Kim Miller, an assistant girls basketball coach at Zephyrhills High, and former adaptive athlete Scarlett Lawhorne, a 2014 Zephyrhills High graduate, put together a program labeled All Abilities Month. Both work for the Pasco County Parks & Recreation

Department with Lawhorne in Dade City and Miller in Wesley Chapel.

The most recent event for local kids with physical disabilities or autism took place last Saturday at the Clearwater Community Sailing Center. Five kids enrolled in the Academy of Spectrum Diversity in Zephyrhills and a handful of others from the region sailed in small two-seaters with a few opting for a ride on a pontoon boat.

"It's crucial that we get them out in the community and let them try new things that they otherwise would not do," said Chris Dester, who along with his wife Tammy runs the local academy. "The sailing program was over the moon. It was incredible."

# Council seats new members and takes water conservation steps

*Monday's city council meeting saw a changing of the guard among other business*

The election results are in and there are two new faces on the Zephyrhills City Council. Mayor Gene Whitfield led the ceremony accepting the canvassing of votes from the April 11 municipal election. It would be one of Whitfield's final acts as mayor. He anointed his replacement, Melonie Monson Bahr and acknowledged former City Manager Steve Spina as having won the election for Seat 2 on the council. Both Monson Bahr and Spina were present to take the Oath of Office performed by City Clerk Lori Hillman.

Council accepted the results of those elections pertaining to Items 1.1 and 1.2 by a count of 5-0. Item 1.3 accepted the results by a vote of 5-0, seven of the eight proposals for changes to the City's Charter.

Only Referendum 6 did not pass. REFERENDUM 6 – Change from petition signatures may not be signed more than sixty (60) days prior to the date of election to remove the time constraints to obtain signatures to qualify for election, failed to pass.

Item 1.4 reorganized the council with Lance Smith taking over as council president and Ken Burgess moving into vice president. Both changes passed 5-0. Next was Item 1.5 that announced council member liaison appointments to: the Ridge League of Cities, Chamber of Commerce, Main Street Zephyrhills, the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), the Metropolitan Planning Organization Alternate and the Tourist Development Council (TDC). The only changes were adding Steve Spina as an alternate for the MPO.

Next up was Item 1.6 giving special recognition

Even the Purple People Eaters couldn't help the Zephyrhills High softball team in last week's game against Cypress Creek. The host Bulldogs lost 2-1 at Craig Milburn Field despite the pregame presence of a Minor B girls softball team from the Zephyrhills Little League.

"I can't take credit for it," Zephyrhills coach Kristen Dumont said. "They are definitely the talk of the town. I don't think they'll forget about that for a while."

The idea actually came from Dave Walters, a longtime local photojournalist and former Zephyrhills News reporter who coaches that Little League team.

"I asked Kristen if we could do it and she said

"It's so weird, because just a few years ago I was there and looking up to these (varsity) girls, and now I'm one of them," said Tackett, who also plays for the

Dade City Blackout, a regional travel team.

Cypress Creek rallied from an early deficit for the narrow one-run victory over its Sunshine Athletic Conference rival. The Coyotes improved to 9-8 while the Bulldogs dropped to 5-10.

Cypress Creek coach Kaitlyn Minor lauded the performance of freshman pitcher Emily Bowling,

# Miracle Ear Foundation honors top provider team from Zephyrhills

The Miracle-Ear Foundation has named Shawna Bertrand, a hearing care professional (HCP) and Melinda Shaffer, front office associate from Zephyrhills, as the non-profit's Top Provider Team for 2022. In 2022, Bertrand and Shaffer fit 37 local individuals with free hearing aids and raised more than \$11,000 to continue the foundation's mission of providing those with hearing aids who could not otherwise afford them. They were both honored at Miracle-Ear's annual convention in Cap Cana, Dominican Republic.

The Miracle-Ear Foundation is the philanthropic arm of Miracle-Ear and helps those who are in need of hearing aids but cannot afford them. The program benefits underserved individuals with a limited income and no other resources for hearing aids, such as insurance, Medicaid, VA, or other state or federal programs.

The Miracle-Ear Foundation recognizes the previous year's Top Provider annually at the Miracle-Ear Convention. Bertrand was named Top Provider out of more than 856 hearing care professionals who gave the Gift of Sound through the Miracle Ear Foundation

in 2022. Bertrand and Shaffer's impressive 37 fittings contributed to an overall 3,139 new foundation fittings last year.

Bertrand is deeply committed to her community and wants to help as many people as she can.

"I think it's one of the better jobs out there, that I can say I come to work every day and love what I do," said Bertrand.

