Chamber of Commerce moves from venue adjacent to the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport to 5th Avenue

Long held at a venue adjacent to the Zephyrhills Municipal Airport, Pigz in Z'hills relocated to the downtown corridor. The primary fundraiser for the Zephyrhills

Chamber of Commerce, now in its 14th year, likely has found a new home — permanently.

'We wanted to move it downtown to help the merchants. That's the whole purpose of our chamber," said Vicki Wiggins, the chamber's executive director. "I think it will (remain downtown in the future) because we've had a great response."

Several people with downtown connections, business owners and civic leaders lauded the chamber for its decision to relocate the popular barbecue

"I think it has huge benefits for the local economy. These businesses are packed out," Kim Barker, a Main Street Zephyrhills board member, said from her Vitis Realty booth along 5th Avenue. "Even though it's a chamber event we love it because it's going to benefit all the businesses here."

We all have the power to save lives, but only 36 percent of the world donates blood. Why? The greatest reason is because they have not been asked. Southport Springs Community takes donating blood to a new level of community service.

We have been told by OneBlood that we are their most successful donor group in the area, if not the state," said Joe Grigelevich, the community's organizer. "While other locations are lucky to bring in a half dozen donors, we consistently average more

The 12th Annual Hittin' the Road for Hospice benefits Gulfside Hospice's patients and their families

In all, more than 150 riders took part in the annual poker run for Gulfside Hospice. This year's total amount, which benefits hospice patients and their families, came to more than \$22,000.

Since the ride's inception, Carla Armstrong, Gulfside Hospice's director of philanthropy, said more than \$200,000 has been raised for the charitable cause. As for the local Moose Lodge, their members have







* On Feb. 26, 1917, the Original Dixieland Jass (later Jazz) Band recorded "Livery Stable Blues," the world's first jazz record, for the Victor Talking Machine Company in New York. On Feb. 29, 2012, Davy Jones, a former teen idol and singer for The Monkees, died of a heart attack at the age of 66. Jones starred with his bandmates in a popular TV series and a few other shows during his career, later returning to his first passion of horses and


On March 1, 2008, Britain's Prince Harry, who had been sent secretly to Afghanistan with his regiment in December at his request, was forced to return to Britain after the American website the Drudge Report made his deployment public.

On March 2, 1969, the supersonic airliner and joint British/French project Concorde set off on its maiden flight, reaching 10,000 feet and 300 mph. It would be another seven years before the plane began commercial flights, which continued until 2003, when it was retired from service.



who have donated. A flyer is placed in the new residents Welcome Kit. Those that have given are honored with recognition in the Southport Sun newsletter.

Make sure to eat a light meal, bring your photo ID, a list of your medications, wear a short-sleeved shirt and answer a questionnaire along with getting your vitals, ie. blood pressure, temperature, and iron levels.

"Ten percent may not donate today," said Brian Olsen, account representative and drive organizer. "High or low blood pressure would be a reason to be disqualified. Using a blood thinner or an infectious disease could disqualify you, as well as, being sick recently or exposed

or high risk to malaria.'

"I love helping people," said Tom Waterman before he gave his blood

"You give one pint in whole blood and when you reach eight pints, you have given a gallon," said Sara Cramer. "Today, Tom has reached the point of giving one gallon. Today he will have saved three lives or 10 infants."

Kaja Hietala, Phlebotomist has been drawing blood for a year and a half. "I used to be a vet tech for 20 years. I love this, absolutely love it," said Heitala. "I love people and am drawn to the medical field."

"It is the same process to donate blood as is for platelets. The average time to donate platelets is one hour to an hour and a half, said Brandon Hunley. "There are two processes in one arm or two arms. "Of course, we prefer the two arms," said Hunley. "Blood has different densities. We are taking blood in machines and separating individual components, plasma, and platelets."

While donating you can watch a movie to pass the time. The platelet bus is the only bus of its kind. It comes from St. Petersburg and goes all over

the state seven days a week.

"With blood you can donate every 56 days, with platelets, you can donate every seven days," said Hunley. "Platelets are in the highest demand because they only last five days. Platelets are used mostly for cancer patients because of how harshly chemo can affect a patient."

"I have made a lot of friends through doing this. It is very gratifying and now we are doing it with the platelets and the double blood which is a double donation," said Lauren Waterman. "It is a group effort and I have made friends doing this."



Christopher Reeve ("Superman")

HOLLYWOOD -- The children of four-time "Superman" Christopher Reeve bare their souls in a documentary commemorating the 20th anniversary of their father's passing at the age of 52. The documentary follows his rise to fame through 1995, when he was thrown from a horse, breaking two vertebrae in his neck and leaving him paralyzed from the shoulders down.

I met Christopher in 1976 when he played Katharine Hepburn's grandson on Broadway in "A Matter of Gravity." He also starred in the soap "Love of Life" and asked me to write a story on why he was leaving the soap. The photos and story ran in Soap Opera Digest, and I invited him to stay in my guest room in Hollywood if he ever needed to.

To my surprise, he called six months later after completing a role in "Gray Lady Down" with Charlton Heston and Rosemary Forsyth, and he became my house guest. I shot new photos of him, and two of them were sent to the producers of the upcoming "Superman" movie, who saw the jawline of the future "Man of Steel" in my photographs.

He was then flown to London for testing and serious bodybuilding to become "Superman" for four films from 1978-1987. In addition, he made other classic films such as "Somewhere in Time" (1980). In 2006, despite having partial paralysis and being in a wheel chair, he directed and executively produced computer-animated sports comedy "Everyone's Hero," with the voices of Rob Reiner, William H. Macy, Raven-Symone and Whoopi Goldberg. Christopher truly was a super man!

Glen Powell has become the first breakout star of 2024. His rom-com "Anyone but You" passed the \$100 million mark, possibly saving the genre. In addition to his Netflix film "Hit Man" (due June 7) and the disaster film "Twisters" with Daisy Edgar-Jones and Anthony Ramos (due July 19), Powell is currently prepping for "Huntington," which was inspired by the 1949 British comedy "Kind Hearts and Coronets." It starred Sir Alec Guinness (Obi-Wan Kenobi from "Star Wars").

Both Margot Robbie and Greta Gerwig of "Barbie" were afforded a great deal of airtime about being snubbed for the Best Actress and Best Director categories at the Oscars. Most reports failed to mention that Gerwig was nominated for Best Adapted Screenplay -- and Robbie as a producer of "Barbie."
