Making cane syrup highlights festival

Pioneer Florida Museum hosts the annual festival with demonstrations of making cane sugar syrup

The Pioneer Florida Museum and Village Annual Raising Cane and Moonshine Festival, demonstrates how to make sugar cane syrup out of sugar cane. The Southern Syrup-Makers Association demonstrated the process and at the moonshine still, you heard stories of moonshiners.

"We come every year to meet the moonshine guy," said Cynthia Whitt. "We get a sample and a picture taken with him."

Attendees sampled moonshine by modern day distillers. The Point Distillery was available for you to taste their samples and learn their process. Recently,

they became the official distiller for the Rolling Stones brand, called Fire Hurricane.

At the church, Frederick Wolfe was caned chairs. "I've been doing this for quite a while and enjoy it," said Frederick Wolfe. Inside the church, Barbara Wolfe explained the history of the church.

"The Original church was built in 1878 and lasted until 1904 when the building caught on fire. Still remaining was the original floor, walls, and ceiling," said Barbara. "Pastor Parker was the original member of the church. He was a circuit rider and preached all the way to Leesburg by horse."

A few Zephyrhills residents were in the church. "We are having fun," said Dawn Raffer. "There are so many interesting things to see."

Throughout the grounds the music of The Geared Up Band and The Barking Dogs were heard. Far and wide vendors sold homemade foods like corn cheese, a corn cake with mozzarella cheese inside; homemade honey; cinnamon nuts and pickles.

MLK Parade brings people to downtown Dade City

Heisman Trophy runner-up Michael Penix Jr., who quarterback Washington to a national title game, is honored as the grand marshal

When it comes to grand marshals for parades, hometown heroes often are chosen. Dade City upheld that tradition by selecting Michael Penix Jr. as grand marshal for its Martin Luther King Jr. Parade.

Last Saturday's parade traveled through the downtown streets with the obligatory marches and floats. Some represented schools and local businesses while others honored the legacy of the slain civil rights leader and minister, which has been done nationwide since 1986.

The loudest applause was reserved for Michael Penix Jr., a football standout from Dade City who led the University of Washington to the national championship game six days prior to the parade.

At the conclusion of the annual procession people gathered around the fountain for a ceremony at the footsteps of the Old Dade City Courthouse. Aside from prayers and talk of respect and love for one another, the highlight was the

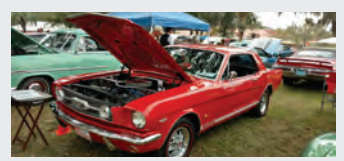

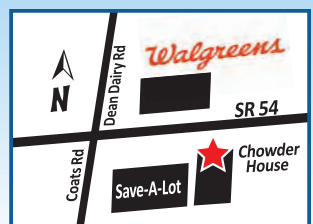

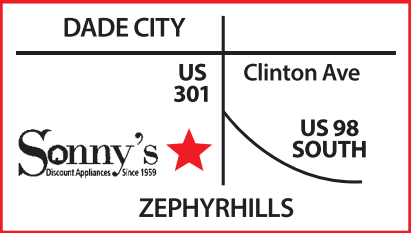

Pasco County Mosquito Control Department taught the science of the different types of mosquitos and how they exterminate them.

The Allen Family had a sibling competition at Molly Hatchet. "We bought family seasons passes," said Mr. Allen. "They were worth every penny." Olivia and Robert competed with a 9-5 win by Robert. "I got one right next to the bullseye," said Robert. "It's lots of fun throwing axes."

The Barthle family watched a demonstration of a bicycle contraption that punched designs in wood. The family flew in from Birmingham, Ala. precisely for the festival. "We are visiting for the weekend. Finley flew in a plane for the first time," said Kenzi. "It is fun to let her see different things and learn the history of Dade City."

The General Store housed canned goods, washboards, fabrics, pickles, and a spot to play checkers by the wood stove. "I love teaching the history here," Val Elder, a retired teacher, talked about C.C. Smith being a postmaster, so he included the post office in his store.

A unique vendor sold Hoe cakes which got

the name from the workers that were given a ration of corn meal while working. "They formed the cake, heated up the hoe in the ground and cooked the commmeal," said Linda. "Sometimes they would add water to make it last longer."

The process of making sugar cane syrup is by scraping the foam off the top of the liquid in the bin. "It gets the impurities, keeps it clean and pure," they explained. "It cooks for about three to three and a half hours up to a certain temperature."

