City and county share trash detail

Zephyrhills and Pasco County workers join forces for a major trash haul, much to the approval of local residents

Zephyrhills and Pasco County have conducted numerous community trash pickups and drop-offs in the past, Zephyrhills within city limits only and the

county throughout all of its communities whether they be municipalities or unincorporated areas.

Last Saturday was markedly different with those two governmental agencies joining forces in a major cleanup effort, much to the satisfaction of local residents. The cleanup project began at 9 a.m. and lasted until 3 p.m.

The collaborative effort initially proposed by Pasco County Commissioner Ron Oakley, whose district primarily covers the east side of the county. City and county workers took it from there. In all, 40 workers — 20 from the city and 20 from the county — showed up at Zephyr Park with local people driving their vehicles, filled with trash and debris, along a service

City hall packed for parks and recreation meeting

Council chambers were full to the gills for a meeting discussing Zephyr Park renovations

It was standing room only last Thursday for the Zephyrhills Parks & Recreation meeting to discuss proposals and concept design for Zephyr Park. If there's a way to engage the public in Zephyrhills, set a meeting to discuss options for improving parks in the community. There was not a seat to be had in the house. Residents, city officials and journalists crammed the council chambers.

In a dose of irony, newly-elected Zephyrhills Mayor Melonie Monson Bahr and councilman Steve Spina were present at the meeting. The throngs of people that came out for the meeting, stayed at home during the election. A dismal, embarrassing really, 9.86 percent of the voting electorate even bothered to cast a ballot for the new municipal positions. Nevertheless, the community was out and it was engaged on Thursday night.

The meeting began as most city meetings do, with a call to order, an invocation and pledge of allegiance. It then jumped headlong into the concept plan for Zephyr Park. The project is a CRA project and CRA Director Gail Hamilton made some of the opening comments. Talk about renovating the park emerged back in May of 2016 when an initial open house was held to float ideas and garner public feedback. In 2018, a concept master plan was developed for the 34-acre site. Since then, the CRA has tapped an engineer and collated dozens if not hundreds of responses from the public that have helped shape the decisions going into the project.

Santiago was joined by four teammates honored on Senior Night. They included Maddox Rivera, Michah Berrien, Austin Dobbins and Tyler Gross, all of whom walked out onto the field with family members during a pregame ceremony that included personalized baseballs and engraved bats.

"It's been a very good group," Guynn said, noting that all but Gross have seen considerable playing

time since they were freshmen. "They're a huge part of what we've done the past four years."

For his part, Gross played on the junior varsity team as a freshman and was called up late the season as a sophomore.

Rivera and Santiago follow an older brother who

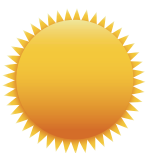

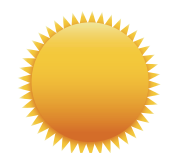

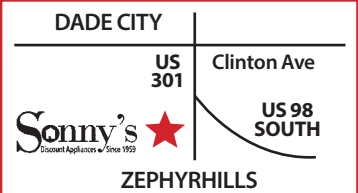

road adjacent to the city's tennis courts.

"It was quite the impressive undertaking and the cooperation between the city and county was second to none," said Shane LeBlanc, the city's public works director. "We shared resources, equipment, personnel and everybody worked hard."

Those sentiments were shared by James Byrd, the county's landfill supervisor at the East Pasco Lift Station off Handcart Road off Eiland Boulevard.

"This is good," he said. "This is the best turnout the city's had and we've had. (Oakley) wanted to get it done, so a couple of weeks ago we got with Shane to get it done."

In all, 68 tons of disposable items, many of which are not normally collected in city drop-offs, was collected, and with the use of heavy equipment and dump trucks was put into roll-off dumpsters and carted away. About 300 vehicles came through, some of which were repeats.

By comparison, the last trash dropoff conducted by the city was in April 2022. There were only 17 drop-offs at that time, in part because there had not been a citywide collection for a while. City officials had been scheduling drop-offs about three times per year, but those were temporarily halted during the coronavirus pandemic.

"We kind of got out of the habit of doing those things because of Covid," LeBlanc said.

In previous trash drop-offs, the city only accepted certain items. Any other disposables could not be dropped off.

"We would turn a resident around and say, 'You're going to have to take that to the transfer (or lift) station,'" LeBlanc said.

On Saturday, however, people were allowed to bring such things as pesticides, hazardous materials, electronics, batteries and other such items not normally collected. One of the 30-foot roll-offs was filled with nothing but paint.

Several residents shared some favorable comments as they drove through with the workers unloading items from their cars, trucks and trailers.

"I love all the guys being out here. They're efficient and quick," said Rebecca Moon, who along with her husband Allan dropped off a pickup full of disposables. "It's a good setup."

