# Council recognizes local citizens, wraps up townhome development

Monday's city council meeting recognized three Zephyrhills residents, adopted a water proclamation and handled other city business

Local residents Lonnie Cooper and Michael Sheffler were given Special Recognition awards by Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield on Monday. Zephyrhills Utilities Director John Bostic told the story of how Cooper and Sheffler rendered first aid to a man in the Sundance Mobile Home Park that had hit his head during a fall. The city employees stayed with the man until paramedics arrived.

Another city employee, Kerney Pelfrey, was recognized for his long career with the city and celebrated his retirement. Zephyrhills Public Works Director Shane LeBlanc spoke highly of Pelfrey for his loyalty and hard work and said that he worked numerous storms and events, that he was a, "big asset to the department for the last 35 years" and that he will be, "tough to replace."

sure what to do? Pasco County Animal Services

"Most lost dogs are found within a mile of theirhome, and often in the same neighborhood," said PCAS Director Mike Shumate. "Keeping them in the same area where they're found gives them the best chance of getting back home.

Options for trying to find a dog's owner include: posting info to websites/social media; checking with neighbors; distributing flyers; and contacting vet clinics for microchip.

If you find an aggressive, sick or injured

PCAS also has a Finder to Foster program,

which allows you to hold onto lost dogs during their legal stray hold time. You can bring the dog to the shelter and they can post the information Have you ever found a lost dog, but aren't on their website. Then, after the stray period, and after the dog has been medically cleared and (PCAS) encourages you to try to find a lost spayed or neutered, you can choose to adopt the dog's owner before taking the dog to the shelter. dog or bring it back to the shelter for adoption.



linear foot roadway extension to serve the proposed National Guard Armory. The project will extend South Avenue, north of 6th Avenue to serve as an entrance road. The not-to-exceed cost of \$67,200 is part of a state appropriation the city received.

Item 2.2 awarded a contract bid to Amici Engineering to build the Northside Lift Station and Force Main. Amici was the lowest bidder of six bids and it asked for a total amount of \$4,753,591.50 that included a \$226,361.50 contingency. There are other costs associated with the project that could push the price tag to more like \$4.9 million. Only \$4.5 million is budgeted in the FY23 Budget. Any overage beyond the \$4.5 million budgeted amount will be taken from the Effluent Pumping Station Project, which is \$1million, with the idea that the effluent pumping station project will be put off to 2024. Both items passed 5-0.

Business Items and the Planning Director's Report both wrapped up final phases of the Tyson Townhome Subdivision. Item 3.1 was the first reading of a vacation of right-of-way of a portion of Henry Drive next to the project dea 6.1-foot strip of land that runs east-west for 5-0. approximately 506 linear feet, south of Henry

Drive. The private roadway was deeded to the city in 1971

Senior Planner Rodney Corriveau called the item, "an error in legal description" and noted that the right-of-way was not in use by the

In the Planning Director's Report, Item 4.1 asked for council to approve the final plat for the Tyson Townhome Project. It was noted that some infrastructure for the project was not yet completed but the applicant provided staff a required letter of credit for the yet to be installed infrastructure, as well as a maintenance bond and the related engineer's cost estimates and including a subdivider's agreement.

Corriveau stated that the 140 townhome development answered the city's need for affordable housing. He also pointed out that it is adjacent to the future Hercules Park amenity. Staff reviewed the plat and recommended approval and both items passed 5-0.

In the City Manager's Report, Item 5.1 asked for council's approval to purchase additional software modules from Tyler Technologies. The city originally purchased some software modules in 2016 and staff now recognizes the need to purchase some additional modules at a cost of \$194,488. The cost is expected to be covered between the line item in the FY23 and velopment. The item asked the city to vacate FY24 budgets. Council approved the purchase

In the City Attorney's Report, Item 6.1 was

the first reading of a resolution authorizing city staff to participate in a joint meeting of the Municipal Association of Pasco on May 4 at Catches Waterfront Grille in Port Richey. The resolution passed 5-0.