Paul Blake demonstrated the extraction of juice from sugar canes as he passed the stalk through an old-fashioned grinder, where sweet juice filled a bucket. "I am doing this to keep the heritage alive," said Blake. "What is fascinating about what I do is I like to watch the kids and see their faces light up when they make the connection to the past."

"We want to preserve history and engage the public in history during these events as a family experience," said Hannah Schult. "When you learn in school, you learn to memorize dates and it is boring. Here, we are the visual aide for better memory experiences to make it more exciting."

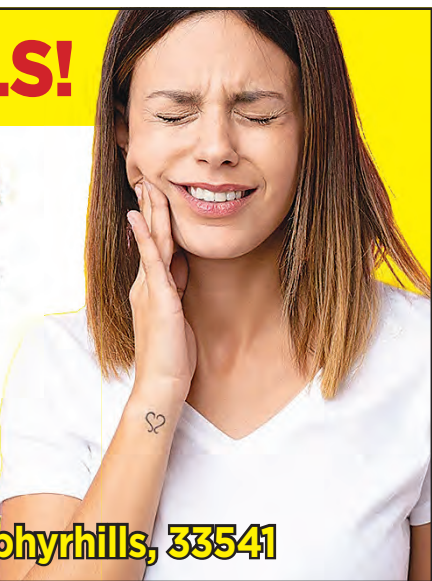

MOMENTS IN TIME: The History Channel

- * On Jan. 29, 1845, Edgar Allan Poe’s poem “The Raven” was published in The Evening Mirror in New York. The eerie work, which earned its author the sum of \$9, was both panned and praised by critics and parodied soon after its publication, but remains one of the most popular poems in literary history.
- * On Jan. 30, 1862, the first American ironclad warship, the USS Monitor, was launched into the East River. Construction of the vessel was inspired by talk of the Confederate Navy’s building an impenetrable ironclad that could break the Union’s blockade of the port city of Hampton Roads, Virginia.
- * On Jan. 31, 1747, the first clinic for treatment of venereal diseases opened at London Lock Hospital. Unfortunately, its cure methods were ineffectual, with mercury (and its highly debilitating side effects) being the most common.
- * On Feb. 1, 1587, England’s Queen Elizabeth I signed the death warrant for her cousin, Mary, Queen of Scots, after Mary was found guilty of being “not only accessory and privy to the conspiracy, but also an imaginer and compass of her majesty’s destruction.” In her final days, Elizabeth admitted to regret about the order.
- * On Feb. 2, 1970, British mathematician, logician and philosopher Bertrand Russell, who is considered the founder of analytic philosophy and won the Nobel Prize in Literature for his idealism- and humanitarianism-themed writings, died at his home in Wales at the age of 97.
- * On Feb. 3, 1994, President Bill Clinton lifted the trade embargo that had been in place on the Republic of Vietnam for 19 years, following the capture of Saigon by North Vietnamese troops during the Vietnam War.
- * On Feb. 4, 2010, Barack Obama’s 57-year-old Kenyan aunt, Zeituni Onyango, appeared at a court in Boston for a second attempt to gain political asylum in the U.S., but the hearing ended without an immediate decision. Ms. Onyango had moved to America in 2000, and her first asylum application was rejected four years later, with an order for her deportation. Her immigration status would become an issue during Obama’s election campaign.

