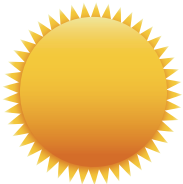

First celebration of city's incorporation following a two-year hiatus makes for a festive Saturday

A longstanding tradition that began in 1911 united the community with a bevy of activities on Saturday. The 112th Founders' Day celebration, a Main Street Zephyrhills event highlighted by an evening parade for a change, took place downtown.

It marked the first parade to recognize the city's incorporation after a two-year hiatus.

Last year's parade and downtown celebration were eliminated due to a scheduling conflict with the Pigz n' Zhills Barbecue and Blues Festival, which is organized annually by the Zephyrhills Chamber of Commerce. The 2021 traditional event did not take place due to restrictions put in place during the coronavirus pandemic.

Either way, the downtown festival and parade were revived and people seemed glad about that. Like Lori Murphy and her boyfriend Randy Grelick, snowbirds from Ontario who winter in Zephyrhills and have been to their share of downtown activities.

Get ready to spring ahead on Sunday...again

At 2 a.m. on March 12, we will mark our 105 ritual of cutting off the end of our blanket and sewing it back on the top (so says the proverb)

That's right. Get ready to spring ahead! It's a tradition that goes back to conserving whale oil in city street lamps. Actually conceived by the British-born William Willet in 1907, the Germans in the First World War made great use of it. The history of "daylight saving" is actually quite interesting.

In 1784, Benjamin Franklin wrote an essay published in *Journal De Paris* where Franklin brings up the notion of forcing Parisians to wake up with the sunrise by pealing church bells and even firing off cannon. He went on to extoll the virtues of waking up with the sunrise every day. He even floated the notion of saving money on candles that would have to be lit in the evening hours.

He goes on to suggest that a tax be levied on people that have shutters on their windows. He also suggests guards rationing only a pound of candles per week to residents. Naturally, this was all tongue-in-cheek but it may have planted the seed for the notion.

In 1895, botanist and entomologist George Hudson presented a scientific paper to the Wellington Philosophical Society. In the paper, he suggested moving clocks ahead two hours between the months of March and October. Hudson was originally from England and moved to New Zealand as a child. He quickly became one of the leading entomologists of his time. He would eventually contribute seven books and 122 papers on insects in New

It's time to "Play Ball!"

Zephyrhills Little League baseball and softball players fill the ball fields as the regular season gets under way

Now that the fanfare is over and the thrill of another eagerly anticipated Opening Day ceremony is behind us, it's time to get down and play some ball. The 2023 Zephyrhills Little League season is now in full swing.

This past Saturday, the ball fields at the Samuel W. Pasco Recreation Complex off Chancey Road were filled with baseball and softball players, mostly from Zephyrhills but some interlocking from other leagues in the region.

Games ranged from the t-ball and minor divisions on the small diamonds to junior baseball and senior softball on the larger fields.

"It's great to see all these kids playing baseball and softball every night and all day on Saturday," said Jan Spivey, the league's president for the sixth time since 1991. "I hope they are learning the game, but more importantly that they are learning good citizenship and sportsmanship."

The regular season actually began on Opening Day two weekends ago. Games will continue to be

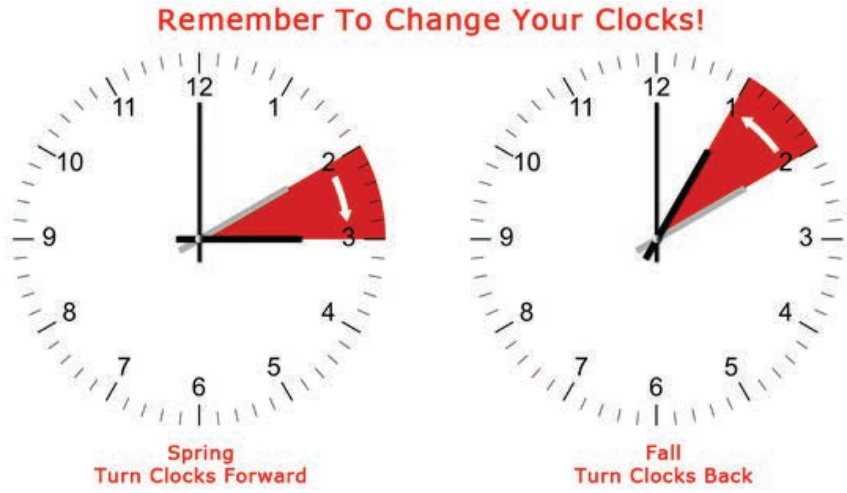

Zealand. He also made over 3,000 drawings of different species of butterflies and moths. New Zealand did try his proposal in 1927 but it did not endure.

