### Citywide celebration with numerous weekend events includes vintage campers in Zephyr Park

A downtown parade to commemorate the founding fathers of Zephyrhills has been going on for more than 100 years and there apparently is no end in sight.

Last Saturday, the 113th Annual Founder's Day Parade took place along 5th Avenue.

Originally called Abbott when first settled in 1882 with a thriving lumber and turpentine industry and later referred to as Abbott Station when the Seaboard Coastline Railroad established a depot here, the town became known as Zephyrhills in 1910.

That's when Howard Jeffries, a retired Union

Army Captain from Pennsylvania, established a retirement community for Civil War veterans. The name of the Zephyrhills Colony Company is a testament to the warm gentle breezes, or zephyrs, that blew across the area's rolling hills.

Last weekend's festivities organized by Main Street Zephyrhills included dozens of vendors and food trucks in the downtown corridor, a five-kilometer (3.1 miles) race thanks to partnering with the East Pasco YMCA, an author speaking at the Train Depot, a pie eating contest, a scavenger hunt, live music and a show by the Zephyrhills Art Club.

In keeping with this year's theme — Return of the Tin Can Tourist — a vintage camper trailer exhibition in Zephyr Park lasted from Friday through Sunday. There also were camper crafts at the city's library.

"We're trying to create something so people don't leave after the parade," said Antwon Gildon, who is in his first year as Main Street Zephyrhills' director and coordinator.

## Bay Area Renaissance Festival has theme weekends

Participants come from far and wide to act like a pirate or princess during the Renaissance Festival in Dade City

As you pass through the ticket lines you have entered a 16th Century European Village marketplace with street performers, unique food, and the usual turkey legs. Leprechaun performs magic to an audience of pirates and princesses, the theme for this weekend.

He pulls the rope and said, "Tell me when to stop." A woman yelled out, "Stop!" and all the pieces of rope became one long rope. Comedy infused with magic sets the pace for the day.

Merchants sold handmade period pieces made from metal, wood, glass, clothing, and leather. You could also buy jewelry. Deanna Daviola, artisan, called her art, 'Beautiful Darkness' – beauty infused with darkness which was reminiscent of the rebirth of art following the darkness of the Middle Ages.

I had a job, but now I do it full time," said Daviola. "I sell at Renaissance Festivals locally, out of state, and Comicon." She also has her work in shops. Daviola draws people, nature, and animals.

Outside the booth a huge crowd gathered for a death-defying performance from the Wheel of Death, a spinning cage the performer walked on, through and all over. The crowd screamed as each move was made to different parts of the wheel.

A group of kilted faire goers came for the festivities. It was the Krewe of Brigadoon from Tampa. "This is amazing and a great thing," said Robert Smith, president. "I am very happy to be a part of this Krewe and the work we do for the charities we choose, Spring of Tampa Bay, Wheelchairs for Children, The Children Dream Fund and Liberty Manor Veterans." The Krewe of Brigadoon also hosted the Dragon Party, the biggest kickoff party for Gasparilla.

## Settler's Rest/Sweetwater extends its championship run

The combined team of neighboring communities wins a fourth straight title in the Zephyrhills Winter Horseshoe League

Make that four in a row for Settler's Rest/Sweetwater, a combined team of neighboring RV communities that last week won yet again in the Zephyrhills Winter Horseshoe League. That impressive run of league championships includes a tie with Morningside, the lone team in the league from Dade City, in 2021.

Settler's Rest/Sweetwater had already clinched the Wednesday league crown before closing out the 2024 season with a commanding 27-5 win over Hunter's Run, formerly a perennial powerhouse. The home team dominated from the outset, taking an insurmountable 15-1 lead at the break and never looking back.

Overall, Settler's Rest/Sweetwater finished the year with a stellar 8-0-1 record. That included a tie with

Newcomers, longtime residents and snowbirds alike offered varying viewpoints of the parade and weekend celebration.

Gloria Van Dyke-Dean, an administrative volunteer for Main Street Zephyrhills who relocated from New York four years ago, could appreciate the small-town atmosphere and impact on the area.

"Being somebody from the outside this is a wonderful sense of community spirit and people coming together," she said.

Alex and Laurie Bass, snowbirds from Ontario who spend winters in Zephyrhills, said they enjoy the downtown parades. They often come to the Founder's Day and Christmas parades, although they do not always make it down to Florida in time for the latter one.

"We really like to see how everyone gets excited about these things downtown," said Laurie, adding, "It's nice to see how people in this community support each other."

Few know that more than lifelong Zephyrhills resident Greg First, who at the age of 74 has served as the emcee for countless parades in Zephyrhills and Dade City over the years.