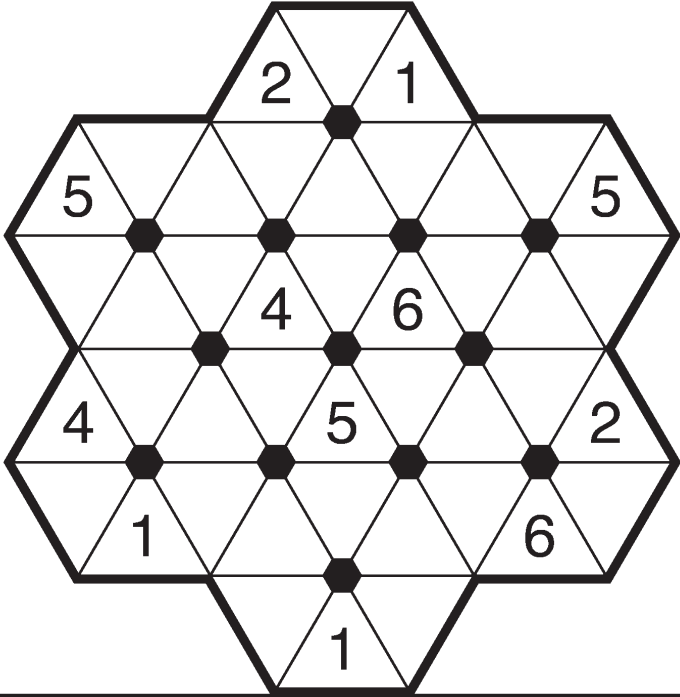

introduction of Penix Jr.
“Dade City is truly blessed,” Mayor Jim Shive said while reading a proclamation. “Little Mike, you have brought glory to Dade City. You’re an outstanding example for this community and the nation.”
Shive extolled the virtues of “Little Mike,” who at the age of 5 was the most valuable player for the Dade City Pirates of the Pasco Police Athletic League. The mayor also spoke of the football player’s progression to Pasco Middle then Pasco High, where he spent two years quarterbacking the Pirates before transferring to Tampa Bay Tech and winning the Guy Toph Award as the best football player in Hillsborough County.
The career of Penix Jr. continued with his stellar play at Indiana University before a transfer to Washington. Aside from leading the Huskies to the national championship game Penix Jr. finished as the runner-up in Heisman Trophy voting, an award given to the best college football player of the year.
“I’m blessed to have been brought up (in Dade City). It has made me the young man I am today,” said Penix Jr., who this season passed for 4,648 yards and is expected to be a top pick in this year’s National Football League Draft. “I love this community and I am super thankful for you all.”

Penix fought through some adversity to become the first Heisman Trophy finalist from Pasco County and the Tampa Bay area. He overcame two season-ending knee surgeries in college. Following a semifinal win over Texas he and his Washington teammates had their hearts broken with the loss to national champion Michigan.
Penix Jr., who also received the Maxwell Award as the nation’s best player in his junior season at Washington, was remembered by family, friends, former athletes who played with him and others.
Darrell Davis, a Cypress Creek football assistant, recalled Penix Jr. being his water boy at Pasco High. Davis went on to play wide receiver at North Carolina State.
Willie Broner, Pasco High’s former athletic director who coached Penix Jr.’s father Mike in basketball, spoke proudly of the father-son duo and the impact their successes have had on the east Pasco community. Mike, who was in the crowd with his wife Takisha, was a 1,200-yard rusher for Pasco (Class of 1991) before playing as a defensive back for Tennessee Tech. He later coached football at Pasco Middle and was an assistant at Pasco High.
“This is good for the kids in the community,” said Broner, whose now-adult children were successful athletes and coaches at Pasco High in their own rights. “If he can do it then that gives them hope that others can do the same thing.”

Bulldogs improve to 3-2 in mercy rule decisions with a recent rout of the Raiders

When a soccer team goes ahead by eight goals in the second half of a game the Florida High School Athletic Association mandates that it must end at that point. The Zephyrhills girls are quite familiar with those situations.

Last Thursday, the host Bulldogs routed South Sumter 8-0 in a match that ended with more than six minutes remaining in regulation. So far this season, they have won three times and lost twice in those situations.

First-year coach Adalys Alvarez, who played soccer at Trinity Catholic near Ocala and graduated in 2005, helps the girls keep those lopsided results in proper perspective. Aside from the South Sumter game Zephyrhills has 8-0 wins over Academy at the Lakes and Anclote.

"It's nice because there was a stretch in there when we were getting worked," she said, alluding to 8-0 losses against Land O' Lakes and Sunlake. "When you get a win like that it boosts morale. They're having fun."

Even when the Bulldogs have been behind by large deficits, Alvarez noted that they do not sulk or give up.

"I've been impressed by their willingness to stay in the fight and play their best," she said.

There was plenty of confidence on display in the victory over South Sumter. Zephyrhills built a 6-0 halftime lead and cruised to an easy victory by adding two goals in the second half. The team improved to 6-5 overall and is on the verge of a second straight winning season.

The Bulldogs endured 13 straight losing seasons before going 11-8 last year. The previous winning season came in 2008-09 when Zephyrhills went 16-7-1 and was led by Sunshine Ath-

letic Conference Player of the Year Brandi Mira.
"They recognize that they're improving."