Hudson was definitely on the side for more daylight in the evening. That comes to the very dividing line between which time is preferable, "daylight saving" time or "standard" time. Daylight saving time gives you that extra hour of daylight in the evening. However, the flip side is that the morning is an hour darker. Standard time really just keeps the clock where it is. However, the contrast would be that mornings have more sunlight and the sun sets earlier.

Advocates of daylight saving time want that additional recreation time in the summer months. They want that sunset to happen later. This can get interesting in Florida when you're actually waiting for the sun to go down so that it doesn't feel like you're stepping onto the sunny side of Mercury. Furthermore, there is still the element of cost saving, not having to use artificial lighting during that hour. For people recreating outdoors, this can be a big benefit. Golf courses love daylight saving time.

Advocates of abolishing daylight saving time cite the more light in the morning being favorable for children traveling to school. It also applies to morning commuters and suggests a reduction in vehicular accidents. Then there's also the health effect. While it is certainly healthy to recreate outside, opponents of daylight saving time point to an uptick in heart attacks, strokes and interrupted sleep rhythms.

Our national government is having discus-

sions even now, regarding a permanent change to one or the other, "daylight saving" or "standard." Last March (2022), the U.S. Senate passed SB623, sponsored by Florida Senator Marco Rubio, called the Sunshine Protection Act. It was designed to move the country to daylight saving time permanently. It never made it to the House. In the 2023 legislative session, the Sunshine Protection Act has emerged in the House and been re-introduced in the Senate. Don't expect a vote on it anytime soon. The bill's sponsors are waiting on a Department of Transportation report on the effects of a permanent change. That report isn't due until Dec. 31, 2023.

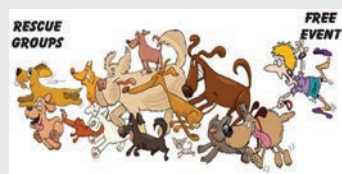

played on weekends and weekday nights through May 15.

After that, it's all-star time with teams from Zephyrhills competing against other communities in District 13. Also in the district are Little League teams from Dade City, Land O' Lakes, Antioch, Temple Terrace, North Seminole and Progress Village.

This marks the third straight season for league play since the 2020 games were lost due to the coronavirus pandemic. Attendance has increased each year since with the current number of ballplayers listed at about 440 on 38 teams.

As for the play on the ball fields on Saturday there was a little bit of everything with a lopsided routs at the junior baseball level to go along with a comeback thriller in minor baseball.

In that latter division, the Rays rallied from nine runs down for a 14-13 comeback win over The Zephyrhills News. The game ended after just three innings due to time constraints.

"We were down 13-4 with time running out," Rays coach Darryl Oney said. "They were ecstatic. It was great."

In the bottom of the third inning, Emelio Albino scored the tying run before Paxton Ahnet crossed home plate right behind his teammate to clinch it.

"There were a couple of passed balls and

my guys came in and scored," Oney said.

In the top of the third, catcher Jayman Rodriguez walked out to the mound to speak with relief pitcher Jase Spivey and the Rays infielders. Spivey, Jan's grandson who had never pitched, struck out two of the three batters he faced to end the inning.

Oney, who has coached in Zephyrhills for 20 years, actually has coached at the Little League level for 45 years. That includes stints at East Bay, Brandon, Interbay and North Seminole. He not only teaches the fundamentals but promotes giving a solid effort and teaching young players how to win.

"Learn the game and have fun," Oney said of his ongoing messages to the players. "Be ready for the challenge and do what you have to do to help your team. We're here to win."

Meanwhile, the Dawgs improved to 2-1 with a 10-1 win over the Blue in junior baseball. Greyson Dorman tossed 65 pitches with 10 strikeouts in four innings for the win.

"He's got a fastball and a good changeup," coach Heath Horsley said of the right-handed pitcher.

In that win, the Dawgz pulled away with five runs in the second inning. The team's top hitters were Adrian Segura, Markel Smith, Grandos Ronny and Dorman.