Since 1990, the Miracle-Ear Foundation has delivered the Gift of Sound to approximately 21,000 children and adults across the country, touching and transforming their lives. There are more than 1,500 Miracle-Ear stores throughout the country.

"I was raised by my grandmother, and was always struggling to make ends meet, and different programs in the community were always helping us. I just remember how awesome that was and how great it felt that someone cared," said Shaffer. "I really connect with these people when they [tell] me about their story, I just know how that feels."

# Pasco Sheriff's Office tips for water safety

Have While the warm weather tempts citizens to take a swim this summer, it's imperative to do so safely. Drownings can occur within seconds, especially when it comes to children. Pasco Sheriff's Office is sharing water safety tips to stay safe near water when enjoying water activities such as going out on a boat or visiting the beach or pool.

Take steps to ensure children are safe near water. Never leave children unattended or assume someone else is watching children when near water. Do not leave objects out, such as toys or floats, that may attract a child to the pool area. Teach children to swim, and to only get in or near the water when a responsible adult is present. Learn to perform CPR, and keep a phone and first aid kit nearby for emergencies. In the event of an emergency, call 9-1-1, and start life-saving procedures, such as CPR.

Keep pools secure to prevent a drowning. Check that drain covers and gates are secure. Use at least a four-foot-high fence with self-closing and self-latching gates around all pools. Never leave something a child could use to climb over a fence or gate nearby. Use pool covers and install alarms, such as a wave-activated alarm in the pool or an alarm on the door leading from the house to the pool. Ensure life-saving equipment, such as life rings or reaching poles are in good condition and readily available.

When boating, check the weather forecast before heading out. Be prepared for high winds, sun and other elements, and be prepared to these conditions to change rapidly. Without proper knowledge of potential weather hazards, boating can put your vessel and passengers at risk. Don't forget to stay hydrated and to bring plenty of drinkable water. Always designate a sober captain as well. Boating while intoxicated is not only illegal, but alcohol impairment affects the body differently while on the water and you may feel the effects sooner than drinking on land.

Before heading out on the boat, always check your equipment. Make sure your equipment is up-to-date and in good working condition. This includes making sure you have the proper permits, a fire extinguisher and easily accessible life jackets. Complete a float plan before you leave by letting someone who is staying shoreside know where you are going and launching from, how you plan to get there and approximately when you are leaving and plan to return. Float plans are critical in the event of an emergency and will give search and rescue crews a huge advantage in where to begin. Always complete safety checks before you launch.

Just how drivers share the road, boaters must remember to share the water and its resources. Be patient while at boat ramps and launch sites and follow all posted signs. Be cautious and

reduce speeds near other vessels while on the water. Keep an eye out for other citizens on the water such as kayakers, paddle boarders and swimmers. Always look for dive flags to help keep snorkelers and divers safe when below the surface too. Be vigilant of wildlife, and give animals plenty of space.

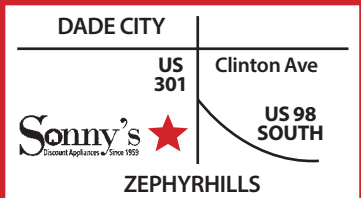

to the Zephyrhills Police Department. This proclamation was read by new mayor Monson Bahr. It told of an incident on April 13 when ZPD officers were able to use non-lethal means to subdue and disarm an armed suspect who appeared bent on goading the officers into “Suicide by Cop,” as the proclamation read. Officers rendered first aid to the suspect before he was taken by Pasco Fire Rescue to the hospital with minor injuries. Bahr denoted April 13, 2023 as a day of special recognition for the Zephyrhills Police Department.

Item 1.7 acknowledged outgoing Zephyrhills Mayor Gene Whitfield and councilman Alan Knight for their years of service to the city.

In the Consent Agenda, Items 2.1 and 2.2 approved minutes from the April 10 and March 27 meetings, respectively.

Item 2.3 asked for council’s approval for an amendment to the North Side Lift Station/Force Main Project. Originally budgeted for \$187,515, the contract provided for Jones Edmunds to provide Engineering Services During Construction (ESDC), limited on-site project representation, and contract closeout services. The amendment would add \$129,650 to the contract. While the project is awaiting the award of a bid to the construction contractor, the aforementioned services are necessary before, during, and after construction of the project to ensure all documentation is correct, inspections are performed correctly, and the work continues as efficiently as possible.

It was noted that, at certain times during construction activities, if city employees are able to complete some of the inspections, the costs of the services will be reduced. The total cost of the service rose to \$317,165.