"They recognize that they're improving," Alvarez said of the current squad.

Seniors Chloe Price and Ashley Ford paced the offensive attack against South Sumter. Price had four goals and an assist with Ford adding three goals and three assists. Price leads the team with 19 goals and 42 points while Ford has five goals and 16 points.

"They've played enough together that they just vibe really well," Alvarez said.

Price, who also kicked for the school's football team in the fall, came within two goals of her single-game career high. The senior striker scored six times in a game last season.

Perhaps the most significant goal against the Raiders came off the foot of Cheyenne Dempsey, who stuffed home a rebound on a back-door play off a feed from Price. The team immediately celebrated the sophomore midfielder's first goal of the season.

"Every game I'm like, Cheyenne, back-door, back-door," Alvarez said of advising Dempsey to star near the far post when Price takes a shot. "Be ready for the back-door."

Due to injuries and departures for various reasons, Zephyrhills, which began the season with 21 players, now has a roster of just 14.

"It's been tough keeping players so far," the coach said.

One of those players lost was Mia Morales, who had six goals and 13 points. A key player helping to take up the slack in the scoring department, however, is Sar Rios, a sophomore midfielder with five goals and 18 points.

Making matters tougher against South Sumter was that four competed for Zephyrhills in the Sunshine Athletic Conference girls weightlifting meet before the game. Savanna Best and Alleona Searight came back while the South Sumter match was going on, but Tori Goodman and Corryn Graham did not.

On the back end for Zephyrhills, goalkeeper Jenna Goodman made a handful of saves to notch her third shutout of the season.

"I have been playing since I was four or five years old with his uncle," said Keefer. "He taught me. I won the New York State Elders Championship in 2014. Two brothers from Dubuque, the oldest city in Iowa, participate on the Forest Lake RV team together.

Q:How is Jeremy Renner doing since his terrible leg injury? Is he going to continue acting soon? -- D.N.

A: Fortunately, two-time Oscar-nominated actor Jeremy Renner will be able to work again after nearly losing his life this past year after being run over by a snowplow on his property. He suffered injuries to his chest and limbs, but has since made a substantial recovery. He recently appeared on CNN's "New Year's Eve Live" show and told hosts Andy Cohen and Anderson Cooper that he's due back on the set of his Paramount+ series "Mayor of Kingstown."

He said that he had a lot of loved ones to live for, including his 10-year-old daughter and the nephew he saved from being hit by the snowplow in his driveway. In addition to acting, Renner is releasing a song called "Wait" that is dedicated to his daughter. It's the first single from his upcoming EP, "Love and Titanium," which will be released on Jan. 19.

Q:When is the "Game of Thrones" spinoff about Jon Snow coming out? I read a while back that Kit Harington will once again be playing the character. Is this still happening? -- A.P.

A:According to Casey Bloys, CEO and chairman of HBO, there are several "GoT" spinoff series in development, but none is "close to a green light or anything ... but we are always working on different scripts and ideas." That doesn't sound too promising, but an article on TVLine assures us that a series based on Jon Snow starring Kit Harington is one of those projects "in the works."

Meanwhile, "House of the Dragon," a "GoT" prequel series, will be back on HBO for its second season this summer. One of the characters from that show

is being given his own series -- Corlys Velaryon, played by Steve Toussaint. Titled "Nine Voyages," the series was originally going to be live-action, but will now be animated due to the "budgetary constraints" involved in filming a show that takes place at sea with "different ports each week."

"GoT" author and "House of the Dragon" creator George R.R. Martin says that there are actually three additional animated series in the works. He added: "There's a whole world out there. And we have a lot better chance of showing it all with animation."

Q: Why did "Jeopardy" get rid of Mayim Bialik as one of the hosts? She was my favorite. -- Y.T.

A:Mayim Bialik was dealt a double blow this past year. Her latest sitcom, "Call Me Kat," was canceled by Fox after three seasons, and she also lost her job as co-host of the popular syndicated game show "Jeopardy." According to TV Insider, Sony claimed that the decision to fire her was to "maintain continuity" for viewers by only having one host -- Ken Jennings. However, rumor has it that Sony wasn't happy with her when she refused to host the show during the writers' and actors' strikes.

Hopefully, she'll be returning to our screens soon. She's reportedly been working on a reboot of "Blossom," the sitcom that launched her career in the '90s.