James P LaRoy

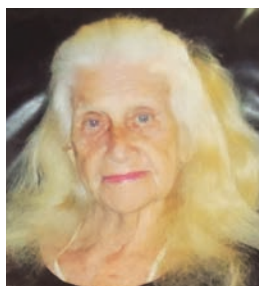

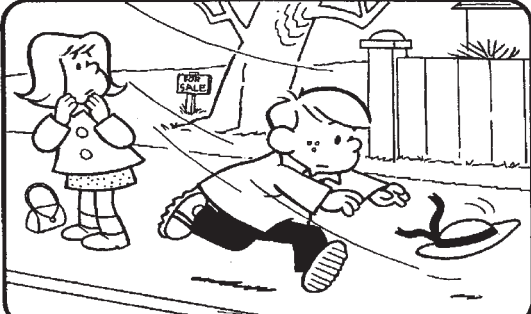

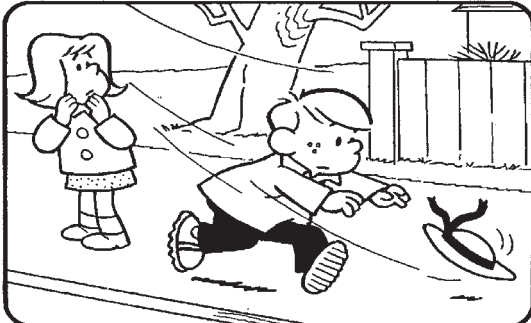

MOMENTS IN TIME: The History Channel

* On March 24, 1882, German scientist Robert Koch discovered the bacterium responsible for tuberculosis. Regarded today as the “father of modern bacteriology,” Koch was awarded the Nobel Prize in Physiology and Medicine in 1905.

* On March 20, 1922, Hubert Work gave an order that all American homes need to be equipped with an item that the majority of us undoubtedly take for granted today: a mailbox. Work was the country’s U.S. Postmaster General, and failure to comply with the order carried a penalty of giving up one’s mail delivery.

* On March 21, 1928, President Calvin Coolidge presented Charles Lindbergh with the Congressional Medal of Honor for

“displaying heroic courage and skill as a navigator, at the risk of his life, by his nonstop flight in his airplane, the Spirit of St. Louis, from New York City to Paris, France, 20-21 May 1927, by which Capt. Lindbergh not only achieved the greatest individual triumph of any American citizen but demonstrated that travel across the ocean by aircraft was possible.”

* On March 23, 1973, Yoko Ono was granted permanent residence in the United States. However, the good news did not extend to her husband, former Beatle John Lennon. He was issued a 60-day notice to leave the country.

* On March 22, 1978, Karl Wallenda, founder of the Flying Wallendas, fell from a tightrope 10 stories to his death during a promotional appearance for the Pan American Circus. The 73-year-old acrobat was crossing between the two towers of the Conrado Plaza Hotel in San Juan, Puerto Rico.

* On March 25, 1995, Howard G. (Ward) Cunningham, an American computer programmer and pioneer in both design patterns and extreme programming, introduced the wiki, or “user-editable website.” Today, Wikipedia is the world’s most well-known and widely used wiki.

* On March 26, 2019, former First Lady Michelle Obama’s memoir, “Becoming,” surpassed 10 million copies in sales just four months after its publication. It had already become America’s best-selling book in 2018 after a mere 15 days.

