Pioneer Florida Museum & Village hosts sixth annual fun-filled event for families and children

Celebrating Easter, complete with an egg hunt and the famous bunny, at the Pioneer Florida Museum & Village has become somewhat of a family tradition for many — visitors and locals alike.

Hundreds of families and children lent credence to that assertion last Saturday on a warm spring day by visiting the historic site in Dade City for the Sixth Annual Jelly Bean Fling.

"We've come here for the past two years," said Plant City's Emily Morganson, who along with her husband Damian and their two sons, 8-year-old Darek and Dylan, 5, waited in line to visit the Easter Bunny.

Stephanie Bracknell Black, the museum & village executive director, acknowledged the fun-filled family atmosphere for the Jelly Bean Fling, which is not unlike plenty of other events that take place at the site.

"The Jelly Bean Fling has been amazing," she said. "We have had perfect weather with opportunities for families to bond outdoors and a chance to explore the museum together. It's truly an enjoyable day."

There were vendors selling food and various items along the main walkway and live entertainment by Geared Up, a local band playing musical favorites, and the Barking Dogs, a gathering of musicians playing old-time music.

The wide variety of activities also included interactive arts and crafts, as well as live animals at a petting zoo organized by the Zephyrhills High Future Farmers of America, and pony rides.

Girl Scouts, Robotics team highlight city council meeting

A packed council chambers heard a proclamation given to the girl scouts and JROTC is looking financial help for travel to Texas for the Robotics Championship

A lot of people were at the meeting, including quite a number of girls scouts were in attendance for a proclamation read by Zephyrhills Mayor Melonie Bahr Monson. Proclamation spoke of how the Girl Scouts of America have been active in the U.S. since 1912. "and (they have) fueled the leadership pipeline in our communities by preparing and inspiring millions of girls and women to be active leaders with the highest ideals of character, conduct and patriotism."

Monson told the young ladies that in Zephyrhills, in 1956, Vera Morton and Phyllis Collier formed the first Girl Scout Troop here.

The proclamation continued; "And, throughout its distinguished history, girl scouts have been the pre-eminent leadership development organization for girls, where they can release their potential to be the leaders the world needs."

Kaytlin Higgins, a local Girl Scout, took the podium, asking the city to repair the back stairs at the scout hut at Shepard Park. She hopes that her efforts will lead to her receiving a Girl Scout Silver Award, one of the highest honors in girl scouts.

City officials are looking into the problem. Monson's agenda included three representatives from the JROTC Robotics team. They were seeking money to enable them to go to Texas with four of their robots and compete in the world championships. Their coach, Brad Odell, spoke to council, seeking the money needed.

Odell told council that the military will be picking up the tab for everything except the entry fees, which would be \$2400. They must be in by March 29.

Council conversed about the entry fee and gave

Bicycle Helmet Safety Days March 25, 3-7 p.m. at One Stop Shop, 15029 14th Street in Dade City.



The Dawgz will not wind up with an unbeaten season that Horsely hoped for, but they could come close. Zephyrhills followed a season-opening 10-6 loss to Progress Village by walloping nearby rival Dade City Florez 16-2 in a strong bounce-back game.

Against Dade City, Zephyrhills capitalized on a lack of control by the opposing pitchers and wound up with 24 stolen bases.

"They really didn't have pitchers, so they walked everybody," Horsely said.

The Dawgz improved to 2-1 with last Saturday's 10-8 win over the Dade City Ramirez. At one point, Zephyrhills led 9-2 but Horsely emptied his bench to allow more players get some game experience.

"I took my foot off the gas and took all the starters out just to give (the backups) more playing time," he said.

Three pitchers took turns on the mound for Zephyrhills, starting with Ayden Horsely, who was followed by Wallace and Whyte. Ayden and White also combined for seven strikeouts in the second game.

"I felt pretty good," Whyte said of his early success on the mound. "I know what I can do."

Through two weeks, all of the league's 36 teams have competed on the field with more than 400 baseball and softball players playing for a second straight year.

Also on Saturday, the Minor A Blue Devils improved to 3-0 with a 9-5 win over Progress Village. Zephyrhills opened the season with a 10-3 win over the Challengers and defeated Dade City 9-4 in its second game.

In that win over Dade City, starting pitcher Christian Sheppard left with a no-hitter through three innings. Reliever Gabriel Giannola finished up to earn the save.

Pitching is a strong suit for the Blue Devils with Jase Spivey, who closed out the game against the Challengers, Dylan Meredith and Reese Miller also getting in plenty of work on the mound.