Item 2.4 was a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the City of Zephyrhills and the Fraternal Order of Police to amend Article 28 of the union contract for officers, detectives, and SROs. The proposed language is, “Law enforcement officers with three or more years of service with another agency shall start at step two of the compensation plan.”

This works out to an annual increase of \$2,711.15 more than the current starting pay.

Item 2.5 was a reassignment of an operating agreement from JJ Aeronautics, Inc.(assignor) to Posada Aviation, LLC (assignee). All five Consent Agenda Items were bundled together and passed 5-0.

In Business Items, Item 3.1 codified, on its second reading, an ordinance establishing Florida WaterStar Certification Requirements for new construction. The Florida WaterStar Program is sponsored by the SWFWMD and is a tool to save on current residential uses of potable water. This program states what needs to be

installed in new and/or existing developments and/or homes. Such as water and energy efficient appliances, water fixtures, toilets, landscaping and irrigation. The Florida WaterStar Program is estimated to save the city 140,000 gallons of water per day with the implementation of the program.

Council was careful to highlight that this applied to new construction. The estimated cost to a developer, per home, will be approximately \$1,000 - \$2,000. This cost is most often passed on to the home buyer. The item, which passed upon its first reading, passed 5-0 on the second reading Monday night.

In the Planning Director’s Report, Item 4.1 asked for council’s approval of a Future Land Use Map Amendment (FLUMA) and rezoning for Blue Triton Brands, formerly Nestle. The proposal asked to expand the existing water plant. The first part asked that the 7.64-acre property be allowed to change the subject property’s future land use designation from Res-3 to Industrial. The second part asked to change the subject property’s zoning classification from County Res3 to LI.

According to the utilities department, the anticipated impact on the city’s water supply is 128,632 gallons per day at project build out over a five-year period. It should be noted that Nestle, Blue Triton’s former monicker received a permit from the Suwannee River Water Management District in 2021, to pump 1 million gallons of water per day out of Ginnie Springs, one of the treasured natural springs along the Santa Fe River in north-central Florida. This item passed 5-0.

Item 4.2 was a request for conditional use for Premium Stone Gallery Warehouse & RV Storage. The 12-month moratorium passed on Feb. 27, did not preclude this request as the applicants held a pre-application meeting with city staff on Feb. 8 and submitted a complete application on Feb. 24 prior to the effective date of the ordinances, and are therefore exempt from the moratorium. After much discussion, council elected to take no action on the item.

In the City Manager’s Report, Item 5.1 asked for council’s approval of a second amendment to the amended Tennis Pro Florida, LLC Agreement. The amendment read:

Article 13. Miscellaneous 13.4 - This section requires that Pascal Collard retain majority ownership of Tennis Pro Florida, LLC., if he owns less, the city may deem it a breach of contract and immediately terminate. The language requires that Pascal Collard remain the CEO of Tennis Pro Florida and Operating Manager of SVB Tennis Center. However, additional language is added to transfer the title and duties to Andrew Sorrentino should Collard be unable to perform the duties as the director of SVB or become temporarily incapacitated. The item passed 5-0.

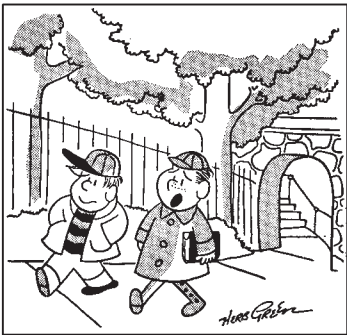

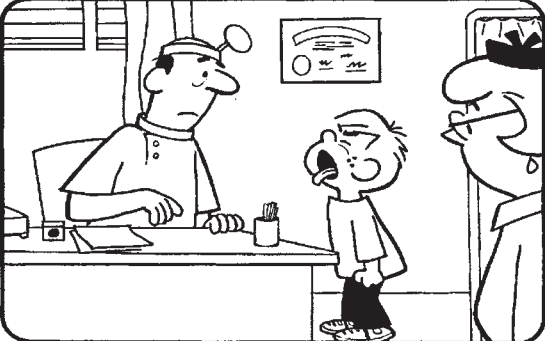

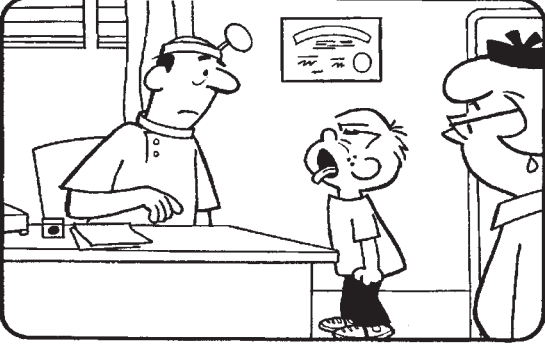

## Community Expo highlights new Pasco County Medical Research Center and job opportunities for students, alumni, and area residents

With an eye to the future, Saint Leo University hosted the first Moffitt & Saint Leo University Community Expo to showcase career and educational opportunities.