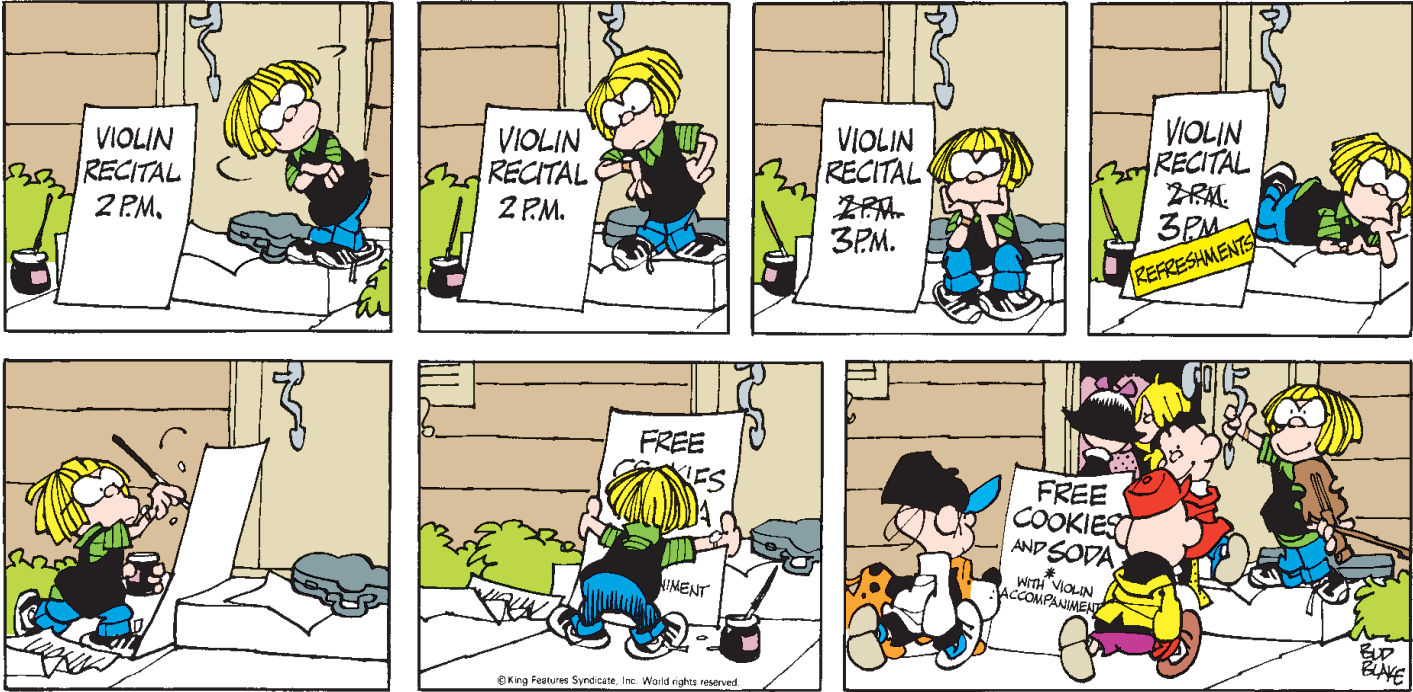

"We love this little square," Murphy said after dancing with Grecik to songs played by Time Travelers at the Eiland Bandstand. "We came down early enough for the Christmas Parade this year."

Main Street, or 5th Avenue, was filled with people walking up and down before the parade made its way along the downtown route. Young and old alike, from near and far, visited shops along the street and stopped at various vendor booths.

"It's special because it's community; it's a hometown experience," said Erin Beasley, executive director for Main Street Zephyrhills. "People come out and value where they live. It's nice to be a part of that."

Jaylene Herrera, social media intern with Main Street Zephyrhills, recorded the downtown activities. In all, Beasley said there were 55 vendors along the downtown streets with 35 floats or groups taking part in the parade.

Longtime emcee Greg First was replaced by Matthew Page, who using a microphone introduced the floats and groups as they came down Main Street. Page is a history teacher who coaches cross country and track at Zephyrhills High. "Honestly, I was kind of shocked," he said of being requested to emcee the parade. "This is cool. Museum encourages public interested in Florida life and history from pioneer times

Families traveled from as far as St. Petersburg to participate in the activities for Cracker Cowboy Day. Farmers, ranchers, children and snowbirds from the Midwest gathered to bring the culture of farming and cowboys together for this event. Exhibitions, vendors and food were scattered throughout the grounds and buildings.

Cheyenne Nichols, a volunteer for the Pioneer Florida Museum, sits on the porch of one of the old schoolhouses working on crafted pieces. Nichols works on weaved key chains, bookmarks, belts, and hatbands. The tool she uses is a mini version of an inkle loom created by her husband, modelled after the much bigger looms. "It is easier to travel with a smaller loom," she said.

Cotton rug quality materials are used to assemble her crafts. Cheyanne added, "I enjoy creating and showing old crafts to keep them alive."

The list of activities for everyone ranged from whip cracking presentations, blacksmith exhibition, roping demonstrations, children's

roping, axe throwing, cow camps and speakers, to live musical entertainment. Local band Gear it Up treated guests to 80's music, while

The Barking Dogs Jamboree gathered in a circle with fiddles, banjo, folk guitars elsewhere on the grounds.

The Barking Dogs play two times a month in the San Antonio Park. Bonnie Beers has been a recent member of two years.

"The group was named

the Barking Dogs because the dogs kept barking while they were playing." They have been around since the 70s.

"They are a very welcoming group," said Beers.

"I like to share music with those who love to share their music."

Marshal Stokes, who lives on a ranch in Dade City, attended with his cowboy buddies to celebrate his 9th birthday. "I want a horse," said Marshal. "And I came to see the cool stuff."

Roping the wooden horses was the next best thing to rope a real horse. He belongs to the 4H club and recently won Grand Champion for his hog and rabbit.

Pasco County Cattlewomen were on hand with Chad Sasser, representing the cattlemen. The education consists of showing what they do daily, how it is for them every day as a cowboy, and teaching agricultural literacy, how to cook beef and the nutritional aspects of it in your diet.

"We educate people and share with the youth how we make our living," said, Casie Holloway.

