Broadway comes to Zephyrhills via the Lions club and Wesley Chapel Theater Group. When serving the community, organizers are always looking for new and creative ways to serve the community. The Lions club discovered a way.

"How could we utilize the facility better? We have bingo and that is our lifeline for our sight programs," said Christine Malone. "We had conversation with the Zephyrhills Chamber. They told us about a new theater group, and we have a big stage."

"This is so exciting," said Linda Dechichio, president of WCTG. "The Lions club has done so much for us with publicity, marketing, wanting to be a business partner and they have made us feel so welcome and at home." Members of the theater group have joined the Lions club.

"Tonight's show is basically a cabaret with different numbers. It is Broadway from the 40s, 50s and 60s," said Rodney Bueno, director. "Broadway through Decades. We hope everyone comes back because this is part one, we are working on part two

## City hall hosts Arbor Day ceremony

*Garden Gate Garden Club continues longstanding tradition in Zephyrhills*

Celebrated nationally since 1872 and taking place in April in most parts of the country, Arbor Day was recognized locally last Friday afternoon at city hall. People gathered around seven trees located around the library, adjacent to city hall.

Zephyrhills, which has been a Tree City for the past 20 years, has held an Arbor Day Ceremony every year since 1989. Traditionally, a local person has had a tree planted in his or her honor, but this year was no different.

Unlike in years past when one tree was planted at a location within the city limits — like last year when a tree was planted in Zephyr Park in recognition for the local Meals on Wheels program and accepted by executive director Beth Akers — this year's ceremony was highlighted by six trees being rededicated with a new one planted to honor a longtime Garden Gate Garden Club member.

According to Shane LeBlanc, the city's public works director, all seven trees are cathedral oaks, a popular variety that is adapted to drought conditions.

"When we built the new city hall, some of the trees were taken out," he said. "These plantings are going to last a lifetime. It's kind of a living memorial, so to speak."

The rededicated trees honor six local people: current councilman and former two-time city manager Steve Spina; Rick Moore, the city's former public works director who spent 30 years working for the city; three former presidents of the Garden Gate Garden Club in Liz Gejger (four years), Joan Arnot (six years) and Pat Bailey (four years); along with Betty Stout, who was the club's treasurer for 16 years.

Additionally, one of the cathedral oaks was planted in recognition of George and Eileen Sowa. Married for 67 years (George passed away in 2022), the Sows, who were from New Jersey, owned the Best Western Magnuson Hotel since 1978. Now

## Bulldogs honor coach Smith with a pre-game ceremony

*Zephyrhills, which opted out of a tournament over the winter break, returned to the court to romp over Tenoroc from Polk County*

With the loss of their beloved coach weighing heavy on their hearts, the Zephyrhills High girls basketball team returned to Alan Reed Court last Thursday and honored the late Chris Smith with a pre-game ceremony. Smith, 50, passed away over the winter break.

"It was tough to come to practice," said Antwon Gildon, who along with Kim Miller began the season as assistants to Smith but now share coaching duties. "We're all in a daze."

The Bulldogs went on to rout Tenoroc 62-12 in one of their most lopsided victories of the season.

As for the game against Tenoroc, Zephyrhills dominated from the outset by taking a 23-0 lead in the first quarter and leading by a substantial 42-10 margin at halftime. With backups playing most of the second half, the Bulldogs still wound up with a favorable 20-2 scoring advantage after the break.



renamed as the Roadstar Hotel, three generations have managed the 52-room building off Gall Boulevard.

"It was an honor," said Eileen following last week's ceremony. "I was so touched. I couldn't believe it."

During many Arbor Day ceremonies over the years, the Sowas paid for trees to be planted at various locations throughout the city. They also provided meeting rooms for the garden club when parking and meeting at people's homes were difficult at times.

"We just took care of people in our town," said Eileen, who in 1987 joined the garden club. At various times she served as the vice president, a secretary and hostess.





## MOMENTS IN TIME: The History Channel

- \* On Feb. 5, 1922, DeWitt and Lila Wallace self-published and marketed the first Reader's Digest magazine, designed to provide abridged articles on a wide variety of subjects for easy reading. It eventually gained a circulation of more than 10 million copies in the U.S. and is still believed to be the best-selling consumer magazine in the country.
- \* On Feb. 6, 1911, Ronald Reagan was born in Tampico, Illinois. Reagan spent 30 years as an entertainer in radio, film and television before winning the California governor's seat in 1966. Elected as America's 40th president in 1980, he survived an assassination attempt and became the most popular president since Franklin D. Roosevelt.
- \* On Feb. 7, 1301, King Edward I of England gave his son Edward (later King Edward II) the title of Prince of Wales. Edward I had conquered Wales and ordered the execution of David III, the last native Prince of Wales, in 1283. To this day the title "Prince of Wales" is reserved exclusively for the heir apparent to the British throne.
- \* On Feb. 8, 1983, a 5-year-old thoroughbred stallion named Shergar was stolen from a stud farm owned by the Aga Khan in County Kildare, Ireland. Worth a stunning \$13.5 million and commanding stud fees of approximately \$100,000, the animal was never seen again. No ransom was paid and the case was never solved.
- \* On Feb. 9, 2008, Turkey's parliament approved two constitutional amendments easing the ban on women wearing Islamic headscarves in universities. While the government claimed the ban would result in many girls being denied an education, the secular establishment saw it as a step in allowing a more prominent Islamic influence on the state.
- \* On Feb. 10, 1942, Glenn Miller became the first artist to win a gold record award, for his single "Chattanooga Choo Choo." The tune was featured in the 1941 movie "Sun Valley Serenade" and inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame in 1996.
- \* On Feb. 11, 1990, Nelson Mandela was released from a South African prison after serving 27 years of a life sentence on charges of attempting to overthrow the apartheid government. Four years later, he was elected president in the country's first all-race elections.