"I really started getting involved (in community activities) when Alice Hall was alive and it hasn't stopped since," he said, alluding to the late public service leader with the community center in Zephyr Park named in her honor "Every parade has different dynamics, but Founder's Day is the big one for Zephyrhills — 113 years, what's bigger than that?"

This year's parade featured 50 entrants. The grand marshal was LeAnne John, Zephyrhills High's agriculture teacher who recently was named Pasco County's Teacher of the Year.

Joining First on a makeshift stage in front of the downtown square were judges Devin Alexander, Edna Bahr and Sherri Moore. After the parade that trio voted on the winners in seven categories.

A combined entrant won two awards with the marching bands from Zephyrhills High and Stewart Middle — led by band directors Russell Schmidt at the high school and his son Brian at the middle school — claiming Best in Show and Best Marching/Walking Unit.

The other award winners were as follows: Best Theme — Habitat for Humanity Restore; Best Costume — Sons & Daughters of the Confederacy; Best Business — Hangry Joe's Hot Chicken; Best Club — Building Legacies 4H; and Best Automobile — Antique Fire Truck.

Pursuant to Section 101.021, Florida Statutes, Florida is a closed primary state, which means the candidate choices on your ballot will be candidates of the same party affiliation. The 2024 Presidential Preference Primary has no Democratic, Minor Party, or Nonpartisan candidates. Only eligible Republican voters will receive a ballot.

Some party candidates for president have reportedly suspended or ended their presidential campaigns.

If a candidate did not submit a formal withdrawal before Dec. 12, 2023, in accordance with section 103.101(3), Florida Statutes, the candidate nominee's name must remain on the Presidential Preference Primary (PPP) ballot for his or her respective party. A vote cast for any candidate nominee appearing on the ballot will count as a vote for that candidate.





## MOMENTS IN TIME: The History Channel

- \* On March 25, 2017, the world's largest banana split made its debut in Innisfail, Australia. Concocted with 40,000 bananas, it stretched for an astounding 5 miles long. No word on the number of calories it contained.
- \* On March 26, 1971, East Pakistan declared its independence from Pakistan, forming Bangladesh, which started an eight-month-long war between Pakistan and the newly-formed state. As many as 3 million people lost their lives in the conflict.
- \* On March 27, 1989, the groundbreaking soap opera "Generations" aired on NBC-TV, making it the first U.S. African-American show of its kind. Focusing on the relationship between two Chicago families, one white and one Black, the series tackled difficult subjects, including sickle cell anemia, racial bias and hate crimes, but failed to find a wide audience and was canceled in 1991.
- \* On March 28, 1949, English astronomer Fred Hoyle coined the term "Big Bang" during a BBC radio interview, though he also refuted the scientific theory, remarking in a later interview with the network that "the reason why scientists like the 'big bang' is because they are overshadowed by the Book of Genesis. It is deep within the psyche of most scientists to believe in the first page of Genesis."
- \* On March 29, 1984, the city of Baltimore refused to replace its antiquated stadium, so the owner of the Baltimore Colts decided to up and leave the state. The team loaded up all their equipment into 15 trucks, moved to Indiana, and renamed themselves the Indianapolis Colts.
- \* On March 30, 1842, inhaled sulfuric ether was used as an anesthetic for the first time, by American surgeon Crawford Williamson Long, the first obstetric anesthetist, in Athens, Georgia. Long was also a cousin of Western legend Doc Holliday, and may have operated on Doc's cleft lip.
- \* On March 31, 1923, the first dance marathon took place in New York City, with dance instructor Alma Cummings setting a new record at the Audubon Ballroom by hoofing it for 27 hours with six different partners. In just three weeks, her feat would be surpassed at least nine times across the U.S.









## Host Cypress Creek boys wins their second title while it's girls team is the runner-up in seventh annual track and field meet

Cypress Creek High was the place to be for local track and field teams last Thursday when that school hosted the Seventh Annual Coyote Invitational. Every team in the Sunshine Athletic Conference except Springstead competed in the track and field meet.

There was somewhat of a home track advantage with Cypress Creek winning the boys meet and the girls team from that school finishing as the runner-up. Land O' Lakes won the girls meet and the Gators were the boys runner-up.

It marked the second boys title for Cypress Creek and first since 2022.

Defending district champion Zephyrhills, which finished ahead of runner-up Cypress Creek last year, placed fourth. Wiregrass Ranch and Wesley Chapel wound up fifth and sixth, respectively. On the girls side, Zephyrhills was fourth and Wiregrass Ranch fifth.

