Third Annual Fall Brewfest outdoors in another worthy fundraiser for Gulfside Hospice

The generosity of communities and people who either regularly or occasionally contribute to Gulfside Hospice was clearly apparent during last Saturday

evening's festivities at Land O' Lakes Heritage Park. That's where hundreds of folks raised a glass — at least their small sample plastic ones — at the Fall Brewfest for Hospice.

The third annual outdoor beer festival featured craft beers as well as some wines, live music, food trucks and various vendors. In all, 23 representatives of breweries and wineries donated their products and time to the charitable cause. The fun-filled event, which also included 24 vendors, benefitted the non-profit organization that serves Pasco County residents dealing with life-limiting illnesses.

Rattlesnakes, owls, and bears: Oh my!

The 53rd Annual Rattlesnake Festival will be bigger than ever including greater opportunities for both Florida Wildlife education and fun things to do with the price of admission.

This year's festival will be held on the traditional third weekend of October - Oct. 19 and 20 this year - at the Pasco County Fairgrounds. Parking is free, admission is \$5 per person with children two years old and younger admitted free.

"We want the festival to continue to be an annual event that everyone looks forward to just like they did for more than 50 years," said Joe Simmons, executive director of The Thomas Promise Foundation that hosts the event. "So, we have added to both the educational and environmental aspects as well as things that are just plain fun."

"New this year are live bears from Bearadise Ranch, soccer games with Soccer Collies, Walk on Water Air Bubbles, and the interactive Water Ventures mobile unit from Crystal Springs Preserve," Simmons continued.

"We have added several hours of evening activities connected with the festival as well," Simmons added. "On Friday evening, Oct 18, there will be a concert starring the Bellamy Brothers in their first Rattlesnake Festival appearance since 1968 and on Saturday evening we are going to feature the Rattlesnake Festival After Dark with a concert by Seventeenth Street Band and River Junction Band and access to fair rides and food vendors and beer."

For the traditionalists, the festival will feature time-honored events with Jim Mendenhall of Squamata Reptiles returning to reprise his snake show, Cowboy Tom's Wild West Show on Saturday only, live music in the air-conditioned Dan Cannon Auditorium presented on Saturday by Clerks With a Cure, the Eddie Herrmann Memorial Wooden Gopher Turtle Races, bounce houses, a pumpkin patch, Monica Zummo with her pony rides and petting zoo, and an arts and crafts village with more than 100 vendors offering a variety of hand-made crafts