That outcome likely would have made the late coach extremely proud of his players. Smith coached the Bulldogs for six-plus seasons before his recent passing.

"The way to show him was to play hard," said Smith's wife, Alexis, noting that her late husband always pushed his players to do their best while he always sought to give them plenty of recognition.

Before the game, Jimmy Campbell, whose children have played basketball and other sports at Zephyrhills High, read a touching speech while a slide show of Smith played on a screen near the stage. He referred to Smith as "a remarkable individual who 'left an indelible mark, revitalizing the girls basketball program and restoring the team to a formidable force within the community.'"

Before Smith took over, the girls basketball program had struggled for quite some time with 10 straight losing seasons marking a lackluster run. Under Smith's tenure the Bulldogs went 75-58, made it to the playoffs five times and were district runners-up two times.

That winning stretch ended last season when Zephyrhills won just twice but the team is in the midst of a turnaround with a 10-6 record. That win total might have been greater but the Bulldogs opted to pull out of a tournament over

the winter break with Miller and Gildon reasoning that they, the players as well as those in the school needed time to mourn the loss of Smith.

Maya Llanes, who showed up for the ceremony, was the 2001 Sunshine Athletic Conference Player of the Year in 2021 with Smith being named the conference's top coach that season.

Also among former players, which included some who played for Smith and others from when before he took over the program, was Mikayla Cintron. The former Zephyrhills forward, a 2022 graduate, has come back to help as a volunteer coach during some of the team's practices.

"Devastating," is how she described the loss of Smith, who often took shots and was active on the court during the team's practices. "He was so healthy."

"He was a mentor and a leader," said Campbell, noting how much Smith had an impact on his players. "He instilled the principles of unity, accountability, camaraderie and respect in his players and staff."

Following the Zephyrhills win over Tenoroc, players, coaches, family members and some former players gathered at mid-court for a large group photo.

In remembrance of Smith, a seat on the team's bench will include a photo of Smith, along with red and black balloons for the remainder of this season.



*Boys game followed dominating 56-16 win by the Zephyrhills girls team in rare basketball doubleheader*

minutes left in the second quarter as T.J. Gebru found Karson Mathis all alone under the basket for an uncontested layup. By halftime, Zephyrhills led 32-11 and by the end of the third quarter that increased to 58-16, which led to a running clock for the rest of the game.

Led by Jeremiah Clark's game-high 18 points, three Zephyrhills players scored in double figures. Joseph Stosh added 17 and Messiah McKinley had 13. On the other end of the spectrum, Pasco's Zion DeJesus and Gebru shared their team lead with just four points.

Zephyrhills, which also beat Pasco in a 76-47 blowout earlier this season, evened its record at 9-9 while struggling Pasco dropped to 4-11.

Novak purposely scheduled some formidable opponents this season, which included taking on strong teams in the Nature Coast Christmas Classic, to challenge his players and prepare for what could be a deep playoff run. Zephyrhills hosts this year's district tournament, a series that includes defending champion Wesley Chapel.

"We're playing a really tough schedule. Hopefully that will help us moving forward," said Novak, adding that against Pasco "the defense was there, for sure. Overall, we have a better offensive team this year."

As for the Zephyrhills girls, they clobbered Pasco 56-16, taking a 32-7 halftime lead and ending early with a running clock just like the boys game. That gave the Bulldogs a 10-6 record heading down the stretch.

Jade King scored a game-high 19 points with Zephyrhills teammates Elle Jindra and Tim'mia Clemons each adding 10. Next were Najah Gildon and Haley Rich with six and five points, respectively.

The girls team continues to be coached by Miller and Antwon Gildon, who were assistants before the passing of head coach Chris Smith during the winter break. Smith coached the Bulldogs for six seasons and was instrumental in turning around a team that had lost a lot.

"We don't look at it like he's not here," Gildon said. "It's just a continuation of what we did. He's still here with us."

Longtime rivals Zephyrhills and Pasco have had their share of intense and meaningful clashes on the basketball court. The boys game last Friday night in Dade City was not one of them as the Bulldogs dominated in a 62-21 win.

Due to the girls teams from both schools playing as part of a doubleheader, however, the stands were filled with fans from both cities in the latest version of the 9-Mille War.

Zephyrhills boys coach Mike Novak and Zephyrhills girls coach Kim Miller recalled days gone by when they were players. Back then, the crowds were plentiful for their respective series.

"When we got together it was a packed house," recalled Novak, a 1981 Pasco graduate whose teams went 83-5 in his three varsity seasons.

Novak noted that in his junior year the Pirates were unbeaten before Zephyrhills halted that streak late in the season with a basket in the final second. He also remembered the rivals playing for a district title.

"We used to have so many fans that both layers of the stands would come out, because they were good and we were good," recalled Miller, a 1996 Zephyrhills graduate.

The Bulldogs were so good in the boys game that the starters only played the first and third quarters with the backups taking the court for the second and fourth frames.

"Everybody needs to play," Novak said. "Some of those guys haven't got to play as much, so it was good that everybody got to play."

Zephyrhills raced out to a 19-0 lead before Pasco got its first basket. It came with two