Overall, Zephyrhills and Wiregrass Ranch tied with seven combined wins apiece. Next up was Land O' Lakes with six combined victories, just one more than Mitchell.

Cypress Creek boys coach Darrell Davis, a former standout in track as a sprinter and football as a wide receiver at Pasco High, views the meet as a tune-up for the upcoming postseason that starts with conference and district championships, eventually leading to regionals and states.

"It's a good precursor because we invite everybody," said Davis, who went on to play football at North Carolina State. "We've got the best

track in the county. We want to represent on our home track."

The Coyotes had just two wins in the boys meet — Cason Corrao in the 400-meter hurdles and Jack Niemann, the football team's two-year starting quarterback, in the javelin — but racked up plenty of points with finishes among the top five in events.

"I feel like our veterans are really stepping up," Davis said. "The core group of kids I had last year is really doing good."

As for Cypress Creek's girls, their lone win came from Saige Magill in the 200.

For Zephyrhills, the top performance came from freshman sensation Lydia Vincent, who easily won the 1,600 run and the 3,200. In cross country last fall she was a district runner-up and placed fourth in the state meet.

"It's amazing what a beast she is; her determination and she's very coachable," said Zephyrhills coach Matthew Page, a former long-distance runner at Pasco High (Class of 2017).

The other victory for the Zephyrhills girls came in the 4x800 relay that featured Destini Harden, Victoria Spour, Judith Audet and Vincent.

The Zephyrhills boys had four wins, two by Damien Pickett Jr. in the 100 and 200. William Poe, who like Vincent is a standout cross country runner, won the 1,600 and teammate A.J. Jackson was victorious in the boys 400.

Wiregrass Ranch's Victoria Fleming and Clemson Harrod won the girls and boys 100 hurdles, respectively. Teammates Kaitlyn Flynnne won the girls 400, Camila Angulo wound up first in the girls 800 and Namarrh Smith was the girls winner in the high jump.

Wiregrass Ranch's winning boys 4x100 relay team included Jared West, Alexei Leon, Gavin Gilyard and Jordan Roque.

The winning 4x800 boys relay team consisted of Wesley Chapel's Turen Aquilar Cortes, Michael Cook, Adrian Brooks and Andres Flores Cadiz.

Wesley Chapel also won two girls relays. The first came in the 4x100 with a foursome of Nandi Denning, Zaakirah Bryant, Krystin Blenman and Tessa Bray. That same group also took first in the 4x400, albeit in a different order.

**TECH SUPPORT SCAM**

Victims are alerted that a tech support company requires access to their computer to "fix" an issue. Scammers install a program granting remote access to the victim's computer to steal funds or commit future crimes.

- Never click on pop-ups or suspicious links.
- Always turn off your computer when you're not using it.
- Create unique passwords and update them regularly.
- Never send any form of payment to someone you don't know.
- Limit who has access to your electronics physically and remotely.
- Don't share login credentials or remote access with someone you don't know.

If you believe you're a victim of a tech support scam, contact law enforcement immediately.

Pasco Sheriff's Office wants citizens to be aware of tech support scams. Potential victims receive a phone call, email or pop-up notification from someone pretending to be with a tech company. The scammer advises the potential victim of an issue with the victim's computer and offers to "fix" the problem. Once granted access to a victim's computer, scammers can install malicious software, a virus, gain access to personal information or financial accounts. PSO is sharing steps citizens can take to improve their internet safety habits to stay safe from tech support scams and other similar threats:

Never click on pop-ups or suspicious links. Safeguard who has access to your electronics physically and remotely. Do not share log-in credentials or remote access with someone you don't know. Never send any form of payment to someone you don't know. Create strong unique passwords and update them regularly. Install and maintain antivirus software. Always turn off your computer when you're not using it. The best defense against fraud and scams is awareness. Stay safe Pasco!

## Local high school cadets are state runners-up and will head back to Dallas for nationals

Before last spring, the Zephyrhills High JROTC's robotics team had never been to Texas. Now, they're headed back to the Lone Star State.

The Robo Dawgs made history last year when they flew to Dallas for an international competition featuring JROTC robotics teams from around the world. They will compete again in "Big D" next month at the World's VEX Robotics Championships.

The Robo Dawgs clinched their second straight berth among international teams by finishing as state runners-up in a January competition at defending national champion Steinbrenner. The host school won that state tournament.

"They did good. Last year we had two robots and this year we're taking four," said Sgt. Michael Smith, who along with Sgt. Jimmy Mcauley oversees the robotics program as well as other programs such as the Raiders and drill team.