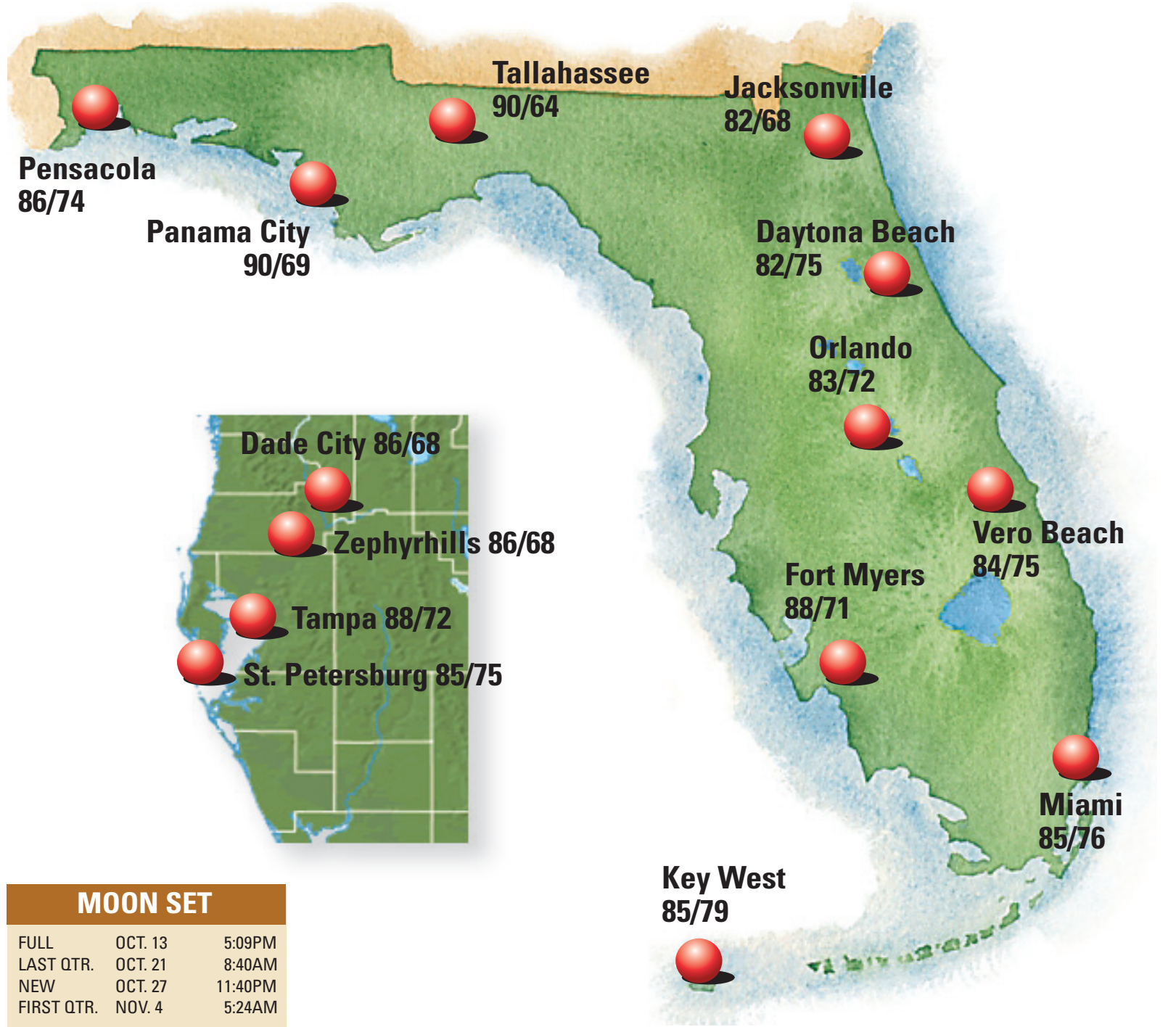

Among the numerous beer vendors who welcomed the opportunity to contribute to Gulfside Hospice was Big Storm Brewing, a company that started out in nearby Odessa and now has other state bases in Clearwater and Cape Coral.

"We do a lot of charity events, just because as a bigger brewery in the community we just like giving back to community events like this," said Brent Ligon, a brand ambassador for Big Storm Brewing.

In 2017, the inaugural Spring Brewfest for Hospice was held in May at Pasco Safety Town in Shady Hills and raised a reported \$7,500. Later that year, another one took place in October at the Zephyrhills outdoor venue near the city's municipal airport.

Last fall's event, which was relocated to Land O' Lakes, reflected a substantial increase with more than 800 in attendance and \$27,000 in net proceeds. That sets the stage for a bigger and more financially beneficial brewfest this year.

"This year, we want to break the record," said Leesa Fryer, Gulfside Hospice's fundraising and event planning specialist. "I'm hoping 1,000-plus (people) come through our gate."

Patient care is bolstered by generous donations such as Brewfest for Hospice. Other annual events include a countywide motorcycle ride for hospice and Paulie Palooza, a popular music festival in Zephyrhills.

According to Kristy Churchill, director of community relations for Gulfside Healthcare Services, those fundraisers and other events help provide care for hospice patients, and bereavement services for the community.

Plus, the people who came out genuinely enjoyed the food and drink as well as the band. Stonegrey, a four-piece rock band from Tampa, entertained the crowd with a combination of original music and several covers.

"We love them and when we heard they were playing at the brewfest we had to come," said Cindy Lanier, a Carrollwood resident who brought her friend Tina Napolitano.

"It's fun. I've never done anything like this before," added Jamie Graziani, who came with her boyfriend Tyler Reynolds along with their friends Alex Venegas and Rachel Willison.

Kathy Lovell and her husband Jim drove over from Port Richey and said they had a good time.

"This is great," she said. "Free beer and donations to hospice."

With so many vendors there were plenty of beer samples to be had. Among those sampling the variety available were four friends who were handed a saison brew in small plastic glasses from The Craft Brewery.

"It's not bad, but it could use a little more flavor," Theresa Flaspeter, of Brooksville.

Added Michael Burnette of Land O' Lakes, who was accompanied by Land O' Lakes' Morgan Lashley, "It's good. The finish is nice; smooth."

Perhaps a New Tampa couple summed it up best when asked why they came to Land O' Lakes for the brewfest.