The Moffitt & Saint Leo University Community Expo was open to the public and offered resume reviews; a career fair; wellness and mindfulness activities; a networking lunch; and informational sessions including discussion of Saint Leo's nursing, medical humanities, biology and natural sciences, and social work programs as well as career opportunities at Moffitt. Participants had the opportunity to engage in discussions about partnership opportunities with Pasco County and Saint Leo and learn about the exciting cancer research being conducted by Saint Leo students and faculty and by Moffitt personnel and students.

Both institutions are committed to developing and supporting people as a whole in body, mind, and spirit, noted Dr. Ed Dadez, university president, during the kickoff celebration marking the collaboration between Moffitt and Saint Leo.

"Saint Leo's motto is 'Courage to be More,' and that is a common thread," Dadez said about the two institutions, with both offering opportunities for people to make the world a better place.

"Our vision very much aligns with the university," said Dr. Kelley Gonzalvo, vice president of patient care services and chief nursing officer of Moffitt Cancer Center. Moffitt was established in 1986 by the Florida Legislature and now has more than 8,000 team members, she said.

Moffitt also is expanding into Pasco County, which is home to Saint Leo, with its 775-acre Speros FL, a global center for research, health care, and innovation.

Donald Futrell, vice president of planning, design and construction for Moffitt, along with Mike Bishop, director of stakeholder engagement for the Pasco Economic Development Council, and Dr. Mark Gesner, vice president of community engagement and communications for Saint Leo, discussed partnership opportunities for the county, university, and the new Moffitt development.

Futrell noted that Speros FL will be larger than downtown Tampa. "We're building a city," he said. Approximately 500 of the 775 acres will be developed leaving 35 percent of the land for environmental conservation. "It will blend with the natural environment and be sustainable," Futrell said. World-class architects also will capture the essence of the environment and provide space that helps with the healing process.

A recurring theme for the Moffitt & Saint Leo University Community Expo was that "opportunities are limitless," and those attending the conference were excited about the collaborative possibilities, including internships, jobs for graduates and alumni, training and research collaborations, and much more.

For example, the massive new development will provide many opportunities in areas such as artificial intelligence, patient care, general biotech, research, patient care, medical tourism, pharma, radiology, lodging and hotels, cell therapies, and more.

When the Speros FL project is completed, Moffitt anticipates its members will number 14,000. By the end of 2027, Moffitt projects it will have 2,400 employees on the Pasco County campus.

Not only are scientists, researchers, nurses, and other medical professionals needed, but there also will be jobs in cybersecurity, business operations, social work, information technology, and other fields.

Saint Leo Vice President of Academic Affairs Mary Spoto, as well as faculty members Dr. Kathy Van Eerden, dean of the College of Health Professions; Dr. Ebony Perez, chair of undergraduate social work; and Dr. Laura Altfeld, chair of natural and physical sciences, presented many of the educational opportunities that Saint Leo offers for degree-seeking individuals.

Moffitt representatives also

discussed the needs in their areas. Representing Moffitt were Sean Powell, senior director of care management and social work; Courtney Ullrich, pharmacy manager, and digital health representative; Marc Perkins-Carillo, chief nursing informatics officer; and Sissy Schilling, chief applications systems officer.

Ullrich told a student who is majoring in biology with minors in chemistry and education, that the pharmacy area of Moffitt could be a great fit. From medication education to advising people, it all is teaching. "One of the reasons I went into pharmacy is because I love teaching," she said.

A Research Showcase put the spotlight on cancer research at Saint Leo University and Moffitt. Dr. Sergiy Borysov, Saint Leo assistant professor of biology at Saint Leo University; and Moffitt representatives Dr. Aleksandra Karolak, faculty, machine learning; and Moffitt lab students Ishwarya Maganti and Aarya Preetam Satardekah, shared insight into their research.

Borysov, who also studied and worked at Moffitt, noted that Saint Leo and the cancer center have practical approaches to problems. "We are providing practical, relevant education at Saint Leo," he said. "We try to engage our students in so much practical experience."

And those students translate that hands-on learning and research into careers in many fields.

"I am so excited about our future," said Bill Cronin, Pasco Economic Development Council president/CEO, in a statement. Cronin was in the United Kingdom talking to businesses about partnering with Moffitt's Speros FL.