Meredith was the starting pitcher against Progress Village with Miller coming on in relief to clinch the win and help Zephyrhills remain unbeaten in the early stages of the season.

"In this division it's tough to have that many pitchers because they all want to get on the mound," manager Tony Giannola said.

Having outscored the opposition by a substantial 28-12 through three games, it is apparent that the Blue Devils' offense is just as solid as the pitching staff.

The Meredith brothers, Kyle, who plays shortstop and Dylan, who also catches and plays third base, lead a consistent defense as well.

"There's a lot of kids that I can put anywhere on the field," Giannola said. "It's the dedication of the kids."

Stay safe while focusing on fitness

Building a workout routine is an excellent way to improve and maintain good health. An important part of building good wellness habits is having a good safety routine. Pasco Sheriff's Office is sharing tips to help you stay safe while focusing on fitness.

Gym safety can help you stay safe both inside and outside of fitness centers. Park in a well-lit and highly visible area, which makes you more likely to be seen. When exiting your car, take a minute to properly secure your valuables before entering the gym. Take your keys and wallet into the gym with you, instead of leaving it behind. As always, close your car's windows and lock the doors, which helps eliminate a criminal's opportunity to commit a crime. Any items left in your car are at higher risk of theft if you don't lock your doors.

Many car burglary sprees happen within minutes, with several suspects working together to quickly sweep through parking lots or neighborhoods. Thieves commonly test car door handles in search of unlocked cars without drawing much attention. Items stolen from cars often appear in other crimes, such as armed robberies or fraudulent credit card use. When leaving your car, always enable available safety features such as a car alarm.

As always, if you see anything suspicious, report it as quickly as possible to law enforcement, which may help prevent others from becoming a victim. Avoid using gym key hangers open to the public to ensure your keys stay safe. If your gym offers lockers, secure valuables inside one and use your own

lock. If lockers aren't available, place valuable items such as purses, wallets, laptops and backpacks out of sight and in a more secure area, such as your trunk. If you feel uncomfortable exiting the facility, ask a friend or a gym employee to walk you to your car, or keep an eye on you until you drive away.

Stay alert by keeping your eyes and ears open when exercising, especially when exercising outdoors such as running or riding a bike. Be mindful when wearing headphones or earbuds. This allows you to be aware of your surroundings, including drivers in busy areas that might not see you. Wear bright colors and something reflective to increase visibility in congested areas. Odell some hope that the city might be able to help. "The championships are extremely important to us, as the team isn't full of your normal jocks; and all the cool kids," said Odell. "These are the kids with the brains. These are the kids who are going to lead America's future."

"I'm sure we can do a sizeable amount," said a council member. City council then approved, unanimously, the two consent items on the agenda: approval of the Feb. 26 meeting minutes and approval and signature upon the close out document for the Wire Road Reclaim FDEP SRF Loan Project.

Next up item 3.1 was a public hearing on the Mayor's Youth Council Amendment. This was the second reading of Ordinance 1476-24 which is designed for opening up the pool to more youngsters.

Monson, when asked about response to this, indicated that she had not heard from anyone, except for one young lady.

The second reading of the amendment was approved unanimously by council, with no further comments.

The next business item 3.2 was a planned public hearing on Ordinance 1477-24, which would amend Ordinance 1455-23 that would extend the temporary moratorium on receiving and processing plans and permit applications for recreational vehicle storage.

The public hearing on the item was opened and closed without any comments. This second reading was approved by council.

Item 3.3 on the agenda was the second reading of Ordinance 1478-24; the Oakside Cemetery Amendment. It is designed to amend Section 94.06; Installation markers, monuments of the city of Zephyrhills Code of Ordinances, amending the markers requirements.

Again, this public hearing opened and closed without comment from the public. Item 3.3 was approved.

City Attorney's Report 4.1 concerned the approval of the Gagne Utility Services Agreement, pertaining to the Prairieview Place Plans.

According to Zephyrhills City Attorney Matthew Maggard, the agreement allows for some connection fee credits in exchange for some new lines that will be put in to make the connection. According to Maggard, at the request of the city, the lines are being created a bit larger, and the city will reimburse the difference in cost.

The Gagne Agreement was passed unanimously. In the citizens comments Saxton Evans spoke on behalf of his company Citrus Capital Advisors. His topic was a possible alternative water option for the City of Zephyrhills.

"I'm here today because I want to at least put it in front of you, because I know with the moratorium I'm seeing in the news, and all of these tax things you guys are going through, this might be a good alternative for you; to possible purchase water from us," said Evans. He hopes to get together with the council members individually.