In last spring's international tourney at the Dallas Convention Center, Zephyrhills made its debut on that stage. Although the Robo Dawgs did not return with a championship the school's five cadets set a precedent.

"It may be a little better now," Smith said, adding that last year "most of the kids were new."

This year, 12 cadets will take their four robots to Texas. The dozen students, led by lone returner Jake Lisenbee, include: Devin Wharton, Michael Lasselle, Matthew Goldfarb, Jaden Whitt, Olivia Woodring, Collin Odell, Cara Odell, Tyler Story, Andrew Fraley, Kendry Abreu and Vincent Leach.

The Robo Dawgs set their sights on returning to nationals by taking two robots to a state qualifier at Pasco-Hernando State College in December. Zephyrhills' two robots took 12th and 13th among 50 high school teams in that competition.

At another state qualifier in Apopka, Zephyrhills entered three robots before the team competed with four at the state tourney.

While Smith oversees program at the high school level, most of the coaching is handled by civilian Brad Odell, a former Wesley Chapel High automotive teacher. His son and daughter are on the team with all three family members headed to Texas.

Smith is amazed at the team's progress from last season.

"At the beginning of the year it was just a pile of metal," he said of parts and materials the cadets built four robots from. "It was something they built from scratch. They put it all together and they run it. If something breaks they have to fix it."

For his part, Odell aimed to help the cadets build stronger, more durable robots capable of competing on offense as well as on defense.

"They have opened their minds and they've got their creativity going," he said. "We have short, wide robots that can take a hit and deliver a hit."

Wharton, a junior who formerly spent his JROTC time with the Raiders, said he switched to the robotics team because "I wanted to do something more hands-on and technical. I like programming and driving the robots. It's more energizing; a little bit harder than building the robots."

"I've just enjoyed interacting with other schools and I like the way the robotics game is played," said Lasselle, a sophomore, who used to do drills with the honor guard and color guard.

Another sophomore in his first year on the robotics team is Goldfarb.

"It was just the overall desire to expand my credits," he said. "It's like a STEM field so it's really good for college. I enjoy working with people on something we can call our own."

Whitt, a senior citing the team's back-to-back international berths, said the future is bright.

"It's something that our program is going to start winning a lot more," he said.

Morningside on the road earlier in the season and capped their first-ever unbeaten mark.

Ron Knowles, the team's captain and at 88 one of its best players, noted that familiarity and having an experienced lineup of talented players as key factors that fueled Settler's Rest/Sweetwater to yet another title.

"We've had the same team for the last two or three years," he said of a core group on a team comprised primarily of snowbirds from northern states and parts of Canada. "Everyone's getting comfortable with one another."

Settler's Rest/Sweetwater player Lawrence Pittman, who often keeps the match scores and runs a team web site, credited dedication to the team's success as well.

"We practice twice a day before the season even starts — in the morning and the afternoon — and sometimes in the early evening," he said. "For some of them, that's all they do is horseshoes."

As for the other squad in last week's season finale, among the newcomers on somewhat of a rebuilding Hunter's Run team are Eric and Leslie Lever, who are playing their first season in the league.

"I like to play," said Leslie, adding, "I really haven't played in tournaments before."

Even though he joined Hunter's Run for the first time Eric is not unfamiliar with horseshoes, having played the sport for numerous years while growing up in Vermont.

"I kind of grew up throwing but missed the

last two seasons (due to shoulder surgery)," he said. "It's good to be back."

Among some of the top horseshoe players on the Settler's Rest/Sweetwater roster, a half dozen guys also helped lead Settler's Rest to another title in Tuesday's Oldtimers League. Settler's Rest has won four championships in that league's past five seasons with Morningside in 2021 sneaking in to win a title that year.

The six guys who pitch for both teams involving Settler's Rest include: Knowles, Wayne Seeger, Case Glasbergen, Cliff Sullens, Dave Piel and Ed Rideout.

"These six guys, and a couple of others too, they're very dedicated to pitching horseshoes," Knowles said. "That really makes it easy to win."

Of the Tuesday league's top teams, Hillcrest was this year's runner-up, in part, by virtue of defeating Settler's Rest during the season. Happy Days came in third and Forest Lake Estates finished fourth.

Late in the season, Hillcrest, Happy Days and Forest Lake Estates were bunched up in a pivotal battle for second place with all three teams lined up behind front-runner Settler's Rest.

"Next year, Settler's Rest is going to be the team to gun for," said Rick Frye, captain of Forest Lakes Estates who also is the president of Tuesday's Oldtimers League. "We're all going to get better next year."

Rounding out the Tuesday league standings, Sweetwater placed fifth and Southport Springs wound up in the sixth and final spot.
