items were bundled together and passed 5-0.

Business Item 3.1 asked for council's approval of a text amendment to the Land Development Code (LDC) adding some clarity and changes to turn lane standards. Kimley-Horn worked to develop these standards. They went off of Hillsborough County criteria that stipulated when a left turn lane would be needed on a roadway. The standards for adding either a left or right turn lane are:

1. If more than 20 left-turning vehicles per hour on a two-lane arterial or collector roadway, then left-turn lanes are warranted.
2. On multi-lane roadways, left-turn lanes shall be constructed when there are more than 20 left-turning vehicles.
3. If more than 50 right-turning vehicles per hour on a two-lane arterial or collector roadway, then right-turn lanes are warranted.
4. If more than 40 right-turning vehicles per hour on a four-lane rural roadway, then a right turn lane is warranted.
5. If more than 80 right-turning vehicles per hour on a four-lane urban roadway, then a right-turn lane is warranted.
6. If more than 60 right-turning vehicles per hour on a six-lane rural roadway, then a right-turn lane is warranted.
7. If more than 100 right-turning vehicles per hour on a six-lane urban roadway, then a right-turn lane is warranted.

Another part of the standards changed requirements to conduct traffic studies. The changes would allow for a Traffic Impact Study (TIS) at less than or equal to 100 gross PM (Post Meridian) peak hour trips and would allow for a Traffic Impact Analysis (TIA) with more than 100 gross PM peak hours trips on a particular roadway. During the presentation, several "hot spots" in the city were identified. The goal is to set standards when developers apply for projects that will have an impact on traffic. If an applicant is putting a project in a certain proximity of what has been identified as a "hot spot," they will have to conduct a traffic study to take them into account.

Naturally, many of the "hot spots" were along U.S. Highway 301. A "hot zone" exists east-west between U.S. Highway 301 and Wire Road and north-south between Kossik Road and almost all the way to Daughtery Road. Another "hot spot" exists near the apex of U.S. Highway 301 and State Road 39 at Chancey Road.

"I like that we're looking at these hot spots, we know where they are," said councilman Ken Burgess. "Plus our peak time isn't spring break, it's more November to spring." Council members were well aware of the hot spots, Councilman Steve Spina noted one on Eiland Boulevard where the turn to go into the East Pasco YMCA is located, that was not on the map.

Item 3.1 was a non-action item but the consensus was to move forward with the requirements.

In the City Manager's Report, Item 4.1 simply asked for council's approval of an event permit for the Feb. 10 Pigz in Zhills event that would allow for alcohol sales and a "wet zone." This item was approved 5-0.

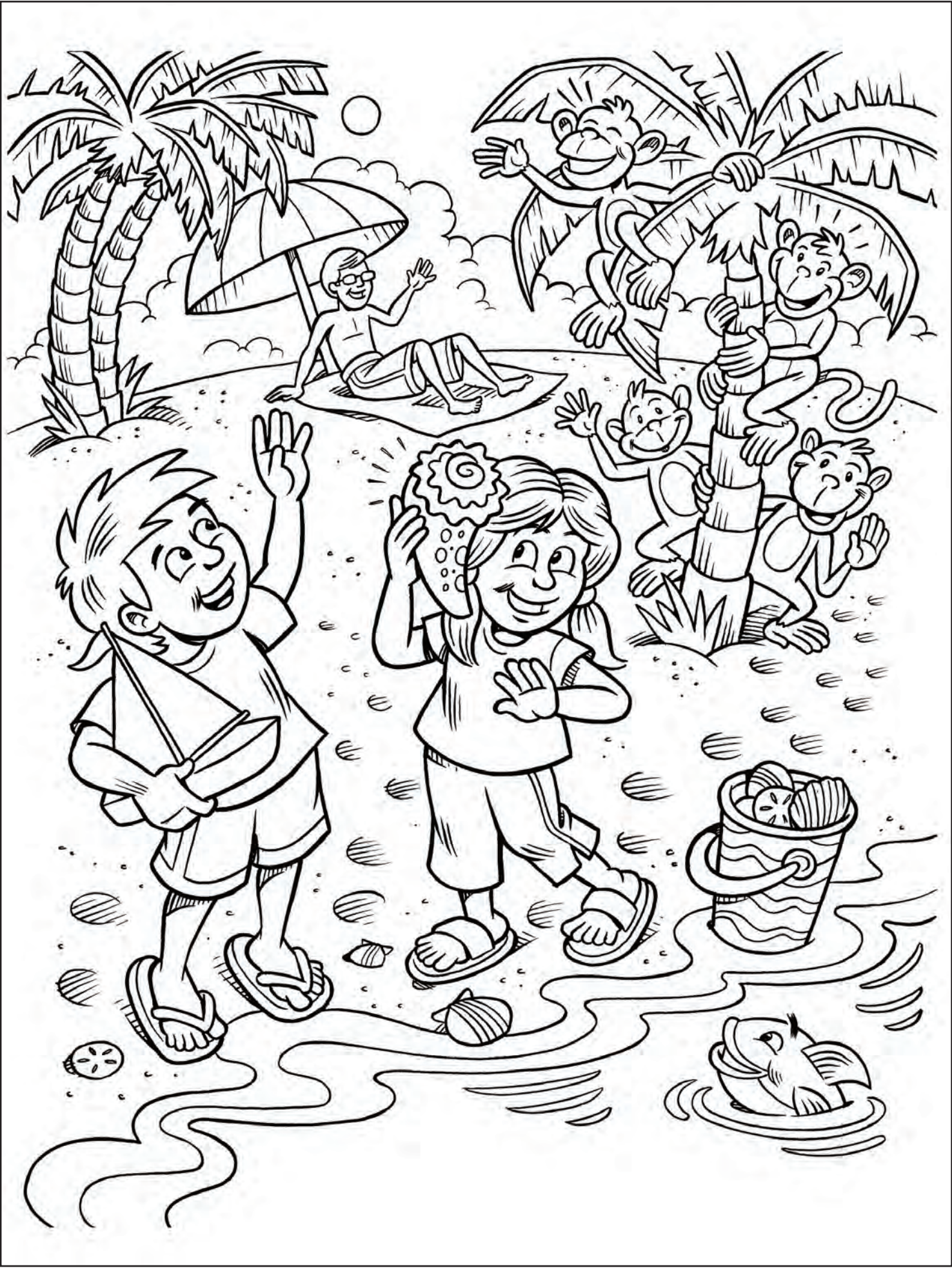