"Good beer, great music; this is the place to be," said Debbie Mullen, who sat in a lawn chair while listening to the band with her boyfriend, Scott Granderson.

"I like this band," added Granderson. "We're just chilling here for now. We'll go taste some more."

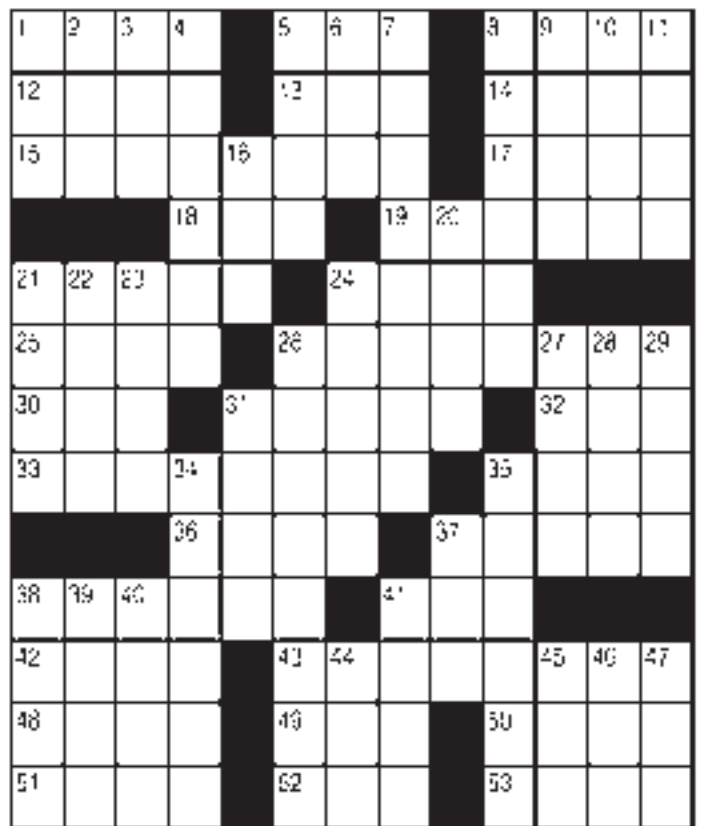

Plants were the primary attractions for Gardening 365, a plant festival that has become an annual tradition at the city's quaint downtown park. Master gardeners and volunteers were on hand to assist people with questions. Seminars were provided and folks even got help taking their purchases to their vehicles.

Elizabeth Urquiola, program coordinator for the University of Florida extension office in Dade City that helped put the festival's seminars together, said five scheduled seminars with various speakers were designed to assist people with their plants and gardening.

"How to grow their vegetables and herbs, how to grow their species; pretty much what works and what doesn't," is what she said the seminars were about. "It's amazing. This is very near and dear to my heart. It's very personable to be able to help people in our community."

The spirit of helping — whether it was family, a neighbor or a stranger — was readily apparent throughout the day. One young man helped a little girl and her mother wheel a cart of soil to unload in their truck bed.

"He was very kind to lift those bags for us," said Lakeland's Monique Petrangolo, who then walked back through the park with her 12-year-old daughter Meghan to find some plants.

A middle-aged woman sat down with an elderly lady to talk about plants and gardening. Janet Caples of Bartow said she came to the festival for "those lovely plants and all the education."

Sylvia Miller, who is from Tampa Bay Golf and Country Club sat with Caples. They had some crinums, perennial plants with large flowers on leafless stems.

"We're starting a garden club where we live and we found four speakers who are going to come out and speak to us," she said.

Then there was the 4-H Club of Dade City, which provided carts and young volunteers to help people wheel their purchases to their vehicles. They have been helping out at the festival for the past three years.

"It feels good and it raises money for our projects," said Aleisha Walden, a 9-year-old 4-H member who raises pigs, goats and chickens, and shows plants as well.

Walden helped with some plants for a Land O' Lakes couple, Jerry Wheeler and his wife Chris who came to the gardening festival for the first time.

"I think this is great," Chris said. "What I like is that there are people to help us."

Added her husband, "We came to find some things to enhance our landscaping."

They wound up purchasing two aloe plants and a calendula.

Although there were numerous people who come to the plant sale and festival every year, there were plenty of newcomers like the Wheelers. Count Wesley Chapel's Katrina and Jackson Solano among those first-timers.

"We're still looking, but I like that there's so much to look at," said Katrina, who heard about the festival from a co-worker and had never been to San Antonio.