"Saint Leo University and Moffitt Cancer Center are both well-known centers of excellence. Having the two institutions work together to enhance our talent pipeline will benefit Pasco County and the Tampa Bay region for generations to come. These are the kind of partnerships that bolster a strong infrastructure support system and attracts life science companies and venture capitalists. Congratulations to Pasco EDC Policy Council members, Saint Leo University, and Moffitt Cancer Center."

So much so that when the academy students — Luke Gagnon, Noah Sublette, Nicholas Dester, Blake Wable and Hope Holloway — showed up for classes on Monday, others who heard about the adventure expressed their interest in sailing.

The academy, which opened in 2017, enrolls 65 students from kindergarten through high school seniors, with a waiting list.

That program was not around when Lawhorne, who has spina bifida and is wheelchair-bound, was in school. That is why she and Miller came up with the idea for All Abilities Month in April. Other programs included an adaptive sports day at Wesley Chapel District Park and racket sports at the Sarah Vande Berg Tennis Center.

“I used to do adaptive sports,” said Lawhorne, a state high school champion in adaptive sports and a 2021 Clemson graduate. “No Limits Sports Day (which took place several years ago in Tampa) was similar to this. We hope to do it every year.”

As for the sailing, Gagnon said, “I think it’s a great learning experience.”

Sublette’s mother Amanda, who is from Wesley Chapel, rode on the pontoon boat while her son sailed in the intercoastal waters near Clearwater Beach with a volunteer.

“I have great hope for the program because he’s introduced to things that he normally

wouldn’t have to experience to do,” she said.

For those who sailed alongside a volunteer, Jeff Miller, skipper of the pontoon boat, said, “Anybody can sail.”

Wheelchair-bound Natalie Rijos, Lauren Neal, Emily Clarke and Myrna Concepcion also came to the sailing center on Saturday. Only Concepcion went out on a pontoon boat while the others remained on land with Lawhorne.

Rijos, Neal and Clarke took part in other adaptive events in April, playing basketball and participating in tennis in the park’s gym.

“Love of the game and being part of a team,” Clarke, 24, said of why she has played wheelchair basketball for 16 years.

Neal, an 18-year-old who began playing wheelchair basketball at the age of 7, mentioned overcoming her apprehensions and how much she enjoys playing the game.

“It was very scary at first. I was the youngest and the smallest,” she said. “I made friends who helped me along the way.”

Paul Schulte, a 44-year-old engineer who works for a firm that designs wheelchairs, did not attend the sailing event, but he did lead a group during the scrimmage of wheelchair basketball players earlier this month.

“The more opportunities there are for adaptive sports, the better,” said Schulte, who played numerous sports as a youngster but landed in a wheelchair after a car accident when he was 10.

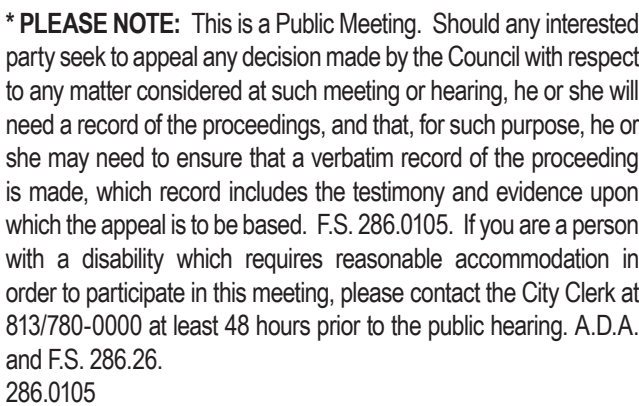

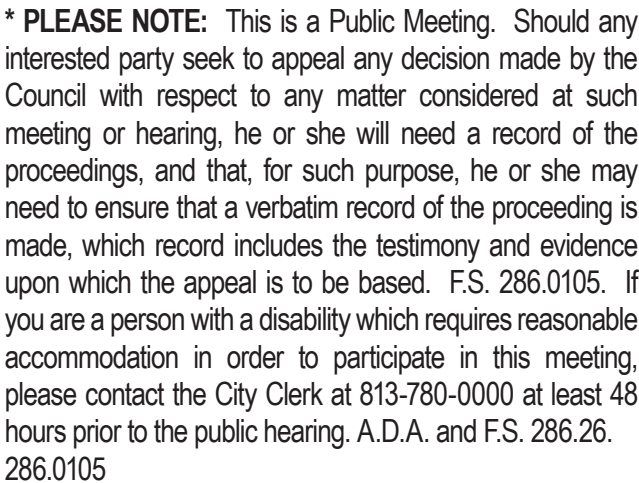
