### Council seats new members and takes water conservation steps

Monday's city council meeting saw a changing of the guard among other business

The election results are in and there are two new faces on the Zephyrhills City Council. Mayor Gene Whitfield led the ceremony accepting the canvassing of votes from the April 11 municipal election. It would be one of Whitfield's final acts as mayor. He anointed his replacement, Melonie Monson Bahr and acknowledged former City Manager Steve Spina as having won the election for Seat 2 on the council. Both Monson Bahr and Spina were present to take the Oath of Office performed by City Clerk Lori Hillman.

Council accepted the results of those elections pertaining to Items 1.1 and 1.2 by a count of 5-0. Item 1.3 accepted the results by a vote of 5-0, seven of the eight proposals for changes to the City's Charter.

Only Referendum 6 did not pass. REFEREN-DUM 6 - Change from petition signatures may not be signed more than sixty (60) days prior to the date of election to remove the time constraints to obtain signatures to qualify for election, failed to pass.

Item 1.4 reorganized the council with Lance Smith taking over as council president and Ken Burgess moving into vice president. Both changes passed 5-0. Next was Item 1.5 that announced council member liaison appointments to: the Ridge League of Cities, Chamber of Commerce, Main Street Zephyrhills, the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO), the Metropolitan Planning Organization Alternate and the Tourist Development Council (TDC). The only changes were adding Steve Spina as an alternate for the MPO.

Next up was Item 1.6 giving special recognition





#### Community cat program promotes health/safety

Have you ever found a cat or kitten and wondered what to do? Pasco County Animal Services (PCAS) wants to share a friendly reminder that the best way to help a cat or kitten you find roaming your neighborhood is to Leave Them Be!

"We appreciate the compassion of wellmeaning neighbors who want to help kittens by taking them to a shelter; however, mom is usually nearby and will soon return to care for her babies," said PCAS Director Mike Shumate. "Keeping these families together is the best way for everyone to stay healthy and happy." Here's how you can help: "Leave Them

Be" until mom returns – watch for eight hours; become a kitten foster parent until they're eight weeks old and can safely enter the shelter; learn from kitten feeding guides; and receive 'how-to' instructions and kitten care starter kits.

When kittens are three pounds, they can be brought in for TNVR (Trap Neuter Vaccinate Return) program, which is a humane, effective way of controlling the stray and feral cat population. PCAS also offers SNIP (Spay and Neuter in Pasco), an income-based, low-cost program for your pets.



HOLLYWOOD -- Austin Butler is taking on his first film project since his Oscar-nominated performance as Elvis Presley in "Elvis." His current project "City On Fire" will likely be a three-part franchise (if the film hits big), since it's based on a best-selling book in a trilogy by Don Winslow. The film mixes elements from three Greek tragedies -- "The Iliad," "Odyssey" and "Aeneid" -- and translates them to two contemporary criminal empires, one Irish and the other Italian, with a modern-day Helen of Troy plot.

Butler's got "Dune: Part Two" coming Nov. 3, and "The Bikeriders" then (which had a two-month shoot from October to December).

Even though Harry Styles successfully starred in "Don't Worry Darling" and "My Policeman" (in which he plays a gay policeman), he's turned down the chance to play Prince Eric in the upcoming reboot of "The Little Mermaid."

Styles had left the boyband One Direction to become a huge solo rock star (though his boas are a bit much), but then, he also became a full-fledged movie star.

It was bound to happen. The current reprinting of the book "Gone With the Wind" is getting a trigger warning for those who might be affected by descriptions of 19th century slavery in the Deep South. The text won't be altered in any way, but a warning gives notice of "shocking elements" and the romanticization of slavery in our history. Really? One of the greatest books ever written is a novel! When will this bull end?

"Paddington" (2014)grossed \$282.8 million, and "Paddington 2" (2017) grossed \$228 million. In July, they'll start shooting the threequel titled "Paddington in Peru" (Peru being the birthplace of the bear). While Hugh Bonneville and Ben Whishaw are returning, in addition to Julie Walters and Peter Capaldi, there's no mention of a return from Hugh Grant, who's currently riding high with "Dungeons & Dragons."

The unstoppable Harrison Ford (who turns 81 on July 13) has two television series -- "1923" with Dame Helen Mirren (for Paramount+) and "Shrinking" with Jason Segel (for AppleTV+) -- that were both renewed for another season. Plus, he has "Indiana Jones and the Dial of Destiny" releasing soon, which also stars Phoebe Waller-Bridge, Antonio Banderas, John Rhys-Davies, Toby Jones and Mads Mikkelsen. It will have its world premiere at the Cannes Film Festival (out of competition) on May 18.

The Cannes Film Festival will honor Ford at the premiere, but he'll have to interrupt shooting of "Captain America: New World Order," which won't wrap filming until June 30 and is set for a May 3, 2024 release. Ford has more energy than the Energizer Bunny ... he keeps going, and going, and going!