Warren Erp, the youngest brother of Wyatt Erp was seen shopping at the country store where Susan Kruse sews all of the clothes to sell for historical re-enactments.

"I like the historical aspect of living history," said Susan Kruse.

David Dees is part of the Six Gun Territory re-enactment group and can be seen at many of the re-enactments.

Just past the country store is an 1880's base capture camp demonstrating branding, where you can purchase a brand on a piece of wood. Families donated their brands to the museum to raise money for the museum. Jim McAlister, president of the Cattlemen's Association of Sumter County explains the history of cowboys.

"Traditionally, we were not called cowboys," said McAlister. "We were called cow men or cow hunters because you had to hunt your cows."

The members of the camp have 50-60 years of living history amongst them over seven periods.

The blacksmith demonstration was all about tools for the blacksmith. The ball-peen hammer is the most useful tool, although most other tools serve a specific purpose to customize and alter what they are working on.

"The ball-peen (hammer) is used for stretching and to dimple metal. A good blacksmith has no dimples in his work," Burt Golub.

Throughout the day many families ate period food with cracker fixins, along with petting hogs, rabbits, and goats, some even rode a bunnin bronco. Vendors sold historical period crafts and food. The Pioneer Florida Museum showed the many struggles of those before us, those who made it through these times. The people who are just like us in some ways, but just lived differently.

Gators win in Sunshine Athletic Conference boys weightlifting with the Bulls taking third and host coyotes placing fourth

The Zephyrhills High boys weightlifting team has been here before. Several weeks after finishing as the runner-up in a tri-meet behind winner Land O' Lakes and ahead of third-place Wesley Chapel at home, the Bulldogs took to the road for the Sunshine Athletic Conference meet hosted by Cypress Creek.

Once again, Zephyrhills was a runner-up to Land O' Lakes, which in the first year of the Florida High School Athletic Association dividing the sport into two divisions took firsts in Olympic and Traditional with 50 and 54 points, respectively.

The Bulldogs tallied 45 points in Olympic and 39 in Traditional.

Unlike the tri-meet earlier this season, however, Wesley Chapel did not finish third. Wiregrass Ranch took thirds in Olympic and Traditional with 35 and 34 points, respectively. The host Coyotes finished fourth in both divisions.

Land O' Lakes, led by senior Aidan Marsh, a two-time state qualifier lifting in the unlimited weight class, won its first-ever conference title, due, in part, to depth. The Gators have 24 lifters, more than in any of coach Tyler Farr's seven seasons.

"They just had more kids than we did," said Zephyrhills boys coach James Aguilera, who also took over the girls program late in the season due to the departure of former coach Joe Rinaldo. "We just stubbed our toes a little bit. We didn't really bring the focus that I wanted to. There was just a lot going on with the girls."

Last year, Zephyrhills won its first conference title since 2018 under former coach Chris Barrick, who moved back to his native Texas after a five-

year stint with the Bulldogs.

This is Aguilera's second year coaching the team. Before that he coached at Anclote for one season and this year is getting help from his daughter Madison, a 2021 Zephyrhills graduate who owns four school records in girls weightlifting.

"We were strong last year, but I knew we would drop off a little bit because we lost a lot of seniors," Aguilera said. "We'll get back to the drawing board and get back to work. (Being the runner-up) is a little humbling. There's a lot of parody in the conference."

Individually, the Bulldogs had five champions in the SAC meet, four of which came in the Olympic division. They were: Malachi Woodard, 154-pound weight class, 435 total; Tyler Hitchner, 169, 365; Marcel Tucker, 183, 445; and Rodney Smith, 199, 455.

The lone winner in Traditional was Tynan Lacrue, who at 183 lifted for a combined 510. Additionally, placing second for Zephyrhills in Traditional were Kiev Mattox at 119, along with Hitchner, Tucker and Smith.

Wiregrass Ranch's lone winner was Ethan Cantanus, a first-year competitor who as a 119-pound junior won in Olympic and Traditional.

"We just found him in physical education class," said Wiregrass Ranch coach Mark Kantor, who also is that school's head football coach. "He's just a kid that likes working out."

The Bulls also had a runner-up in both divisions with Isaiah Fitzpatrick lifting at 154. Cypress Creek had one winner in Jayden Cruzado, a sophomore who competes in the 129 category. He came in third in the state last year and this season has his sights set on a state championship.

"I'm putting more effort into my lifts," said Cruzado, who also won conference, district and regional titles last year.

"Hopefully, he'll do the job this year," said Cypress Creek Mike Johnson, the school's head football coach as well as an assistant to Tico Hernandez with the girls weightlifting team.
