The message was abundantly clear for a recent community event at the B&B Theater at The Groves. The Thrive Over 55 Senior Expo afforded visitors

with plenty of tools and information, not to mention goodie bags, to do just that — thrive.

The April 5 event, held in the morning at one of the largest shopping centers in the Wesley Chapel area lured people from Zephyrhills, Dade City, Wesley Chapel and Land O' Lakes, not to mention outlying areas in northern Hillsborough and Hernando counties.

Council recognizes local citizens, wraps up townhome development

Monday's city council meeting recognized three Zephyrhills residents, adopted a water proclamation and handled other city business

Local residents Lonnie Cooper and Michael Sheffler were given Special Recognition awards by Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield on Monday. Zephyrhills Utilities Director John Bostic told the story of how Cooper and Sheffler rendered first aid to a man in the Sundance Mobile Home Park that had hit his head during a fall. The city employees stayed with the man until paramedics arrived.

Another city employee, Kerney Pelfrey, was recognized for his long career with the city and celebrated his retirement. Zephyrhills Public Works Director Shane LeBlanc spoke highly of Pelfrey for his loyalty and hard work and said that he worked numerous storms and events, that he was a, "big asset to the department for the last 35 years" and that he will be, "tough to replace."

Next was a Water Conservation Proclamation. Whitfield read the proclamation aloud denoting April as Water Conservation Month. This came at an appropriate time as the city faces challenges providing water services for its growing population. It also comes in the driest month in Florida. The proclamation calls for, "each citizen and business to help protect our precious resource by practicing water saving measures and becoming more aware of the need to save water."

There were two items on the Consent Agenda. Item 1.1 asked for council's approval of a Task Order for contractor BGE to design and permit a 1,300

Bulldogs take a chomp out of Seahawks

Zephyrhills defeats Sunshine Athletic Conference rival Sunlake 10-2 at John F. Clements Field

So far, this season has been filled with plenty of ups than downs for the Zephyrhills High baseball team. That was readily apparent in last Friday night's 10-2 win over Sunshine Athletic Conference rival Sunlake at John F. Clements Field.

The host Bulldogs, who opened this season with a strong six-game winning streak, struggled a bit at midseason. They seem to be back on track, however, improving to 9-4 overall with their third win in the past four games.

"We're coming back and we're battling," said Rusty Guynn, the 2022 Sunshine Athletic Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Bulldogs to 12 wins and a region quarterfinal berth despite not making it to a district final. "We have to keep it up."

Zephyrhills starter Austin Dobbins pitched what was arguably his best game of the season, scattering seven hits with five strikeouts and just

one walk. The senior righthander also fared pretty well at the plate with two hits and four RBIs.

"He's thrown the ball well all year," said Guynn, a former Zephyrhills ballplayer. "He's up and down with the bat, but he's been swinging it well lately."

Assistant coach Ebby McClellan, who had two

sons previously play for Zephyrhills, spoke highly of Dobbins' outing on the mound as well.

"This is probably the smoothest he's looked all year," McClellan said. "When you work ahead of the count it helps you because it keeps your pitch

Pasco County Animal Services: help lost dogs get home

Keeping lost pets in area where they're found helps reunite them with their families

Have you ever found a lost dog, but aren't sure what to do? Pasco County Animal Services (PCAS) encourages you to try to find a lost dog's owner before taking the dog to the shelter.

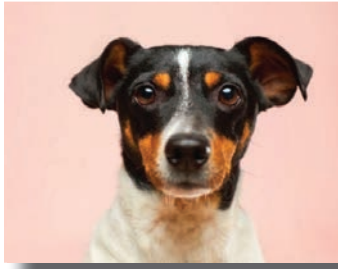
"Most lost dogs are found within a mile of their home, and often in the same neighborhood," said PCAS Director Mike Shumate. "Keeping them in the same area where they're found gives them the best chance of getting back home."

Options for trying to find a dog's owner include: posting info to websites/social media; checking with neighbors; distributing flyers; and contacting vet clinics for microchip.