Next was Item 6.2, a first reading of an ordinance that would establish Florida Water-Star certification requirements for new construction. The Florida Water-Star Program is sponsored by the SouthWest Florida Water Management District (SWFW-MD) and is a tool to help save on residential uses of potable water. They include: energy efficient appliances, water fixtures, toilets, irrigation and landscaping. The requirements are categorized into: plumbing, irrigation, maintenance of irrigation systems. There are also seven exemptions from the requirements and another section on Alternative Compliance. This will not have any fiscal impact to the city but it is expected to have a \$1,000 to \$2000 impact to the developer. Those types of incurred costs to developers are inherently passed on to home buyers. Participation in the Florida Water-Star Program is estimated to save the city 140,000 gallons of water per day. The items passed 5-0.

"This is a good first step to addressing our water issue," councilman Ken Burgess said. "We still need to look at developments, density levels and we are three or four years out from catching up to our traffic issues.'





HOLLYWOOD -- Jane Fonda, 85, finally fulfilled her wish to be a warrior queen when she voiced the Warrior Queen of the Seven Seas in the computer-animated, coming-of-age fantasy "Ruby Gillman: Teenage Kraken," due June 30. She'll first hit movie screens May 12 in "Book Club: The Next Chapter," with Diane Keaton, Candice Bergen and Mary Steenburgen. Hopefully, it will be more successful than "80 for Brady," which, despite having the star power of Fonda, Lily Tomlin, Sally Field, Rita Moreno and Tom Brady, cost \$28 million and grossed just under \$40 million.

Twenty-three years ago, "Gladiator" won Oscars for Best Picture, Best Actor (Russell Crowe), Best Visual Effects, Best Sound and Best Costume Design. Now, director Ridley Scott, 85, is finally making his sequel. This time, it'll star Irish actor Paul Mescal (who received an Oscar nomination for Best Actor this year for "Aftersun") and "Banshees Of Inisherin" Best Supporting Actor nominee Barry Keoghan. (Keoghan's up next in "Saltburn," with Rosamund Pike, Jacob Elordi and Carey Mulligan.) Add Denzel Washington (up next in "The Equalizer 3," due Sept. 1) to the mix, which will reteam him with Scott, his "American Gangster" direc-

You can also expect a Gladiator-style series that is currently in the works, starring Anthony Hopkins, and also a reboot of Starz's "Spartacus" series.

Russell Crowe is back with a vengeance, with "The Pope's Exorcist" (due April 14), costarring Franco Nero. Crowe also has "Kraven the Hunter," with Aaron Taylor-Johnson and Ariana DeBose due October 6, as well as two films still awaiting release dates -first is "The Georgetown Project," with Sam Worthington, David Hyde Pierce and Karen Gillan. The second film is "Sleeping Dogs," also with Gillan, who will star as Nebula in the upcoming "Guardians of the Galaxy Vol. 3," releasing May 5.

Cheech & Chong were way ahead of their time when they made the pro-marijuana film "Up in Smoke" (1978) for a mere \$2 million, which grossed a whopping \$104 million. Now 76, Cheech Marin has made about 80 films and starred in many TV series, including "Nash Bridges" (1996-2001). Tommy Chong, now 84, has made 21 films and about a hundred TV appearances. But now, the comedy duo are the subjects of an upcoming biopic. What could be more timely?

Before winning an Oscar for Best Actress for "Everything Everywhere All at Once," Michelle Yeoh was already the busiest actress in Hollywood. June 9 brings just her voice in "Transformers: Rise of the Beasts," while Sept. 15 brings "A Haunting In Venice," with Kenneth Branagh, Jamie Dornan and Tina Fey.

Yeoh's also lending her voice to "The Tiger's Apprentice" and starring as Madame Morrible in "Wicked: Part One," due November 2024, and "Wicked: Part Two," due in 2025. Not to mention, she's already filmed "Avatar 3," releasing December 2024, and "Avatar 4," releasing December 2026. Even before she won her Oscar, she was already yo-yoing between multiple movie sets!