In the Mayor Announcements: Monson spoke highly of how well Founder's Day went the previous weekend. She thanked the city staff for all of their work.

"What you have here are gentlemen and ladies that have been playing with drum and bugle corps and then retired and came down south," Angiulli said. "This is an opportunity for them to play again. You have young people, and older people."

Anyone who has a desire can join the Florida Brass Alumni Drum and Bugle Corps.

"We want to invite anybody who wants to play. We love to play and we love to perform," said Angiulli.

Ralph Venezia is the corps' horn instructor and the chief writer of their music. At the age of 13 he joined a drum corps in New Jersey simply because he was smitten with a young girl who was in the corps.

"She quit two weeks later, and I'm still doing it," Venezia said with a laugh.

He explained how, since the corps started over 20 years ago, they've expanded what they play.

"Rather than just playing selections that were being played by drum corps, we've added more songs."

Sunday's audience heard a Richard Rodgers' tune, "You'll Never Walk Alone," followed by some Chuck Mangione and Van Morrison music during the first half of the show. The second half featured patriotic favorites.

Between selections Venezia would give the audience some history about the selections they were about to hear.

Prior to joining the corps four years ago, Venezia was an educator for the Disney Company for 21 years.

Wesley Chapel routs Zephyrhills 14-4 to take a lead in the Class 5A, District 7 standings

With underwhelming records of being under the coveted .500 mark, both Class 5A, District 7 softball rivals were looking for a spark to get their teams headed in the right direction.

Give the early advantage to host Wesley Chapel, which defeated Zephyrhills 14-4 and improved to 4-5 overall and 2-0 in the district. The Wildcats offense is clicking of late, having come off a 10-4 win over Hernando in their previous game.

"We were just on," said first-year coach Ashley Nickisher, who took over for Nelson Garcia in the offseason. "Tonight, we found it. The girls know what they can do."

The Bulldogs, who have struggled of late and lost three in a row, dropped to 2-5 and 1-1 in district play.

"We're struggling," said Kristen Dumont, now in her fourth season as Zephyrhills' coach. "Our practices are hard. We've just got to convert that to the game."

Afterward, Dumont spoke of the importance of it being a district game against Wesley Chapel, yet not quite on par with longtime arch-rival Pasco.

"They're really not like a Pasco," she said.

Nikisher, a 2019 Cypress Creek graduate, recalled playing against Zephyrhills for two seasons at that school, which followed one year at Wesley Chapel. During her one-year stint with the Wildcats she played for Steve Mumaw, who coached baseball and softball at that school and is now their athletic director.

"It was always a good game," she said of matchups against the Bulldogs.

For the Bulldogs, most of their runs against Wesley Chapel came from hustling on the

basepaths once runners got on.

Zephyrhills took a 1-0 lead in the top of the first inning when Laila Woolfolk reached on an infield error, advanced to third base on Dakota Deck's double and scored when Hannah Helms grounded into a double play.

Then, trailing 11-1 in the top of the fifth, the Bulldogs added three more runs by being aggressive. Emily Mohler led off with a double and Harmonie Scribner reached on an infield error. Mohler scored on a Laila Woolfolk single, Scribner raced home on a groundout and Woolfolk came in on a base hit by Deck.

"That's what we've been doing at practice," Dumont said of her players doing their best to stretch out plays by going from first to third on a hit and moving up being a throw at another base. "We're looking for that extra base."

The Wildcats had plenty of extra bases against the Bulldogs. Of their 14 hits, five went for extra bases. Juliana Martin, who scored three times and drove in three runs, doubled twice. Adding a double apiece were Aly O'Dette, Madisen Stewart and Ava Blakely.

Like Martin, Courtney Marks, a standout leadoff batter who is committed to Western Carolina, and each had three hits. Marks also had three RBIs and scored twice while Blakely drove in three and came across the plate two times as well.

O'Dette and Eliana Diaz also drove in runs for the Wildcats with Alanis Escalante, Madelyn Young, Kendall McCants and Skai Crocitto each scoring once.

Nickisher played college softball at Newberry and Pasco-Hernando State College. That latter stint marked the second time she played for Mumaw, who at the time was coaching the Bobcats.

Nikisher is majoring in criminal justice degree at Saint Leo University and plans on graduating this spring. Having been an assistant at Wharton last season, she eagerly welcomed the chance to coach her favorite sport at her alma mater.

The Wildcats are coming off an 18-6 last season in which they finished as district runners-up.