If you find an aggressive, sick or injured

animal, call PCAS at (813) 929-1212.

PCAS also has a Finder to Foster program, which allows you to hold onto lost dogs during their legal stray hold time. You can bring the dog to the shelter and they can post the information on their website. Then, after the stray period, and after the dog has been medically cleared and spayed or neutered, you can choose to adopt the dog or bring it back to the shelter for adoption.

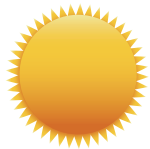

linear foot roadway extension to serve the proposed National Guard Armory. The project will extend South Avenue, north of 6th Avenue to serve as an entrance road. The not-to-exceed cost of \$67,200 is part of a state appropriation the city received.

Item 2.2 awarded a contract bid to Amici Engineering to build the Northside Lift Station and Force Main. Amici was the lowest bidder of six bids and it asked for a total amount of \$4,753,591.50 that included a \$226,361.50 contingency. There are other costs associated with the project that could push the price tag to more like \$4.9 million. Only \$4.5 million is budgeted in the FY23 Budget. Any overage beyond the \$4.5 million budgeted amount will be taken from the Effluent Pumping Station Project, which is \$1million, with the idea that the effluent pumping station project will be put off to 2024. Both items passed 5-0.

Business Items and the Planning Director’s Report both wrapped up final phases of the Tyson Townhome Subdivision. Item 3.1 was the first reading of a vacation of right-of-way of a portion of Henry Drive next to the project development. The item asked the city to vacate a 6.1-foot strip of land that runs east-west for approximately 506 linear feet, south of Henry

Drive. The private roadway was deeded to the city in 1971.

Senior Planner Rodney Corriveau called the item, “an error in legal description” and noted that the right-of-way was not in use by the public.

In the Planning Director’s Report, Item 4.1 asked for council to approve the final plat for the Tyson Townhome Project. It was noted that some infrastructure for the project was not yet completed but the applicant provided staff a required letter of credit for the yet to be installed infrastructure, as well as a maintenance bond and the related engineer’s cost estimates and including a subdivider’s agreement.

Corriveau stated that the 140 townhome development answered the city’s need for affordable housing. He also pointed out that it is adjacent to the future Hercules Park amenity. Staff reviewed the plat and recommended approval and both items passed 5-0.


In the City Manager’s Report, Item 5.1 asked for council’s approval to purchase additional software modules from Tyler Technologies. The city originally purchased some software modules in 2016 and staff now recognizes the need to purchase some additional modules at a cost of \$194,488. The cost is expected to be covered between the line item in the FY23 and FY24 budgets. Council approved the purchase 5-0.

In the City Attorney’s Report, Item 6.1 was the first reading of a resolution authorizing city staff to participate in a joint meeting of the Municipal Association of Pasco on May 4 at Catches Waterfront Grille in Port Richey. The resolution passed 5-0.

Next was Item 6.2, a first reading of an ordinance that would establish Florida Water-Star certification requirements for new construction. The Florida Water-Star Program is sponsored by the SouthWest Florida Water Management District (SWFWMD) and is a tool to help save on residential uses of potable water. They include: energy efficient appliances, water fixtures, toilets, irrigation and landscaping. The requirements are categorized into: plumbing, irrigation, maintenance of irrigation systems. There are also seven exemptions from the requirements and another section on Alternative Compliance. This will not have any fiscal impact to the city but it is expected to have a \$1,000 to \$2000 impact to the developer. Those types of incurred costs to developers are inherently passed on to home buyers. Participation in the Florida Water-Star Program is estimated to save the city 140,000 gallons of water per day. The items passed 5-0.

“This is a good first step to addressing our water issue,” councilman Ken Burgess said. “We still need to look at developments, density levels and we are three or four years out from catching up to our traffic issues.”

Nobody in the game had a better view of Dobbins' pitching than Zephyrhills catcher Matthew Casarez: "Honestly, this is the best I've seen him all year."