"I think it helps the community, especially the elderly and people who can't take stuff," said Charlene Morris, who came with her three-legged Chihuahua, Pepper.

Robin Kinsella, who brought mattresses and box springs, praised the city and county workers who unloaded things from the back of her truck.

"That is so nice to do this," she said.

As for another joint cleanup effort in the future by the city and county, prospects are good.

"Hopefully we can continue it because it's working good," LeBlanc said.

the majority of people (35-38 percent) visit the park once a month, 40 percent bring a dog with them when they visit, 68 percent stay at the park between 30 and 90 minutes, 63 percent use the park for walking and/or exercise, the top amenities people wanted to see with the renovation were better bathrooms and more trees. Some more results of the survey highlighted that people want biking options, better handicap access, boating/paddling options. There were results based on what style of amenities people would prefer. They seemed to be in favor of more modern than traditional playground equipment (42 to 24 percent). They seemed in favor of an integrated splash pad (highest percentage of 51); integrated being a number of features all integrated into the water system. All sorts of other options were presented, like what types of pavilions people liked, which types of shade structures they preferred, which types of boating options were preferred.

Once the presentation was finished, it was time for the public to make their voices heard. Zephyrhills City Manager William Poe Jr. jumped in front of the comment section stipulating that one - the tennis courts weren't moving and two - the veterans memorial wasn't going anywhere. This had already been stated twice in the meeting. Poe would make it a third time. Naturally, the first few residents that came up to speak bemoaned the tennis courts and the veterans memorial moving.

"This is the first of many meetings regarding what we want to see in our park," Hamilton said.

There were, however, some meaningful contributions to the discussion. Committee member Norman Scheurman noted that there were limited options for high and middle school-aged children in the park.

Erica Freeman brought up a salient point that upkeep is a present problem and that whatever changes were made, the city would need to adequately staff the park to maintain it. Both maintenance and high/middle school amenities were echoed throughout the meeting.

"We don't maintain what we have now," Freeman said.

Wendy Henderson brought up the notion of a community garden.

Michelle Guard brought up the problem of homeless people populating and disturbing the peace at the park. Her demand for better police

presence in the park was also echoed by other members of the community.

"They (homeless) are troublemakers and something needs to be done," Guard said. "I've seen policemen down there twice in the last year-and-a-half."

Each resident that waited their turn got their two minutes before the committee, the CRA and several members of city council. If nothing else, it was a great moment of residents getting together for something.

It is also, as Hamilton said, one of many meetings on the subject.

"It helps when they come in pairs like that," Guynn said.

Two nights after the win over the Titans, the Bulldogs closed out the regular season with a narrow 6-5 win over Wesley Chapel and headed into the postseason with a 14-7 record. That avenged an earlier 2-1 loss to the Wildcats.

In the rematch with Wesley Chapel, Zephyrhills took a 5-0 lead and held on. Santiago led the Bulldogs with three hits to go along with an RBI in that game. Maddox Rivera doubled, drove in a run and scored twice. Also driving in runs were Dobbins and Benjamin Will.

As for the Wildcats, Richard O'Dette had three hits, Jake Carrillo drove in two runs and Dylan Pabon scored twice.

Against Tenoroc, Santiago's homer highlighted a five-run fifth inning. Berrien led off with a double down the third base line and scored on a two-base error, but there was more to come.

Mason Denmark and Dobbins they reached

on infield errors with both runners scoring on Rivera's single. Maddox and D.J. Pickett, who ran to first on another error, scored on wild pitches before Santiago's solo blast.

Zephyrhills wasted little time getting on the scoreboard, taking a 3-0 lead in the bottom of the first. Santiago drew a leadoff walk with Berrien following that with a single. Both runners came in on Denmark's two-run single up the middle. Denmark scored on Rivera's single.

Heading into postseason play, Guynn said, "We've just got to figure out how to close games."

"It was a big win for us," Guynn said, adding, "It's going to help us in the regional standings."

On the adjacent Craig Milburn Field on the same night as baseball's Senior Night, softball players Alex Bowe-Wootton and Melissa Schroeder were also honored on their Senior Night. Zephyrhills routed Lakeland Kathleen 13-1 before defeating Gulf 23-2 to close out the regular season with a 7-10 record.

HOLLYWOOD -- Can you believe that Arnold Schwarzenegger -- seven-time Mr. Olympia, four-time Mr. Universe, governor of California (2003-2011), Emmy-Award and Golden-Globe winner, and star of over 40 motion pictures -- doesn't own or use a cell phone? Apparently, he uses an iPad, but doesn't text, since he prefers to FaceTime.

To his credit, the 75-year-old superhero (with a net worth of \$450 million) isn't afraid to get his hands dirty, especially to help people in the neighborhood where he lives.
